


These are some of the many things you might enjoy this Easter.

On the first Easter, there were no fluffy, toy bunnies.




Easter Bunny

Matthew 21:9


Some of the people went ahead of him, and some followed.

"Hosanna in the highest heaven!"


On the first Easter, there weren't mommies and daddies paying at shops for Easter treats for their kids.

Matthew 26:14-15


One of the 12 disciples went to the chief priests.

So they counted out 30 silver coins for him.


On the first Easter, there weren't chocolate Easter eggs to eat.

"Take this and eat it. This is my body."


Then he took a cup. He gave thanks and handed it to them.

It is poured out to forgive the sins of many people."


On the first Easter, there weren't happy thoughts about the fun things that would happen the next day.




Matthew 26:26-28

On the first Easter, there weren't friends and family having fun together.




Fun Times with Friends and Family

When enemies came to capture Jesus, his friends all ran away.

They left Jesus to suffer alone at the hands of his enemies.

They tied him up and led him away.


Then they handed him over to Pilate, who was the governor.

Pilate let Barabbas go free. But he had Jesus whipped.

Then he handed him over to be nailed to a cross.

They took off his clothes and put a purple robe on him.
Then they twisted thorns together to make a crown.
They placed it on his head. They put a stick in his right hand.
Then they fell on their knees in front of him and made fun of him.
"We honor you, king of the Jews!" they said. They spit on him.
They hit him on the head with the stick again and again.
After they had made fun of him, they took off the robe.
They put his own clothes back on him.
Then they led him away to nail him to a cross.


On the first Easter, there wasn't bright sunshine all day long.

It was as dark at night in the middle of the day.

As Jesus suffered on the cross for the sins of God's people, everything became as dark as night for three hours. Oh, what a very big thing Jesus was doing! Even the sun refused to shine!



Matthew 28: 33,35-37,45-47

When they had nailed him to the cross, they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

Above his head they placed the written charge against him. It read,

"THIS IS JESUS, THE KING OF THE JEWS."

From noon until three o'clock, the whole land was covered with darkness.

About three o'clock, Jesus cried out in a loud voice.

He said, "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?" (Psalm 22:1)

After Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, he died.
At that moment the temple curtain was torn in two from top to bottom.
The earth shook. The rocks split. The Roman commander and those guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened. They were terrified.

They exclaimed, "He wa's surely the Son of God!"


On the first Easter, there weren't beautiful, new Easter clothes to put on.

Instead, they put strips of plain linen on Jesus' body.


Friends took Jesus' body down from the cross. They prepared it to be buried.. They wrapped his dead body in strips of linen covered with sweet-smelling spices.



The soldiers saw that [Jesus] was already dead. So they did not break his legs.
Instead, one of the soldiers stuck his spear into Jesus' side.
Right away, blood and water flowed out.
These things happened in order that Scripture would come true.
It says, "Not one of his bones will be broken."
Scripture also says, "They will look to the one they have pierced."

Joseph asked Pilate for Jesus' body. After Pilate gave him permission, Joseph came and took the body away. Nicodemus went with Joseph. Nicodemus brought some mixed spices that weighed about 75 pounds. The two men took Jesus' body. They wrapped it in strips of linen cloth, along with the spices. That was the way the Jews buried people.


On the first Easter, there weren't Easter baskets filled with Easter eggs.

Instead, there was a tomb (a cave grave) to put Jesus' body in.

Joseph used his own tomb for Jesus' body. He put it inside, then he rolled a heavy stone in place like a big door. Jesus' enemies sent soldiers to guard the tomb. They remembered Jesus said he would rise from the dead. They wanted to make sure his body stayed put!



Matthew 27:60-65

[Joseph] placed [Jesus' body] in his own new tomb that he had cut out of the rock. He rolled a big stone in front of the entrance to the tomb. Then he went away.

The next day ...The chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate.
"Sir," they said, "we remember something that liar said while he was still alive.

He claimed, 'After three days I will rise again.'

So give the order to make the tomb secure until the third day.


If you don't, his disciples might come and steal the body.

Then they will tell the people that Jesus has been raised from the dead.

This last lie will be worse than the first."

"Take some guards with you," Pilate answered. "Go. Make the tomb as secure as you can." So they went and made the tomb secure.

On the first Easter, there were were no Easter Egg Rolls or Easter Egg Hunts.

But, there was a stone rolled away and a hunt for a missing body.

On Sunday, the morning of the third day, some women who were Jesus' friends went to care for his body. An angel rolled the stone away from Jesus' cave grave. And what did they see? Jesus' body was missing. He had risen just as he said he would!



It was dawn on [Sunday], the first day of the week. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb... An angel rolled back the stone and sat on it.

The angel said to the women, "Don't be afraid. I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here! He has risen, just as he said he would!

Come and see the place where he was lying. Go quickly!


Tell his disciples, 'He has risen from the dead"

So the women hurried away from the tomb. They were afraid, but they were filled with joy. They ran to tell the disciples.

Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings!" he said.

They came to him, took hold of his feet and worshiped him.

On the first Easter, people weren't celebrating spring and all the new life bursting into the world after a long, cold winter.



Instead, they celebrated that Jesus had burst forth out of the grave to live forevermore!

Jesus had really beaten sin and death. He proved that when he rose up from the dead. How Jesus' followers praised God that first Easter Sunday! Because of Jesus, they could know God and be a part of God's family forever. He would give them new hearts. He would help them love God and live the lives God wanted

them to live.



Acts 2:42,44,46-47

The believers studied what the apostles taught.

They shared their lives together. They ate and prayed together...

They shared everything they had...Their hearts were glad and sincere.

They praised God. They were respected by all the people.

Every day the Lord added to their group those who were being saved.

And that's why even to this day, God's people from every place and every time, have kept on celebrating what Jesus did on that first, very different Easter. There is nothing better than knowing God and being a part of his family. This is the Easter gift that Jesus gave them when he died on the cross.



God's People from Every Place and Every Time But that wonderful Easter gift, from that first Easter, is just the beginning! God's people look forward to God's great big FINAL gift when Jesus comes back. He will bring an end to sin, sickness, sadness and death for good! 
John 3:16
