Crimes

Both "X" hands, held near sides with palms facing up, move upward and outward in circles simultaneously.



Done

Move open hands, palms down side to side at the same time.



Groaned

Clenched hands are helded over heart and twisted back and forth a few times.



Tree

Elbow of right arm is placed on back of left hand, with right fingers pointed up. Right wrist is twisted as right fingers are wiggled. (Simulating tree trunk and branches swaying in the wind.)



Amazing

Move right "5" hand, back in forth in front of face a few times.



Pity

Both "5" hands, palms facing forward and middle fingers bent forward, make a downward stroke several times.



Grace

Begin with fingertips of right hand touching, plam facing forward. Twist wrist around, bringing hand down and palm facing body, while at the same time opening up the fingers and flattening the hand.



Love


Fists are crossed on chest, palms facing body.



Beyond

Right "A" hand, thumb up is placed slightly behind left "A" hand, thumb up; then, is moved up and over left hand, then forward.

Cross

Right "C" hand moves horizontally from left to right, then up and down. (Tracing out the two beams of wood of the cross.)



Light

Hold both hands at chest level, fingertips together. Open hands into "5" hands as they move up and out to the side, palms facing out.



Burden

Place fingertips of both hands on right shoulder, bearing down.



Heart

Middle fingers are used to traced out the shape of a heart on upper left chest.



Faith

Right index finger touches forehead. Then, right "F" hand, palm facing in, hits left "F" hand, palm facing in, in a down-up-down motion, ending with right thumb- index finger resting on left thumb-index finger.



Received

Open hands, palms, facing body, are held away from chest, right hand over the left. Both hands are brought towards body, ending with "S" hands, with pinky side of right hand resting on top of index-thumb side of left hand.



Sight

Index and middle finger of right "V" hand, palm facing in, are placed near eyes then moved forward.



Happy

Left arm, palm down, faces right with index finger extended and touching elbow of right arm, which points up with index finger extended up. Right arm is then pivoted down in an arc until it rests just above left elbow.



Day

Both upturned "5" hands are held side by side in front of chest. Bring both hands in, drawing in the fingers slightly to a grasping position.

Sun

Left flat hand rests on back of right flat hand. Right flat hand is then brought up and around left hand and pivots so that back of right hand rests in left palm.



Hide

Right "A" hand, palm facing in, is brought up to rest under left flat hand.



Shut In

Both flat hands are held at sides,, then brought together in front of body, palms facing forward.



Glories

Middle finger of right hand touches upturned left flat hand, then is wiggled back and forth as it is raised up.



Christ

Right "C" hand is placed at right shoulder then moved down acros chest, ending at right hip.



Mighty

Both "S" hands, palms facing body, are thrust forward and up in unison.



Died

Hold both flat hands in front of body with fingertips pointing forward, right flat hand palm up and left flat hand palm down. Flip both over towards the left until the right palm is face down and the left palm is face up.



Man

"P" hands, held side by side, make alternating forward circles.



Sin

Both "X" hands, held near sides with palms facing up, move upward and outward in circles simultaneously.

Cross

Right "C" hand moves horizontally from left to right, then up and down. (Tracing out the two beams of wood of the cross.)



Light

Hold both hands at chest level, fingertips together. Open hands into "5" hands as they move up and out to the side, palms facing out.



Burden

Place fingertips of both hands on right shoulder, bearing down.



Heart

Right "S" hand is placed on forehead, palm facing in. Right index finger extends up, making a "D" hand.





Right open hand, palm facing left, is held up above head level then brought down and back in a slight arc, ending with a "B" hand at the upper chest level.




Turned Away

Sheep are animals who need a shepherd to lead them and keep them safe. Without a shepherd, they easily wander away on their own, getting lost, getting hurt or even getting eaten by another animal! God tells us in the Bible that people are like sheep. We have all wandered away from Him, our good shepherd. Left to ourselves, we will all eventually face the consequences of our turning away from Him: death!

But Jesus is the good shepherd of His people! He is God's Son, sent to rescue all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. Upon Him, the LORD laid all of our iniquity (our sins). That is, He paid for them when He suffered and died on the cross. He rose from the dead on the third day showing that He had really done it. So, instead of getting the punishment of death that they justly deserve for turning away from God, all who trust in Jesus are forgiven and receive eternal life with God.

Flat hands, palms facing each other, move forward and progressively closer.





Hold up right index, palm facing forward




