The PFI Prontos are the take-home devotionals for each session of PFI.

They include the Bible Truth, its related Bible verse, the lyrics and meaning blurb for the hymn and Bible verse song, three quiz questions, a prayer and two activity sheets for every story in the curriculum.

While the Prontos are designed as a reinforcement tool for parents to use with their children after session, the resources are so substantial as to be used as a curriculum by themselves. Additional activities can be downloaded online with each Bible truth.

BIBLE TRUTH

We're learning... Bible Truth 1: God Saves Sinners Who Confess Their Sins

God is perfectly holy. There is no sin in Him at all. He is too holy for sin to even live in His presence. How gloriously magnificent and pure is He!

But we are all sinners. We have all chosen to rebel against God and His good ways. Not only can we not live in His presence because of our sinfulness, but we deserve to be shut out of His presence forever because of it. And there's nothing sinful people like us can do on our own to make ourselves acceptable to God.

We would be without hope, except for God's amazing grace and mercy! He, Himself, has done what was needed. He sent His Son Jesus to live a perfect life and offer it up as the perfect payment for the sins of His people when He suffered and died on the cross. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, showing He had beat sin and death. Yes, He had fully paid for the sins of God's people. He has made salvation a gift.

How can we receive this wonderful gift? God offers forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who confess their sins to Him and trust in Jesus as their Savior. When we do this, turning away from living life our own way and living for God instead, He will give us this gift! He will make us His people forever!

CASE STORY

Luke 15

Our story is called:

The Case of the Ridiculous Runner.

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who was the Ridiculous Runner? Who thought his running was ridiculous? (Ridiculous means something silly that you wouldn't expect them to do).
- 2. Why did he run even though it was thought ridiculous? Who did he run to? What does the Ridiculous Runner tells us about God?

This story takes place in New Testament times, when Jesus lived on earth.

Some men walked together down the street. It was easy to tell: these were important people! What proud long beards, what beautiful robes, and what showy prayer shawls with long tassles they had! Yes, they were important people. They were Pharisees and teachers of God's law. And in Israel, there was hardly anyone more important than them.

As these men walked along, they noticed a crowd of people who were just the opposite of them: very unimportant people. They were what many would call big sinners. Terrible people, like greedy tax collectors. The Pharisees were disgusted by this swarm of disgusting people, but they were also curious as to know why they had gathered together.

Soon they had their answer: Jesus! Oooh! That frustrating new rabbi (teacher of God's law)! They hated how Jesus cared for sinners! He welcomed them. He even ate with them, as if they were friends! "Why does a good teacher like Jesus spend time with sinner?!" the Pharisees grumbled. "Doesn't He know He makes himself unclean before God when He does that?" they exclaimed.

But it was what Jesus taught those sinners that made them even angrier. "It's not the well who need a physician but the sick. The Son of Man has come to seek and save the lost. Whoever comes to me I will never turn away," Jesus told these people. Jesus was inviting these sinners to come to God!

"These people are so sinful that they aren't even allowed in the synagogues or the Temple," the Pharisees exclaimed. "They have broken God's laws on purpose. Jesus knows the law offers no sacrifice for people who do that," the Pharisees complained. "Who does Jesus think He is, to give these sinners the hope of forgiveness! Only

God can do that!"

But Jesus knew the Pharisees had something wrong. No one could ever keep God's laws well enough to please God. All people were sinners who deserved God's punishment! All needed to turn away from their sins and confess them to God. All needed a Savior to forgive them of their sins. There were no exceptions! These Pharisees need to hear this message just as much as the tax collectors, though they didn't know it. So Jesus began to tell a story that would make this clear.

"There once was a good Jewish father who had two sons," Jesus began. "The older son was obedient and -the Pharisees as much as these people they called sinners. hardworking for his father as a son should be; but, the younger son was not. He did not want to stay home and did not want to keep his father's rules and way of living. So he went to his father and said, "Father, when you die a part of all your things will be mine. I don't want to wait until then. Give me my share now!"

"What a wicked son! What a sinner he is!" the Pharisees were probably thinking. "Asking for any of your father's things while he's still alive is like saying to him 'I wish you were dead. Give me your money!' That was even worst than what the tax collectors did!"

Jesus continued, "Even though it was terrible of the son to ask his father his share of the property, the father decided to give it to him anyway. The son took all his father had given him and sold it for cash. He took the money, packed his things and left home for a faraway Gentile country where he spent all his money living and wild life doing whatever pleased him."

What a sinner this younger son was! Everyone listening to Jesus' story could see that! Disgracing his father and brother! Taking all of his father's hard-earned money and spending on a bunch of Gentiles!

Everyone in that crowd knew that the younger son deserved to be cut off from his family and never allowed to return. Perhaps that had even happened to sinners gathered right there at Jesus'feet. Hadn't they embarrassed their families by their big sins?

Jesus went on with the story: "Life got worse for the young man when his money ran out. A bad famine—no rain for a long time—hit the land. Crops and animals died. Everyone was just barely getting by. No one needed extra help or had extra food to share. Finally the young man

became so desperate that he got a job feeding the pigs of a Gentile (non-Jewish) farmer!

Feeding pigs for a Gentile farmer might not sound so bad to us, but it was a terrible thing to the Jews listening to Jesus' story. Jews weren't supposed to have anything to do with Gentiles, let alone work for them. They weren't supposed to eat or even touch pigs. Many even believed that a person who raises pigs is cursed by God! "This son is really in trouble with God now!," the listening crowd would have thought.

Jesus went on. "The young man fed the pigs, but even the pigs got more food than he did. He was so hungry he would have even eaten the pigs' dry pods, but nobody even offered those to him.

At last the son began to think: "What a sinner I am! What have I done?! Taken my father's things, runaway from home, spent all his hard-earned money doing all sorts of wicked things! Now look at me: working on a pig farm with not even enough food to keep me from starving. Life is far better than this for my father's workers. He gives them good work and gives them so much food that they have leftovers. I have disgraced my father. I could never be his son again, I know that, But, perhaps if I confess my sin against him and God, he will take me as one of his servants.' So the young man left the pig farm and started the long trip back home."

Everyone was curious to hear what Jesus would say next. This son had sinned terribly against both God and his father! How could he think that either one of them would forgive him after all he's done?! The Pharisees knew that by the law (Deuteronomy 21), that father even had the right to stone his son to death for such rebellious behavior! Asking to be a servant was even too good for him! But what would the father in Jesus' story do? They all waited and listened.

"As the son walked along, he thought about what he would say when he got home: 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am not worthy to be your son. Make me like one of your servants...."

But to the son's surprise, he didn't have to go home to find his father. His father was coming to him! He had spotted his son coming down the road from a long way off and now he was running straight towards him at full speed--something older men just didn't do! This was shocking and embarassing!

Why was the father running anyway? No one would

have been surprised if Jesus said that the father started yelling at his son to go away and never come back; or even, starting throwing at his son. This was what this son deserved, everyone would have thought. Perhaps some of the sinners listening to Jesus right then knew what this was like. Perhaps this had even happened to them. After all, they had acted shamefully, too.

But the father in Jesus' story didn't do these things. "The father ran until he reached his son," Jesus told the crowd. "He threw his arms around him and kissed him."

Such love the son never expected and knew he didn't deserve! He started his speech: 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son....'

But he never got to finish. His father had already forgiven him! This was his son, returned to him! The father was overjoyed! He turned to his servants and said, "Go quickly and bring the best robe in the house...my robe...and put it on my son. Get the family ring and place it on his finger. He will not be some barefooted servant! This is my son. Bring sandals for his feet!" Bring the fattened calf we were saving for a special celebration and prepare it," he ordered them. "We are having a feast to celebrate. I thought my son was lost and dead forever. But he's been found and he's alive!' And they began to celebrate.

When the older son came home, his father invited him to celebrate the return of his little brother, but he refused, "Look! All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours who has wasted your money on big parties with sinners comes home, you kill the fattened calf—the best food we have—to celebrate with him!"

"My son," the father said, "you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found."

The crowd was shocked with the ending to Jesus' story. This was not at all the way it was supposed to be. A wicked, younger son forgiven and welcomed back into the family! The older son asked to celebrate!! How could this be?

Yet that was exactly what Jesus wanted them all to see: God is like the father in the story and those listening to his story are like the two sons. Some might be rebellious, lawbreakers, like the younger son. Others were proud, law-keepers, like the older son. God wants them all to come to Him, confess their sins and be saved. He wants His people to celebrate every sinner who turns away from his sins and trusts in Jesus as their Savior.

Our Bible Truth is:

God Saves Sinners Who Confess Their Sins

Our Bible Verse is: 1 John 1:8-9:

"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Who are we like? Are we like the tax collectors and other sinners, who know their sins and are afraid they are too bad to receive God's forgiveness? Then what good news Jesus' story is! All who come to Him, confessing their sins, turning from them and trusting in Jesus as their Savior, will be saved! No one has been too bad for God to forgive, if they will but turn to Him!

Or are we like the Pharisees? Are we proud about how good we are and look down on others who seem to be bigger sinners than us? We should ask God to work in our proud, hard hearts and help us to confess our sins, turn from them and trust Jesus as our Savior, too. For whether we are the worst of sinners or think we are the best law keepers, we all are sinners who need a Savior!

Let's praise God for being so merciful to sinners. Let's ask Him to work in our hearts, that we might see and confess our sins to Him. And, that we might turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our own Savior.

CASE STORY

Our story is called:

The Case of the Mountains of Death and Life.

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Why were the mountains called the Mountains of Death?
- 2. Who went to those mountains to bring life? How did they do that?

This story doesn't take place in Bible times. It starts out around 1909 in England.

Far away in Southeast India lie mountain ranges called Kolloi Malai. Many tribes of people have made their home in tiny villages on these hot, jungly mountains, but few outsiders dare visit. Why? If you knew what Kolloi Malai meant in English you would understand. Kolloi Malai means "Mountains of Death!"

The people called them the Mountains of Death because of the sicknesses the mountains held. There was malaria, typhoid, bubonic plague, and special deadly strains of flu. Only one night spent on the Kolloi Malai was enough to catch one of these deadly diseases.

Christians called these mountains the Mountains of Death for another reason, too. There was no one among all the people who lived there who knew about Jesus. They all lived in fear of the spirits and idols of Hinduism and the powerful Hindu priests. The people thought that the spirits and idols were their only hope for protection against the sickness, pain and death of the Mountains of Death. They did not know about the God who saves sinners who confess their sins to

Him and His power to take care of them in sickness and even in death.

"Will the peoples of the Kolloi Malai be left to die in their sins or will someone go and tell them about Jesus who can save them? Who will go to the Mountains of Death?" These questions reached the ears of a rich, English young lady dressed in silk and pearls and her new husband-Evelyn and Jesse Brand.

"We will go," they said. "We will take medicines to help fight those terrible sicknesses. We will take the good news of Jesus to them so that they might confess their sins to Him and be saved. We will go and we will stay until we reach five mountain ranges of the Kolloi Malai...or until we die," they promised. So they left behind their nice home, their beautiful clothes and all the comforts of the

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good life in England and went.

Evelyn and Jesse settled in a little village in a hut made of bamboo and mud and began their work. "We have medicines to heal you. We can teach you how to keep diseases from spreading," they told the people.

"We have come to tell you about Jesus who saves sinners who confesses their sins. You do not have to live in fear of the Hindu spirits and idols," the Brands said.

But the Hindu priest didn't want the people to hear about Jesus. "If you listen to the Brands, the spirits will be unhappy and your cattle will die," the Hindu priest threatened....and mysteriously the cattle did die!

For seven long years the Brands kept trying to help the people, yet not a one became a Christian. Should they leave? What good had they done? "Who will go to the Mountains of Death? We will....and we will stay until we reach five mountain ranges or until we die!" The Brands remembered their promise and did not give up. Instead, they prayed even harder. "Lord, show us how to reach these people on the Mountains of Death. You know the way."

Not longer after this, sickness struck the village where the Brands lived. Hundreds died. Anyone who got sick almost certainly died.

"The sick people will have to take care of themselves," the healthy villagers said. "We don't want to get sick and die, too!" So they fled into the jungle, leaving behind all the sick.

"Should we leave the village, too?" the Brands wondered. "What if our children get sick? What if we do?"

'Who will go to the Mountains of Death? Will they be left to die in their sins or will someone go and tell them about Jesus who can save them?'... 'We will go and we will stay until we reach five mountain ranges of the Kolloi Malai... or until we die.' the Brands remembered their promises and decided to stay.

"Jesus has already saved us from our sins, we are the very ones to stay and help these dying people. Perhaps now God will give us the chance to tell these people about Jesus."

So the Brands stayed in the village. They made huge pots of soup to feed all of the sick people, hoping to keep some alive and hoping to tell all about the God who saves sinners who confess their sins to Him. They even took care of the Hindu priest and his wife.

One day an urgent message came to the Brands: "Come quickly! The priest and his wife are doing worse and he has something to tell you."

The Brands hurried to see the dying man and his wife. "I have something to tell you," the priest told them. "I poisoned the cattle when the people wanted to listen to you, not a spirit as I made them think. I've been a priest all my life, but the only ones who have helped me are Christians," he told the Brands. "Please adopt my baby if I die. I want you to raise my child."

"We will raise your child as our very own," the Brands told him. Before long, the man and his wife both died and the Brands adopted their child as their own, as they said they would.

Finally terrible sickness left the village. Life could get back to normal, yet nothing would ever be the same again. The villagers came to the Brands and said, "When our own families left us to die, you stayed and cared for us. You even adopted the child of the Hindu priest who was your enemy. We want to know more about your God who saves. Tell us about Jesus."

Soon many of them confessed their sins to God and believed in Jesus. The Brands began to spread out their work to the rest of that first mountain range. God was blessing their work.

Three years later, Jesse Brand died from Blackwater Fever on the Mountains of Death, and many wondered if Evelyn Brand would go on. "Will they be left to die in their sins or will someone go and tell them about Jesus who can save them?'... 'We will go and we will stay until we reach five mountain ranges of the Kolloi Malai...or until we die.' Evelyn remembered their promises; and, for fifty more years, Evelyn Brand kept working in the Mountains of Death—until she was 95 years old!

Over the hills she would ride on her hill pony, camping out of doors with just an umbrella and a raincoat to protect her from the torrential rains. She cleared jungle lands, pulled bad teeth, gave the villagers medicine, started schools, took care of orphans, and most of all, invited them to confess their sins to God, turn to Jesus and be saved. By the end, she was so sick with malaria, and could only walk with the help of two bamboo canes. She had so many wrinkles that you could not hardly count them, yet the Lord made her beautiful with a heart full of joy and love for Him and the people of the Mountains of Death.

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"Come home to England, Evelyn," pleaded her family and friends, "You are too old. Your body is worn out."

But Evelyn would remember her promise to reach the peoples of the Kolloi Malai. She would just smile and say, "You know these mountains. If I leave, who will help the village people? Who will treat their wounds and pull their teeth and teach them about Jesus? When someone comes to take my place on the Mountains of Death, then and only them, will I retire. In any case, why preserve this old body if it's not going to be used where God needs me."

In the end, Granny Brand, as the villagers called her, died in India at the age of 95. The villagers buried her in a simple cotton sheet right on her mountain, just as she had wanted, next to her husband Jesse. And by the time she died, they had reached not five mountain ranges, but SEVEN! And many, many people had confessed their sins and turned to Jesus to be saved.

Our Bible Truth is: God Saves Sinners Who Confess Their Sins Our Bible Verse is: 1 John 1:8-9

"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

What about us, have we confessed our sins and trusted in Jesus as our Savior? If we do, God will forgive us our sins. He will save us through Jesus and we will be His people forever!

And what about those of us who are Christians? Could there still be work to be done? Yes, there is. There are mountains, and cities and villages and neighborhoods, on the other side of the world and right here where we live, filled with people who need to hear the way to be saved. Could God want us to tell others about the God who saves sinners who confess their sins to Him? Yes, He does.

Let's praise this God who saves sinners and ask Him to help us to tell others how they can have their sins forgiven. Let's ask Him to send out more of His people to help build His Church by spreading the good news about Jesus. Let's ask Him to work in our hearts, help us to turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our own Savior. Let's ask Him to send the Holy Spirit to work in our hearts and to use even us to help build His Church, by telling others about Him.

God is perfectly holy. There is no sin in Him at all. He is too holy for sin to even live in His presence. How gloriously magnificent and pure is He!

But we are all sinners. We have all chosen to rebel against God and His good ways. Not only can we not live in His presence because of our sinfulness, but we deserve to be shut out of His presence forever because of it. And there's nothing sinful people like us can do on our own to make ourselves acceptable to God.

We would be without hope, except for God's amazing grace and mercy! He, Himself, has done what was needed. He sent His Son Jesus to live a perfect life and offer it up as the perfect payment for the sins of His people when He suffered and died on the cross. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, showing He had beat sin and death. Yes, He had fully paid for the sins of God's people. He has made salvation a gift.

How can we receive this wonderful gift? God offers forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who confess their sins to Him and trust in Jesus as their Savior. When we do this, turning away from living life our own way and living for God instead, He will give us this gift! He will make us His people forever!

2 Samuel 11-12

Our story is: The Case of the Not-So-Secret Sinner. As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who was the Not-So-Secret Sinner? How did he try to cover up his sin?
- 2. Who knew about his sin and prompted him to confess it? How did God respond to this secret sinner's confession to Him?

This story takes place in Old Testament times about 2000 years before Jesus lived on earth. It's about David.

David was a godly man who wanted to love and obey God, but David did not do this perfectly. For you see, David was also a Secret Sinner. What's the Secret Sinner? Someone who struggles sin in his heart and gives into it, especially when others weren't watching. He might look like he's doing all the right things, but he's a sinner nonetheless.

It all happened one spring in Jerusalem. David had sent his soldiers off war against their enemies, the Ammonites. Usually David went with them to war, but for some reason, this yearn he chose to stay home, leaving army captain Joab in charge, forty miles away on the battlefield.

One evening David went up on the roof of his house to look out over Jerusalem. As he did, he noticed a very beautiful woman." She is so beautiful!" David thought. "I must find out who she is and meet her!" David called a servant to his side, "Who is that woman?" he asked.

"That is Bathsheba, the dearly loved wife of Uriah Hittite, one of your mighty men," the servant replied.

Now David did not care that Bathsheba was already married...though he should have. He did not care that she was the dearly loved wife of one of his best, most loyal soldiers...though he should have. David was a man who loved God and wanted to obey Him. He knew that God would not want him to take someone else's wife. But just right then, he did not even care what God thought.... though he should have. Instead, David ignored all the things he knew he should do and did what he WANTED to do. He ordered Bathsheba brought him. David had become a secret sinner! Who could see his secret sin, anyway? Uriah, Bathsheba's husband, away at war. Servants could be kept quiet. Bathsheba could be kept quiet. David's secret sin was safe...or so he thought.

Then some news came to David that wouldn't keep

quiet: Bathsheba was going to have a baby—his baby!, David knew that he would have to do more to keep his secret sin secret. So he thought up yet another secret sin to cover up his first one. He would use Captain Joab and the Ammonites to get rid of Uriah completely. If Uriah was dead, Bathsheba could become his wife. Then no one would know his secret sin.

David sent a letter to Joab, putting his plan into action. He wrote: "Joab, my captain, When next you lay siege on Rammah, do not fail to put Uriah in the front line where the fighting is fiercest. Then withdraw from him so he will be struck down and die. Signed, David, the King."

Joab was puzzled by King's letter. What a strange order! This wasn't like Kind David. But Joab obeyed it anyway. He changed his battle plans to make sure that the King's wishes would be met. He put Uriah in the front-lines. The Ammonites attacked the Israelites in the fields outside Rammah, then Joab ordered the soldiers to charge the gates of Rammah. Uriah and others on the front lines fought close to the walls of the city. Ammonite soldiers stationed on the top of the walls let fly showers of arrows upon them. Before long, many of David's best soldiers died that day, including Uriah—all because of David's secret sin.

A few days later a messenger brought the news David was waiting for. Uriah the Hittite had been killed in battle. David's secret sin was covered up! Who could know his secret sin now? It was covered up completely now that Uriah was dead. He was free to marry Bathsheba and no one had to know about his sins. Kings often had more than one wife in those days. No one would think anything of his marrying Bathsheba now. She was a widow with no one to take care of her. People would think David was doing a good thing by marrying her. But after all, what did they expect from good King David, the man after God's own heart, the king who sang praises to the God he loved. Bathsheba could come to live as David's wife in his palace. No one would have to know that he was really just covering up his sins. After all, who could see a secret sin anyway? No one! Well....almost no one. God had seen David's secret sins. Nothing can be hidden from God. And God was very displeased with what David had done.

God sent his special messenger, the prophet Nathan, to talk with David. "David, I have a story to tell you."

"Tell me your story, Nathan," David replied.

"There were two men who lived in the same town, one

was very rich and one was very poor. The rich man had lots of sheep and cattle, but the poor man had nothing except one little ewe (girl) lamb. He raised it like it was his daughter, he loved it so much. He fed it food and water from his table. At night, it slept in his arms," Nathan told David.

"One day a traveler came to stay at the rich man's house and eat at his table. But instead of using one of his many sheep or cattle to make the meal, the rich man took the poor man's ewe lamb and served it," Nathan said.

David burned with anger and said to Nathan, "As surely as the LORD lives, the man who did this deserves to die! He must pay for that lamb four times over, because he did such a thing and had no pity."

Then Nathan said to David, "You are the man! This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'I anointed you king over Israel, and I delivered you from the hand of Saul. I gave you all the many things that once were his, and all of Israel and Judah, too. And if all this had been too little, I would have given you even more. Why did you reject my Word and disobey my laws? You had Uriah the Hittite killed with the sword of the Ammonites and took his own, dear wife. You sinned in secret, thinking that no one will see," the LORD told David through the prophet Nathan, "but now your sin will lead to trouble and sadness in your family that everyone will be able to see."

Then David saw his sin for what it was. He had stolen someone else's wife! He had murdered a man! He had tried to cover up his sins! How sinful he was.

David was truly sorry for what he had done and confessed his sin: "What you say is true, Nathan." I have sinned against the LORD." He thought he was keeping his sins a secret, but now he could see that you can never keep your sins a secret from God.

Nathan replied, "You know that the law says you deserve to die because you have stolen another man's wife and because you killed someone on purpose. But the LORD has chosen to forgive you instead. He has taken away your sin. You are not going to die."

David was a secret sinner, but David was still a man who loved God. When Nathan left, David prayed to God. He turned away from his sins and confessed them to God. He said, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Cleanse me from my sin. For I know

my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are proved right when you speak. Surely you desire truth in the inner parts....Hide your face from my sins...create in me a pure heart, O God...save my from [guilt], O God, the God who saves me." (Psalm 51)

God heard David's prayer and forgave him. What a merciful God is the LORD!

Our Bible Truth Is:

God Forgives Sinners Who Confess Their Sins Our Bible Verse is: 1 John 1:8-9

David was a secret sinner who confessed his sins and was forgiven. What about you and me? Are we secret sinners? Have we sinned and thought, "Who could see a secret sin anyway?" Are there sins we hide deep inside that we try to hide from others and from God? Let's not forget the lesson of David, the Secret Sinner: no one can ever hide their sins from God. He knows all our sins, even the ones no one else knows. But don't forget the lesson of David, the man of God, either: God forgives those who confess their sins to Him and ask for forgiveness.

God knows that we are sinners. He wants us to confess our sins to Him so that we can be forgiven. Let's praise this God who delights in saves sinners who confess their sins, even the darkest, most secret ones, to Him. Let's ask Him to show us our sins, help us to confess them to Him and trust in Him as our own Savior.

Note about this story: I have been careful to leave in the key elements to the story, while being sensitive to the nature of David's sin and the ages of the children listening to the story. I think it ample for the children to know that David thought Bathsheba attractive without adding in the fact that she is bathing when he sees her. I also think it is enough for Bathsheba to be pregnant without presenting more details. Please use your discretion to adapt the story even more. You easily could leave out the pregnancy and just say that he wanted to snatch Uriah's wife.

Now all who turn away from living a life of sin (repent) and put their trust in Jesus as their Savior will be forgiven their sins. They will be saved from the punishment for their sins they deserve and will live as God's dearly loved people forever.

This story takes place in New Testament times, when Jesus lived on earth.

Jerusalem was packed with thousands of Jews who had come to celebrate Passover. Every Passover was exciting, but news that Jesus had raised Lazarus, a man from the nearby town of Bethany, from death to life made this one even more exciting than usual. Could Jesus be God's promised Messiah, people wondered.

When the word spread that Jesus was staying in Bethany with Lazarus and his sisters, many decided to go see Jesus and this man Jesus had raised to life.

The next day, Jesus headed for Jerusalem, along with his disciples and a crowd of others. "Go to the village ahead of you," Jesus told two of His disciples. "There you will find a donkey's colt tied up, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here."

The disciples found the colt just as Jesus said and brought it to Him. Threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on its back. Jesus' time had come. He would ride into Jerusalem on a donkey as the Messiah, the King of Israel, just as the prophets had foretold long ago.

As Jesus came to the top of the Mount of Olives, another large crowd came the hill to greet Him. "This is our king, the Messiah, we must give Him a royal welcome into the royal city!" people exclaimed. "Throw down your cloaks for the King to tread on. Plain ground is too good for Him. Get palm branches and wave them to honor Him as our king!"

The road was soon covered with cloaks and the air filled with waving palm branches. The crowd began to praise God for Jesus. "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest! Blessed in the King of Israel, the Messiah!" they shouted.

How did Jesus react to the crowd's praise? Not as you might imagine. Jesus was weeping out loud! He knew these people were praising Him for the wrong reasons. They thought He had come to get rid of their enemies, the Romans, and bring in happy days of life in a great, new

Israel. But He had come to bring them eternal life with God as He offered up His life as the perfect payment for God's people's sins. Soon these cheering crowds would reject Him and call for Him to die, when they saw Jesus had not come to give them what they wanted. And so they did, in Jesus' next few days in Jerusalem, until by Thursday, few but Jesus' closest disciples still followed Him.

That Thursday night, Jesus gathered with His twelve disciples to celebrate the Passover Feast. The disciples might have thought this was just a Passover like the rest, but Jesus knew otherwise: it was the night before He would die on the cross for the sins of God's people. Jesus used that Passover dinner to explain to His disciples what He was about to do.

Instead of beginning the meal with the usual Passover prayer, Jesus got up from the table and did something that completely shocked His disciples: He took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist, like a lowly slave would do. He poured water into a bowl and began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel wrapped around him. The disciples were shocked! No one touched another person's dirty feet--especially not an honored teacher!

When Jesus knelt down in front of Peter to wash his feet Peter said in horror, "Lord, you aren't going to wash my feet, are you?"

Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

Jesus wasn't really worried about the dirt on their feet. He was washing them as a picture of what He would do for them and all of God's people, the next day, when He suffered and died on the cross. Jesus was making the Way to the Father for all His sinful people. He had come to clean something a lot dirtier that feet with something much more precious than water. He loved them so much that He had come to wash away their dirty, sinful hearts and lives with His very own blood as He would give up His life on the cross as the perfect payment for their sins the very next day. He was the Way, the Truth and the Life, no one could come to the Father but by Him. They—nor any of God's people—could ever come to the Father and enjoy eternal life with them in heaven, unless He did this shameful, terrible, dirty job.

When Jesus had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to His place at the table. Now it

was time for the Passover Meal. This was usually one of the happiest celebrations of the year as the Jews remembered how God freed them from slavery in Egypt and had led them by Moses to the Promised Land. But once more Jesus changed things, and His words made this dinner far from a celebration:

"This is my body broken for you," Jesus told them as He broke the bread and passed it around for them all to eat some of it. "This is my blood poured out for you to make a new covenant with God," Jesus told them as He passed the cup for them to drink from.

"The hour has come for me to go away," Jesus told them. "One of you will plot with the Jewish leaders and betray me into their hands."

The disciples were in shock "Surely not !!!" they each exclaimed.

"Yes, it will be one of you who eats at this table with me even now," Jesus told them. "And when the time comes for my arrest, you all will abandon me. Peter, you will even deny three times that you have ever known me!"

What awful news this was to the disciples. They would abandon Jesus! Jesus would be arrested and would die!

"Where are you going, Jesus? Why can't we come with You?" Thomas asked the question they were all thinking. They still didn't understand this was all part of God's good plan to make the way of salvation for His people. They were so upset!

"Don't be troubled! Trust in God. Trust also in me," Jesus told them. "Everything is not just falling apart as you think. Everything is completely in control and going as planned. I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. I am making the Way for God's sinful people to come to the Father. No one goes to the Father, except through me. If I do not do this, then no one goes to the Father. I am the Truth: believe in the Father and believe in me! I am the Life: after this is over, you will see me again. I am going away to prepare a place for you in heaven--my Father's house. I will go away, but one day I will come back to get you and take you to be with Me forever."

That night, the disciples watched in horror as everything began to happen just as Jesus told them it would. Judas Iscariot led Jewish soldiers to arrest Jesus. The disciples ran away and abandoned Him. Peter denied knowing Jesus three times... and then the rooster crowed. Worst of all, they watched the next day as Jesus' body was broken and

His blood poured out as He died on the cross. Jesus was doing the dirty job of washing away the sins of all who would ever turn from their sins and trust in Him, as He had said He would.

But horror turned to joy when on the third day! Jesus rose up victorious from the grave and appeared to His disciples, just as He said He would. Now they knew He was the Way: He had made the way for sinful people to come to God the Father. Now they knew that He was the Truth: everything He had them had come true. Now they knew that He was the Life: death could not hold Him in the grave. Now all who would ever turn from their sins and trust in Him would have their sins forgiven and eternal life in God's heavenly kingdom. There, they will never know pain, sadness or death again. Only the delight of close fellowship with God and His people forever!

Jesus was the Way, the Truth and the Life! And now it was time for His disciples to spread the news: "All authority has been given Me in heaven and earth! I rule over all," Jesus told them. "So now go into the entire world and tell them the good news that I have made the way for them to be saved. Make disciples, baptize them, and teach them to obey everything I've taught you". And so they did...and so they still are.

The Case of the Cheeky Chieftess.

This story is not in the Bible. It is a true story about God's people obeying Jesus' command to spread the good news of salvation to the whole world. It takes place around 1815 in Hawaii.

The Hawaiian Islands are a very, very beautiful group of islands in the Pacific Ocean. There are many beautiful flowers and birds. And mountains made from erupting volcanoes rise high above the sparkling, clear ocean that crashes in thunderous waves on the shores of white sand beaches.

But as beautiful as everything looked in Hawaii, not everything was wonderful. The people were trapped in fear of idols carved out of stone and wood. They believed the spirits of those idols would harm them, if they did not worship them. Coconuts, bananas, hogs and many other things, they offered to these fake gods, who they believed controlled their happiness.

They were especially fearful of the passionate, ill-tempered goddess Pele. Pele, they believed, was the volcano goddess and lived in the mighty volcano Kileaua. They believed that she caused the volcano to spew out fiery lava and ash on anyone who did not give her proper offerings or respect. Anyone who did not climb up to Haema'uma'u caldera (a caldera is the mouth of the volcano where lava can come out) on Kileaua and offer her some of the juicy "ohelo" bush berries that grew on the mountain slopes and say:

"E Pele, eia ka 'ohelo 'au;

(Oh, Pele, here are your branches)

e taumaha aku wau 'ia 'oe (I offer some to you)

e'ai ho'i au tetahi (some I also eat)," fearing she would send lava from the volcano to fall on them and their village, if they did not.

How sad it was that the people lived in fear of Pele, who was nothing but a pretend goddess of stone! How sad that they did not know about the true God and about Jesus, who was the only way to be saved from their sins!

Did God care about the Hawaiian people? Did He want them to know the way to be saved? Yes, He did. And five thousand miles away, in Connecticut in the United States, God was preparing people to go and tell them.

A young man, with tanned skin and jet black hair, stood up before a crowded church of people. "Aloha! Greetings!" he said with a smile. "I am Obookiah. I come from Hawaii. I am here to ask your help. You may have heard what a beautiful land Hawaii is, but its people are in terrible bondage to idols. Hawaii gods: they are wood; they burn. I want to go home, put them in a fire, and burn them up. They do not see, they do not hear, they do not do anything! We make them with our hands. Yet my people live in terror of these gods, especially Pele the volcano goddess. My people make many sacrifices to these idols. They even sacrifice people to them! They do not know lesu Kristo (Jesus Christ) or the Bible. They do not even have a written language or know how to read. They know nothing of the way to be saved. They are dying in their sins!"

"I, too, would still be there living in fear of those gods, never having heard of Jesus. But God in His great mercy brought me to America where kind men told me about Him. I have found forgiveness from my sins through Jesus," Obookiah told them.

"Does God care about the Hawaiian people? Does He want them to know the way to be saved? Yes, He does! It is too much for me to stay here, while my people in Hawaii are dying without Him. They need to know the way to God!

"Who will help me? Who will come with me to Hawaii and tell my people about lesu Kristo?" Obookiah asked them. "Who will help me give them the Bible and teach them to read? It might be dangerous. They might want to kill us for going against Pele and the other gods of wood and stone, but for Jesus and the Hawaiian people it is worth risking your life!"

Many people heard Obookiah's message and wanted to help. Some said, "We will give money so you can go." Others said, "We will go, if you go with us."

Obookiah made preparations to go. The Hawaiian language had never been written down, so Obookiah made up the Hawaiian alphabet and a beginning reading book. He even began to translate the Bible into Hawaiian. Before long, he would be sailing back to Hawaii and begin teaching his people about Jesus. He wanted them to have God's Word to read themselves. He was so excited!

Then something happened that changed all of Obookiah's plans. Obookiah came down with a terrible sickness called typhoid fever. Day after day, night after night, Obookiah fought the fever, but he got weaker and weaker, until at last, he died.

The news of Obookiah's death spread throughout Connecticut and America. "What! Obookiah's dead? We thought surely he was the one God had chosen to take good news of Jesus to Hawaii. Who will dare go to Hawaii now that Obookiah is not here to take them?"

Did God care about the Hawaiian people? Did He want them to know the way to be saved? Yes, He did. He worked in the hearts of fourteen men and women and gave them courage to go.

"We will go!" said a group of fourteen men and women! "We want the Hawaiians to know Jesus, the only way to be saved. We want them to know how to read so that they can read God's Word for themselves. We are willing to risk our lives to tell them, even without Obookiah," they decided.

So the fourteen brave men and women sailed to Hawaii. They set up a school and a church building and began to tell the Hawaiians about Jesus. "Turn from your idols, turn from Pele. Turn and trust in Jesus. He is the only way to be saved," they told the people.

Kapi'olani quickly began to grow as a Christian. God put a great love in her heart for Him, and a great desire for her people to know and love Him, too. "These people will

never believe in Jesus until they know that He is more powerful than Pele," she told the missionaries. "I must defy Pele to her face in front of them. Perhaps then they will see that Pele is not goddess at all and turn to Jesus, the only way to be saved," she believed.

"My people," the high chieftess said, "these people have come to tell you about Jesus, the only way to be saved, yet you still fear the island gods of stone and wood. Those gods are no gods at all. Not even Pele, who we have lived in fear of all these years. Follow me up to Haema'uma'u caldera to the place we call the home of Pele. There I will defy Pele and prove to you that she is no goddess at all," she told them.

The people followed Kapi'olani up the lush green trail all the way up to the stark, lifeless top of Kileaua and the Haema'uma'u caldera. Our story is: The Case of the Light for the Unlikely. As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who was the Light? Why was He called the Light?
- 2. Who were Likely People to receive Him and who were the Unlikely People to receive Him? What did both kinds of people need to do to receive the Light?

This story starts out in Old Testament times, thousands of years before Jesus lived on earth.

"If you will obey me and keep my covenant, you will be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine," the LORD promised the people of Israel on Mt. Sinai. And hadn't He shown them already just how precious they were to Him? He had just sent Moses to rescue them from slavery under the mighty Egyptians. He had just protected them from the Egyptian soldiers with a great pillar of cloud, and even parted the Red Sea for them escape unharmed. He had given them His good laws and made a solemn covenant promise to always love and care for them. He was giving them the beautiful land of Canaan to live in and enjoy as their very own. Oh, to be an Israelite! To be God's treasured possession! This was certainly a promise they could trust!

But what about the rest of the world? All the rest of those people, whom the Israelites lumped together under one big word: Gentiles. Did God really not care about them? Sometimes the Israelites acted as if God didn't, even though He had told them otherwise. "I'm going to bless all nations through a child that come through you and your family, the Israelites," the LORD had told Abraham. Who would that child be? The Messiah, Jesus, to save them from their sins.

Through Isaiah, God told the Israelites what He would do through Jesus: "It is too small a thing for the Messiah, the Savior Jesus, to save only My people from the nation of Israel. I will also make him a light for the Gentiles, that he may bring my salvation to the ends of the earth." (adapted from Isaiah 54:6)

Yes. Israel was special. But Israel was just a beginning, just a part of God's one, big plan to save a countless number of people from every nation of the world. God was using them to bring the blessing of salvation to all the people of the world, for Jesus the Messiah, the Savior, would come from Israel.

Some Gentiles came to saving faith even before Jesus came. We know a few of their stories. There was Rahab from Jericho that helped the Israelites sent to spy on her city of Jericho. And Ruth, who would be the grandmother of great King David. There were others, too. These few Gentiles looked forward in faith to the day God would send His Savior.

At last, Jesus did come. He was fully God and fully man. He lived a perfect life, then offered it up on the cross, as the perfect sacrifice for God's people, all who would ever turn from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. He suffered and died for their sins, then on the third day, He rose up from the dead in victory over sin and death for all of God's people.

"Go into all the world, making disciples and teaching them," Jesus told His disciples, after He rose from the dead. Now, the message of salvation would be spread far and wide. Yes, it was still time for Jesus to be the Savior to any of the Israelites who trusted in Him as their Savior. But even more, Jesus was going to be the light for the Gentiles, as His disciples took the good news of salvation through Jesus to the them. So out and away the disciples went. First just to nearby cities, then to places farther and farther away.

Three believers, Paul, Silas and Luke, traveled by sea and land to a country called Macedonia, sharing the good news of Jesus as they went. One day they came to the great city of Philippi. Philippi was one of most important cities of all of Macedonia. The Roman Emperor had even made it a Roman colony! Merchants and traders came to Philippi bringing their goods from the nearby port to sell and many Roman soldiers came there to settle down and live after retiring from the army. There were temples to the Roman gods and even a coliseum for gladiator shows and Olympic games. How wonderful it would be for these people to hear the message of Jesus!

"Repent, believe, trust in Jesus and live! He is the only way to be saved from your sins." Paul told a group of people gathered for prayer by the Gangites River outside the city. These were people who heard of the Lord God and believed in Him, but had never heard about Jesus.

"Long ago, Paul told them, "The LORD spoke through the prophet Isaiah about Jesus, the coming Messiah. He told them, 'It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring my salvation to the ends of the earth.' We have come to tell you about that Savior, Jesus Christ, that you might trust in Him as your Savior." Paul's message was eagerly accepted and many were baptized that day.

Paul and Silas rejoiced to see so many accept Jesus as their Savior, but Satan, God's great enemy, was not. Before long, big trouble was brewing for Paul and Silas. Angry men stirred up a crowd against them. City officials arrested Paul and Silas, beaten with rods and thrown into jail.

"Guard these men carefully," the city officials ordered the jailer. So he put them in the inner cell-- and fastened their feet in the stocks.

"What are these men in trouble for?" the jailer wanted to know.

"For trying to turn the people away from the Roman gods to another foreign god named Jesus who they claim to be the way to be saved!" he was told.

How the metal of the stocks must have cut into Paul and Silas' legs! How stiff their bodies must have been from being beaten! But Paul and Silas didn't grumble or complain. Instead they sang praises to God, long into the night. They knew that Jesus really was the way to be saved. He was worth suffering for, even dying for. They were grateful to God for being allowed to suffer for His name and to get to bring the good news of Jesus, the light to the Gentiles, the one who brought salvation to the nations.

About midnight, Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that shook the prison. At once, the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose. The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself because he thought the prisoners had escaped. He was in a panic! He knew he would be killed if he lost any of them. He would rather kill himself than let someone else do it.

But Paul shouted, "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!"
What strange men these were! Beaten and imprisoned for sharing about this strange God, Jesus, who they claimed as the way to be saved. Praising Jesus' name rather than cursing Him for being put in stocks! Then, when given a chance to escape for their lives, they stay where they are and try to keep him from killing himself! Perhaps this foreign god is the true God!" the jailer thought.]

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The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

They replied, "Repent! Trust in Jesus and live! He is the only way to be saved from your sins -- you and your household." Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house. At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his family were baptized. The jailer brought them into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God--he and his whole family.

The next day, Paul and Silas were released from prison and sent out of Philippi. Were they heading home after their terrible beating? No, they did not. They headed out for new places to tell others about Jesus. They were stiff, bruised and sore, but they praised God. He was using them to bring the light of Jesus to the Gentiles and salvation to people of another nation, just as He had promised through the prophet Isaiah hundreds of years earlier. God's one, big plan to save His people from every land was being fulfilled.

We need to confess to God that we are a sinner and ask His forgiveness for our sins. We need to believe that Jesus suffered and died on the cross as the perfect payment for our sins; and that three days later, He rose from the dead in victory over death. We need to turn our lives over to Him, asking Him to help us to love and live for Him in everything we do.

Trusting in Jesus to be our Savior is a wonderful work that God does by His Holy Spirit in the hearts of His people. He delights for us to ask Him to send the Holy Spirit to do this work in our heart.

When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, we also accept Him as our Lord. "Lord" is an old word used in the Bible that we don't use much anymore. It means someone who is in charge and who we are to obey. The sign of someone who truly trusts in Jesus as their Savior, is whether they also are trying to live to please God.

God's people want to obey Him in everything they do, but they can't do think on their own--and they don't have to. God gives believers His Holy Spirit to live inside them and help them to grow in love and in obedience to Him. God always gives us what we need to be His people, if we but ask!

Our story is called:

The Case of the Transformed Tax-Man.

This story takes place in New Testament times, when Jesus lived on earth.

Matthew sat in his tax booth along the Great West Road, just outside of Capernaum. This busy road led from the rich city of Damascus in the east, to the ports of Phoenicia on the great Mediterranean Sea to the west. Matthew was the chief customs officer for the Roman leader, Herod Antipas, and his job was to collect Herod's customs tax money from every merchant's caravan that passed.

"You must collect tax from everything the merchants carry in their caravans," the Romans had told Matthew, when he started the job. "Any extra money you can get out of the them is for you. That's how you get paid," they explained.

A fellow could get very rich if they were good at this job....and Matthew was! Galilee—the part of Israel where his booth was—had brought in five million dollars of customs tax money in just one year! Yes, Matthew had grown very, very rich.

But Matthew was a rich sinner. He had grown rich only by doing many sinful tricky tricks. What kinds of tricks did tax collectors like Matthew use? Well, it would look something like this:

Matthew would sit at his booth until he heard the tingling bells and clomping hoofs. This meant a merchant and his caravan of camels, loaded down with goods was approaching.

"Good morning, Master Merchant. What do you have in your caravan today?" Matthew would ask.

"Good morning to you, Master Tax Collector," replied the merchant in a less than friendly voice. He knew what Matthew was like. "Wheat from the plains, and fish from the Sea of Galilee."

"We'll see about that. I'll have to inspect each animal's load. Unpack them all," Matthew ordered.

"But Master Tax Collector, look at all these animals! You can plainly see what I have," the merchant replied.

"Do as I say or I will be forced to call in Roman soldiers to persuade you to cooperate," Matthew warned.

"Yes, Master Tax Collector," the merchant grumbled. Load after load was pulled from camels' backs for Matthew to inspect.

"What is this here? This is not fish or wheat. It looks like a great deal of fine cloth. You must pay tax on it, too, my friend," Matthew would say.

"But sir, that is not cloth for sale, it is for my family. You are only to tax those things I am selling," the merchant would answer.

"How do I know that you have a family? I have a duty to the King Antipas and I must not fail. I

will be forced to tax this cloth!" Matthew ordered. "So, let's see, that's 10 loads of wheat and 20 loads of fish, plus one load of fine cloth. To that we add a charge for each servant and for each animal...plus the fee for crossing the King's bridges...that comes to ... and Matthew would lean over and show the merchant a ridiculously high amount.

"What! That is at least twice the amount I should pay!"

"Will you pay or shall I get the soldiers to force it out of you?" Matthew threatened again.

"You tax collectors are all the same! Forcing every last cent out of us hard-working merchants so you can have your fine houses and luxurious lifestyles. How can you live with yourself? I pity your mother and father for having such a child. You are a disgrace to us, Jews, you sinner!" The merchant turned his head and spit. He flung his money down on Matthew's table and left.

"Ha, ha," thought Matthew as he looked at the sum of money. "I'm off to a good start this morning!" Yet, deep inside Matthew knew that what the merchant had said was right. He was a disgrace to his family and his people. He was a sinner. "But, I am a rich sinner," Matthew said to comfort himself. "I have a nice house and lots of money. And at least I have the other tax collectors and outcasts for friends."

So now do you see how things were with Matthew? How much hope could there be for a tricky sinner like him? The Bible tells us. Here's what happened next:

News traveled fast along the Great West Road. Matthew overheard the latest happenings from merchants as they passing through this tax station. Those coming from Capernaum told amazing things about Jesus: He did miracles! He healed the sick and forgave their sins like He

was God. Just the day before He had forgiven the sins of a paralyzed man and healed him! The man just got up, picked up his mat and walked out of the house! No one has ever seen anything like this! Great crowds had begun to follow Jesus. People wanting to be healed. People wanting to be forgiven. People wanting to hear what Jesus had to say about God.

"Now this is stunning news!" thought Matthew. "A man healing people and forgiving sins? A man who offers forgiveness for sins, as if He was God?" Perhaps a little hope rose in Matthew's heart as he heard about Jesus. Perhaps he began to think about his life and his sin. Perhaps he began to think, "I am very rich, but I am such a sinner. I wonder if a sinner like me could be forgiven? I would like to meet this Jesus and see what he is like."

Soon, Matthew got to do just that. Later that day, Jesus was teaching a large crowd nearby. He came down to the Great West Road and right up to Matthew's tax booth. Jesus looked Matthew in the eyes and said, "Follow me."

What would Matthew do? Leave behind his job, his money? It would be almost impossible to get it back if he quit, especially if he quit right then and there. And what about his house and all his money? If he followed Jesus, he would have to give all of that up. Wouldn't he miss his good lifestyle? Matthew had a lot of big reasons to say "no" to Jesus' offer.

But Matthew had even bigger reason to say "yes" to Jesus. "Jesus offers forgiveness of sins and has proven He has the power to do it by healing the sick. It is nice to be rich, but I am such a terrible sinner. I want forgiveness even more than riches," thought Matthew. That settled it. Matthew turned to Jesus and said, "Yes, I will follow you!" He just got up, left everything and followed Jesus. Matthew turned away from his sinful life, believed in Jesus and followed him. Matthew was a changed man! God had forgiven and he had joy in his heart.

But it wasn't enough for Matthew to be forgiven of his sins. He wanted the other outcasts, to hear how they, too, could have their sins forgiven, by repenting and believing in Jesus. So Matthew held a great banquet for Jesus at his house and invited a big crowd of tax collectors and other outcasts.

Jesus ate with them and told them about the Kingdom of God. Never had there been a teacher like Jesus! To eat with someone in Jesus' day meant that you considered

them as your equal... even as family. No good Jew and certainly no teacher of God's Law would dream of eating with people like Matthew and his friends. But Jesus had come to save sinners from their sins. He knew that many of the other tax collectors and outcasts felt the burden of sin on their hearts, like Matthew. They longed to turn to God and be forgiven. Jesus would not hold back the good news of salvation from them.

But not everyone was as pleased with this news-especially the Pharisees. "Matthew the tax collector is throwing a huge feast for all the sinners and Jesus has gone to be with them!" they grumbled to each other.

They went to Matthew's house and found Jesus eating, drinking and teaching the people about the Kingdom of God. "Why do you eat and drink with 'sinners'?" the Pharisees complained to Jesus.

"You act like you have no sins. You think your good works make you right with God and you hate people who know they need God's forgiveness," Jesus replied.

So I have come to bring them forgiveness. It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance," Jesus told them.

The Pharisees knew the Bible better than anyone else in Jesus' day. They tried hard to keep every single works make you right with God and you hate people who know they need God's forgiveness," Jesus replied.

CASE STORY

Our story is called:

The Case of the Talking Tea Chests.

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 2. Who did he want them to talk to? What did they do when they heard what the tea chests had to say?

This story is not in the Bible. It is a true story about God's people obeying Jesus' command to spread the good news of salvation to the whole world. It takes place near the North Pole in Canada, in the 1830's.

"Crack! Crack! went the whip. "Now then, Curly, do your share! Come on, Puller, it's not far now," shouted the driver of the sled to his dogs.

"Crack! Crack!" The long whip snapped again, and the sled shot forward over the snow as the four, tired dogs pulled on steadily. The only sound was the tinkling of the bells on the moose-skin collars of the dogs, the crunching of the crisp snow under the sled boards, and occasionally in the distance the howling of a lone grey wolf.

Presently they passed from the open snow-field into a patch of half-burnt scrub. "Is this the place where we camp tonight?" the driver asked the two silent Indians who, for hours, had been running along beside the dogs. "Yes," the leader replied, "there is plenty of wood charred by last year's fire which will burn well."

In a few minutes the dogs were unharnessed and rolling on their backs in the snow. One of them began licking his tired feet, while the others nosed about for a rabbit or a ptarmigan (a type of small bird).

While James Evans unpacked the sled, the Indians chopped down a few charred tree-trunks, lit a bright crackling fire, and with their snow-shoes shoveled up a great bank of snow on three sides of it. Soon the water in their kettles was boiling, and the stiff frozen fish placed near the fire was thawed, cooked, and thrown to the hungry dogs. Next the men warmed up their own meal of tea and pemmican (flattened, dried buffalo meat) and tried to eat it before it froze solid again in the bitter cold air.

When supper was over, both dogs and men crawled close to the fire. The men talked about plans for the next day's trip, had a time of prayer and singing to the Lord, then prepared themselves for bed. They spread buffalo

skins and blankets, and wound them round themselves several times, covering even their heads, to protect themselves from getting frost-bite. Then they lay down with their feet to the fire, sheltered from the bitter wind by the bank of snow.

Each day they traveled further north in the bitter cold. Why were the men risking their lives like this? To take the good news of Jesus to the Cree Indians. How would they have a chance to trust in Jesus as their Savior if no one braved the snow and cold to tell them?

After weeks of travel, the men arrived at the Cree village. Many of these Indians had never seen a Paleface—a white-skinned man-- before, and they crowded around in wonder.

"Hello, my friends," James Evans greeted them in the Cree language, "come gather around my camp-fire and I will tell you stories of Gitche Manito, the Mighty. He is the Great Spirit who loves all people. He sent His Son Jesus into the world to tell about Gitche Manito and to pay for the sins of all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him."

The Crees listened to Evans for hours as he told them stories of Jesus. Slowly, they began to understand.

"It is not enough for me to tell these Cree Indians about Gitche Manito and His Son Jesus who made the way for people to know Him," James Evans decided. "I can only be with them for a few months at a time. These people need to be able to read about Him by themselves. Then, they can keep learning more about Him, even when I am gone. But how?" he wondered.

"There are so many problems! I hardly know how to speak Cree and they have no written language—not even an alphabet! What am I to do?"

For many days Evans thought and prayed for a plan. At last one came to mind. "Indian hunters draw pictures on a piece of bark showing a buffalo being captured or a fish being caught. Maybe I can make simple pictures that stand for sounds and put them together to make words," he decided.

So James Evans thought up a simple picture for every sound in the Cree language. Then he gathered together Chief Grey Moose and some of the other Cree men to begin teaching them.

James Evans used the end of a charred stick to make the sound pictures on a large board made of birch-bark. "This sign stands for 'ma'" he said as he pointed to the sound

picture on the board. Will you all say 'ma'?" he asked.

"Ma," they replied.

"This sign stands for 'nee'" as he made that symbol on the board. "Will you all say 'nee'?" James Evans asked them.

"Nee," they all repeated.

"Now say 'Ma-nee' as I point to the signs."

"Ma-nee," they replied.

"This is the sign for 'to" "Will you all say 'to'?"

"To," came the answer.

"Let's say them together, as I point to them?"

"Ma-nee-to," they said, repeating the sounds slowly.

"Maneeto!" they exclaimed excitedly. The birch bark is talking. It is saying words! Can the birch bark say other words?" they asked.

"Oh yes," said Evans, "it can speak many things. I will teach you read all the words of Gitche Manito the Mighty, yourself," Evans told them.

The Cree were so excited! Soon so many students joined his class that he couldn't teach them all from his picture board. "I must print part of the Bible for them to learn to read from," Evans decided. "But how? I have no paper. Maybe I could make paper out of birch bark," he thought. And maybe I could make lead stamps for each of the sound pictures to print them on the birch bark."

So that's what they did. The squaws beat birch bark strips into thin pieces and cut them into sheets of paper. A Cree Indian named Cutshanoquin took lead from

Evans' tea chests and melted it down. James carefully poured it into clay molds and made stamps for each sound picture. Then he began the work of stamping out the words of one of the Gospels into the little symbols that made up the Cree's new written language on the birch bark paper.

After months of hard work, Evans finished printing out one of the Gospels (one of the books of the Bible that tells the story of Jesus) in the Cree language. How happy the Cree were to read the story of how Jesus, God's Son, came to make the way to God, for all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior!

Not long after Evans finished the gospel, he had to leave the Crees and go back south to his family in Manitoba. He was sad to leave them, but was thankful to be able to leave the Cree a "talking book" about Gitche Manito the Mighty and His Son, Jesus that would tell them how they could turn from their sins and trust in Him as Savior long after he

was gone.

And what happened to the Cree? Did they keep their talking book and read it? Did they turn and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ? No one knew for thirty years. Then one day, a dozen Indians came to the door of a missionary who had come to live in Canada. He had seen many Indians in his day, but never ones like.

this. Where had they come from? What did they want?

They held out a thick book, with covers made of reindeer skin and with pages made of birch-bark, thick like coarse brown paper. On it, in faded ink, were large, clumsily made letters of the Cree language. It was the very book that James Evans made for them!

"We have traveled thirteen days to find you," they told the missionary. Long ago a man came and made this book and taught our people how to read it,' they told him, "but there much we don't understand. We have come to find a teacher, and we have come to ask you to show us its meaning and to send us a teacher."

Overjoyed the missionary answered, "Yes, of course, I will teach you. Come, my friends, sit by my fire," he said to them, "and I will tell you about Gitche Manito the Mighty and His Son, Jesus, that you might turn from your sins and trust in Him as Savior," just as James Evans had thirty years earlier.

Our Bible Truth is: We Must Trust Him as Our Savior and Obey Him as Our Lord Our Bible Verse is Romans 10: 9-10:

"...if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved."

Can you imagine making so many sacrifices for someone to hear about Jesus? James Evans was willing to make them because he knew it was worth any sacrifice to bring the good news of Jesus to people who had never heard. He wanted them to be able to confess with their mouths and believe in their hearts that God raised Jesus from the dead so that they could be saved.

Let's praise our God who saves for raising up men so like James Evans and his Indian friends to be willing to make great sacrifices to tell others how they can trust in Jesus as their Savior. Let's ask Him to work in our hearts that we might trust Jesus as our Savior. And let's ask Him to raise up more people—people like you and me, even—who would be willing to make great sacrifices so that others might hear about Jesus.

We need to confess to God that we are a sinner and ask His forgiveness for our sins. We need to believe that Jesus suffered and died on the cross as the perfect payment for our sins; and that three days later, He rose from the dead in victory over death. We need to turn our lives over to Him, asking Him to help us to love and live for Him in everything we do.

Trusting in Jesus to be our Savior is a wonderful work that God does by His Holy Spirit in the hearts of His people. He delights for us to ask Him to send the Holy Spirit to do this work in our heart.

When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, we also accept Him as our Lord. "Lord" is an old word used in the Bible that we don't use much anymore. It means someone who is in charge and who we are to obey. The sign of someone who truly trusts in Jesus as their Savior, is whether they also are trying to live to please God.

Our story is: The Case of the Red Rope Ransom. As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

- 1. Who put out the red rope? Why? Who was supposed to see it?
- 2. A ransom is something paid to free someone. How was the owner of the red rope ransomed--paid and freed twice? How was she used as part of God's plan to ransom many?

This story takes place in Old Testament times about 1400 years before Jesus lived on earth.

The city of Jericho was on alert. Its soldiers stood watch from its towering stone walls. The Israelites had set up camp not from away and all of Jericho was terrified. Who hadn't heard of the mighty power of the LORD, their God? He had rescued them from the powerful Egyptians. He had defeated their enemies, the king of Bashan and Sihon. Could He not also defeat them? the people of Jericho thought.

How much more scared the people of Jericho would have been, if they had known that Joshua, the leader of the Israelites was preparing the Israelites to march on their city very soon. A matter of fact, he would be sending out spies to check out Jericho that very day!

"Get the people ready," Joshua order his officers. "In three days, we will cross the Jordan River and take the land the LORD your God promised us." Then Joshua called two of his best soldiers to his tent. "Go and spy out the land across the Jordan River, especially Jericho," he ordered them. "Report to me what you see. Be careful! This is a dangerous mission, but the LORD will be with you."

So the spies crossed the Jordan, crept through the countryside. "What a large spring of water, what good fields of wheat. Look at the dates on those trees! The pastures are full of sheep and cows. There will be plenty of good supplies for our people!" the spies told each other.

At last they made it to Jericho. Soldiers lined the walls above, peering down on everyone entering through the city gates; yet somehow, the spies slipped through the gates unnoticed. Through the streets the they crept, taking note of everything they saw.

What a city Jericho was! About two thousand people lived inside its safe walls-- twenty-five feet high and

thick. Statues to Yerach, the moon god reminded the spies of the awful god these people worshiped and trusted for protection. Oh, what terrible sacrifices were made to this idol, this fake god! Yet soon, the LORD would lead the Israelites in victory over Jericho and all would see that it was the LORD, not Yerach, who is God in heaven above and on the earth below. The spies looked forward to that day!

The spies learned many things to tell Joshua about Jericho that day. But now, the sun was setting. Soon, the city gates would be shut. Yet hurry as they did, they were too late. The gates shut. They would have to hide in the city for the night. But where?

"Where might two weary travelers stay?" they asked.

"The house of Rahab" they were told. "Her house is one of the ones built into the wall."

The spies quickly made there way to her house, hoping they were safe. But they were not! They had been watched all day and word reached the king of Jericho: "Israel spies have been in Jericho all day. They are now at Rahab's house. What do you want us to do to them?" the soldiers asked the king.

"Tell Rahab to give up the spies! Arrest them and kill them!" the king answered.

But Rahab was making plans of her own. "I know that you are Israelite spies and you have been watched all day," she told the spies. "You must hide. Come up to the roof, quickly! We'll talk more when danger has passed." Rahab led the men to her roof and hid them under the huge bundles of flax she had laid out to dry.

"Bang! Bang!" The soldiers were soon at Rahab's door. "Rahab! We have a message for you from the king. Give us the men staying at your house. They are spies," they demanded.

"Yes, the men came, but I didn't know where they had come from," Rahab replied. "At sunset, when it was time to close the city gate, the men left. I don't know which way they went. Go quickly. You may catch up with them," she lied.

The soldiers believed Rahab and left the city, in search of the spies.

When the soldiers left, Rahab went to the spies and said," I know that the LORD has given this land to you. Everyone is so afraid because they have heard of the mighty power of the LORD, your God who is with you," she told them.

"Our lives for your lives!" the men assured her. "If you don't tell what we are doing, we will spare your lives when we take the city." So Rahab let them down by a rope through the window.

"Go to the hills and hide there three days until the soldiers return, and then go back to your camp," she told them.

"If you want us to keep this promise, you must tie this scarlet cord in your window," the spied told Rahab. "And make sure your whole family is in your house. It will be the only place where they will be safe."

Rahab agreed. She sent the spies away and tied the scarlet cord in the window.

The spies stayed in the hills for three days, then went back across the Jordan River to give Joshua their report: "The LORD has surely given the whole land into our hands; all the people are terrified because of us." They know that they can never stand against us and our great God, the LORD, for He is God in heaven above and on the earth below," they told him.

And the people of Jericho were right. Nothing could stand against the LORD. Seventeen days later, the Israelites stood before the high walls of Jericho. The priests sounded the trumpet blast, and Joshua commanded the people, "Shout! For the LORD has given you the city!"

When the trumpets sounded, the people shouted, and the walls fell down by the LORD's power. The Israelites charged in and took the city. All of Jericho was destroyed that day. Nothing was left, except for Rahab and her family, tucked safely away in her house with the scarlet cord in the window.

Did you ever wonder what happened to Rahab after Jericho was destroyed? The Bible tells us that Rahab turned away turned away from worshipping Yerach, the moon god, and turned to worship the LORD. Yes, Rahab became one of God's people! The LORD gave her a good Israelite husband of her very own and so honored her that He made her the great grandmother of King David and even the great, great, great, great, great, great etc. grandmother of none other than Jesus, Himself!

Our Bible Truth Is: We Must Trust Him as Our Savior and Obey Him as Our Lord

Our Bible Verse is Romans 10: 9-10:

Like all the people who believed in the LORD before Jesus came, Rahab did not know Jesus to trust Him as her Savior. Ever since Adam and Eve rebelled against God, each of us have been born with a spirit dead with sin. That means that on our own, none of us can know God or choose to live for Him, just like a dead person can't bring his body back to life.

But God can do what we cannot do. He can bring dead hearts to life, so that we can know Him and want to live for Him. He does this by sending His Holy Spirit to work in our hearts. As we hear God's Word, the Holy Spirit can help us see our sins and help us want to turn away from them. He gives us faith in God. Faith to trust that Jesus died on the cross for sinners and rose from the dead in victory. He gives us a new heart that can know God and want to live for Him.

Jesus called this being "born again, born of God." He calls this being born again because this change in heart is so radical that God actual makes us into a new creation—a brand-new person on the inside! He calls this being born of God, because this change comes from God. And with it, He makes us a part of His family forever.

We can ask God's Holy Spirit to work in our hearts like this. God delights to answer this prayer. He loves for sinners to ask Him to change them and make them into His people.

The Case of the Stony Hearts.

This story begins in Old Testament times, about 600 years before Jesus lived here on earth.

Some Babylonians had gone down to the Euphrates River to enjoy the shade of the poplar trees that grew along its banks. As usual, they brought their slaves along to serve them. Babylonian slaves came from many nations--all of them captured in war and brought back to Babylon to serve as slaves. But these particular slaves were Israelites. And the Babylonians, looking for some new entertainment, asked them to sing some songs from their homeland.

"Enough songs of Babylon!" the Babylonians said. "Take out your harps and play us a tune, you Israelites. Sing us a new, joyful song from Jerusalem, of Zion, your home," they ordered.

"How can we sing to you of Zion when it lies in ruins, destroyed by your soldiers!" the Israelites said. They hung their harps upon the branches of the poplar trees, sat down by the Euphrates and wept.

How sad the Israelite slaves were! They knew that they had sinned against the LORD and not turned back to Him when He warned them to stop sinning. He had told them that the Babylonians would destroy them if they did not repent. They refused, and so, the great armies of King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon had swept into their land and destroyed it... and all of Jerusalem with it. Gone were their lands, their houses, their cities, their Temple. The Babylonians soldiers had bound the people in chains and made them their slaves.

If only their hearts had not been so dirty with sin and so hard as stone! If only they had loved and obeyed God as He desired! Then none of this would have happened! "What can we do to be rid of these sad times brought by our sin? What can we do to bring back the good days in the kingdom of Israel?" the Israelites wondered.

The LORD saw how sad His people were and He sent His prophet Ezekiel with a comforting promise for them: "You

will have to stay in Babylon for seventy years, as I told you before. But after that, I will bring you out of Babylon and take you back home so you can rebuild Jerusalem and the kingdom of Israel," the LORD told them.

"And that is not all. I am going to do something even better than give you back the kingdom of Israel as it was!" the LORD promised. "I am going to truly bring an end to your sad times brought on by your sin. Like water washes dirty things clean, I am going to clean your hearts of sin. I am going to change them so that they will no longer be hard and disobedient like stone. I will make your hearts alive again by putting my Spirit inside you! Then I, Myself, will move you to love Me and follow My ways," He told them. "And one day, I am going to send My Messiah to make the whole earth My perfect Kingdom forever. Then you will be My beloved people and I will be your beloved God."

The Israelites took comfort in the LORD's promises and waited...for long seventy years. And sure enough, God kept His promise to them. On the very day after the seventy years were finished, they were freed.

How the Israelites rejoiced to be going back home to Jerusalem! Yet they wondered, "Would the LORD fulfill His other promises--when He would change their sad times brought by their sin; and send the Messiah to bring His Kingdom forever?"

Six hundred years passed and still the Israelites waited to see the LORD answer these promises. The Babylonians were long gone, but now a new enemy – the Romans—had come and taken over the kingdom of Israel and brought new sinful, sad times.

"Now would be a good time for the Messiah to bring God's Kingdom," the people of Israel thought. "He would get rid of the Romans and set up His kingdom forever," they hoped. "What can we do to be rid of these sinful, sad times? What can we do to bring the Kingdom of God?" they wondered.

"Perhaps there is a reason God hasn't sent the Messiah to rescue us,' thought the Pharisees. "Perhaps our hearts and lives are too dirty because we don't keep His laws. Perhaps if we keep all of God's laws and are really good, then that would bring an end to these sinful, sad times and bring God's kingdom sooner." they hoped. But as hard as they tried, they couldn't keep the God's laws just right. No. They couldn't bring the Messiah by their own good deeds.

They had to wait for God to fulfill His promises.

And so He did. At the right time, Jesus came. He began to do amazing miracles and to tell everyone that the Kingdom of God was near. He even stormed into the Temple area and cleared it of men who were making money off of people come to worship the LORD. "This is God's house," Jesus said. "It's to be a house of prayer; not a thieves' den as you have made it!"

Everyone began talking about Jesus and the things He did. "Who has ever spoken like this or has done miracles like this? Who would dare clear the Temple, as if it was his? Could this be the Messiah?" some people wondered.

But the Pharisees and others said, "Who does Jesus think he is? He does amazing things and talks like he is something special, but he's no Messiah! "No one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again, born of God," Jesus answered him.

"I thought the kingdom of God was for the people of Israel who kept God's laws. What could this mean to be born again?" Nicodemus thought. "How can a man be born when he is old?" he asked Jesus.

"No one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit," Jesus replied. "But I'm not talking about your body being born like a baby again. I'm talking about your spirit, your heart. You can only enter God's Kingdom if God's Spirit has given new life to your spirit,"

He explained. "You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again." Jesus continued. "The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit. No one can see the Holy Spirit, but it is He who works in the hearts of people as He pleases, changing them. He's the one who brings an end to sad, sinful times by working in their hearts. Nicodemus may have left that night with more questions than he came. Jesus' answers surprised him. If only he would remember the promises God gave the people of Israel through Ezekiel long ago! That night Jesus was telling him that at last God was fulfilling those promises. Jesus would die for God's peoples' sins. By His Holy Spirit, He would wash away their sins and change our hearts by filling them with His Spirit. This was how God would bring an end to the sinful, sad times and bring in the Kingdom of God--in the hearts of His people.

Studd and Priscilla Stewart-chose to leave their comfortable homes and families in England and Ireland and traveled thousands of miles away to China. Someone needed to tell these people about Jesus!

In a tiny mission house, way up the mighty Yangtze River in the little city of Ta-Ku-Tang, a small Chinese man named Pastor Shi stood reading from an opened book to the English man and Irish woman before him.

"Do you Charles, take Scilla to be your wedded wife.. to have and to hold...for better or for worse...in sickness and in health....?" the pastor asked the man.

"I do!" responded the English man who looked like a giant compared with tiny Pastor Shi.

"Scilla, do you take Charles to be your wedded husband... to have and to hold... for better or for worse..in sickness and in health...?" he then asked the woman.

"I do!" eagerly replied the lively, blond-haired, blueeyed young Irish woman.

The trip to Lungang-Fu was far from a relaxing honeymoon! The newlyweds had to cross rushing rivers, hike narrow, dangerous mountain ledges, and slog through mud up to their knees.

And as difficult as the trip to Lungang-Fu was, life in that faraway city was even more difficult! The people of Lungang-Fu weren't happy to see Scilla, Charles and Miss Burroughes and certainly not eager to hear their message about Jesus. No one would even give them a house to live in, except for the one they thought was haunted by evil spirits.

The lies about this fake Messiah, Jesus, would end!. Saul would make sure of that...or would he? For as Saul and the soldiers neared Damascus, something completely unexpected happened. Something that would change Saul forever.

They were almost to Damascus, when suddenly a heavenly light shone down on Saul. He fell down to the ground and heard a voice say, "Saul, and heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?"

"Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

The men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but didn't see anyone. Saul got up

I have been the chief of sinners, but now the Lord Jesus has forgiven me to show to others how great His mercy is. Everything else is nothing compared with knowing Jesus. I will spend the rest of my days praising His name and telling others about the glorious riches of knowing Him," Saul decided.

Saul spent several days with the Christians in Damascus. At once he started preaching in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God. All those who heard him were shocked and asked, "Isn't he the man who was putting the Christians in jail in Jerusalem? Didn't he come here to arrest more Christians and take them as prisoners to the chief priests?"

Let's praise God for His mighty Holy Spirit! He can change any heart! Do you have a stubborn heart towards God? Do you know someone who does not believe in Jesus and has a stubborn heart towards Him? God can change your heart, if you ask Him to. He can change the hearts of anyone! We should never give up praying for others because we know that no one has a heart too hard for the Holy Spirit to change.
