
Go and Tell Bible Truth Concept Craft

God Is Everywhere, All the Time

Craft Description

The children will create a pair of binoculars that remind them that there is no place, no matter how near or how far, where the LORD will not be, too.

Materials

Cardstock/Paper
Crayons/Markers
Sturdy yarn or string
2 pieces of cardstock per craft (or two toilet paper rolls per craft)
Clear packing tape
Glue
Hole puncher

Preparations

1. If making cardstock rolls, (instead of using toilet paper rolls): Cut cardstock for binoculars down to a width of 4". Then roll each sheet or cardstock into a roll, about 1.5" in diameter. Secure roll in place by taping the seam.
2. Make copies of the binoculars coloring sheet onto the paper/cardstock.
3. Tape the two rolls together securely.
4. Punch a hole into the top side of each roll. (This is where you will tie on the straps.)
5. Set out crayons/markers, paper.
6. Make a sample copy of the craft.

Introducing the Craft:

"Our Big Question is: 'Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?' We've learned that 'He's Not Like Anyone Else... He Is Everywhere, All the Time.' That's something very good to know. But many people don't know it! So do you know what God wants us to do? He wants us to go and tell others this very important news. Today we are going to make something we can show and tell them, too. Here's what it looks like..." (Hold up example of craft)

Directions

1. Show children your finished craft, reading the words to them.
2. Have children color in the picture.
3. Center the picture on the top side of the rolls. Curl sides of paper down each side of the rolls. Tape down securely.
4. Measure out a length of string for each child's binocular strap. Needs to be able to fit over their head and rest on their chest. Insert each end of the string into the hole on each side of the cardboard rolls of the binoculars and secure with a knot.
5. Make sure to write each child's name on their craft.

Discussion

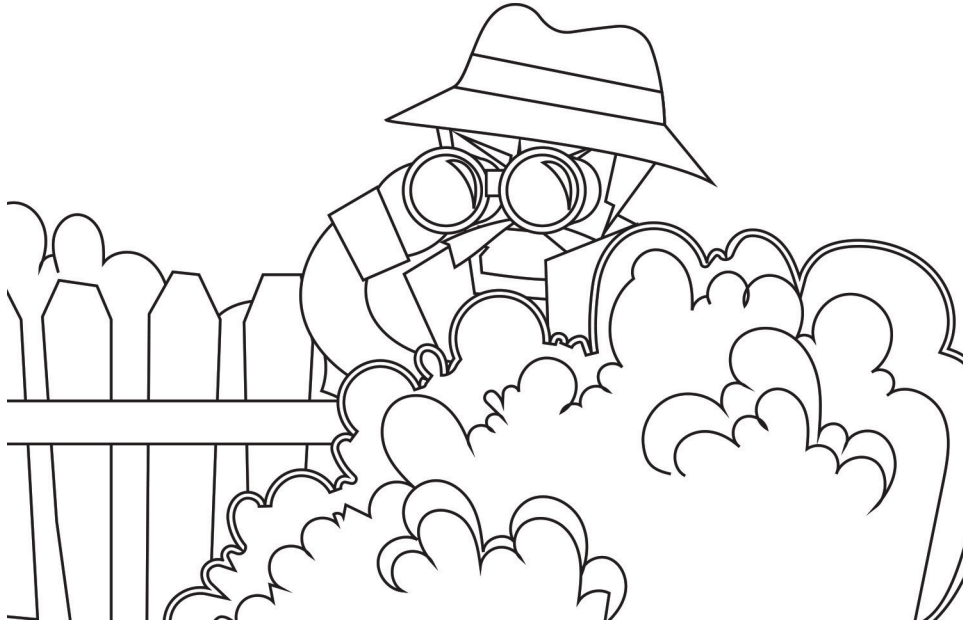
This is an especially good time to re-read the key concepts and discuss them. See Deep Down Discussion Sheet for possible questions to talk about.

Craft Wrap Up:

"At the end of our time together today, you get to take home your Go and Tell crafts. And what are you going to do with them? Show and tell someone the important news you've learned today." Practice saying the words written on their binoculars as they look up and down and around.

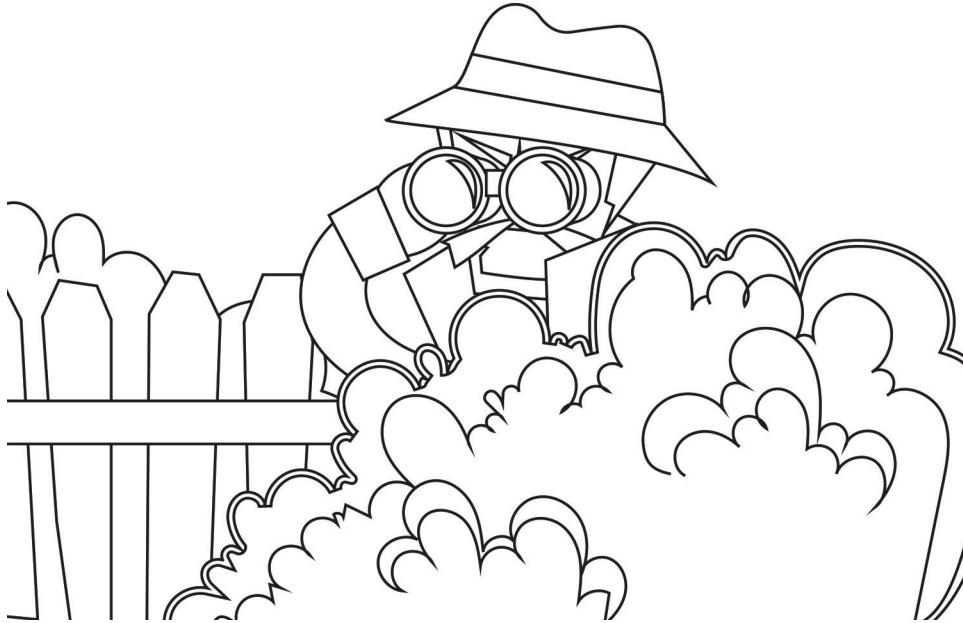

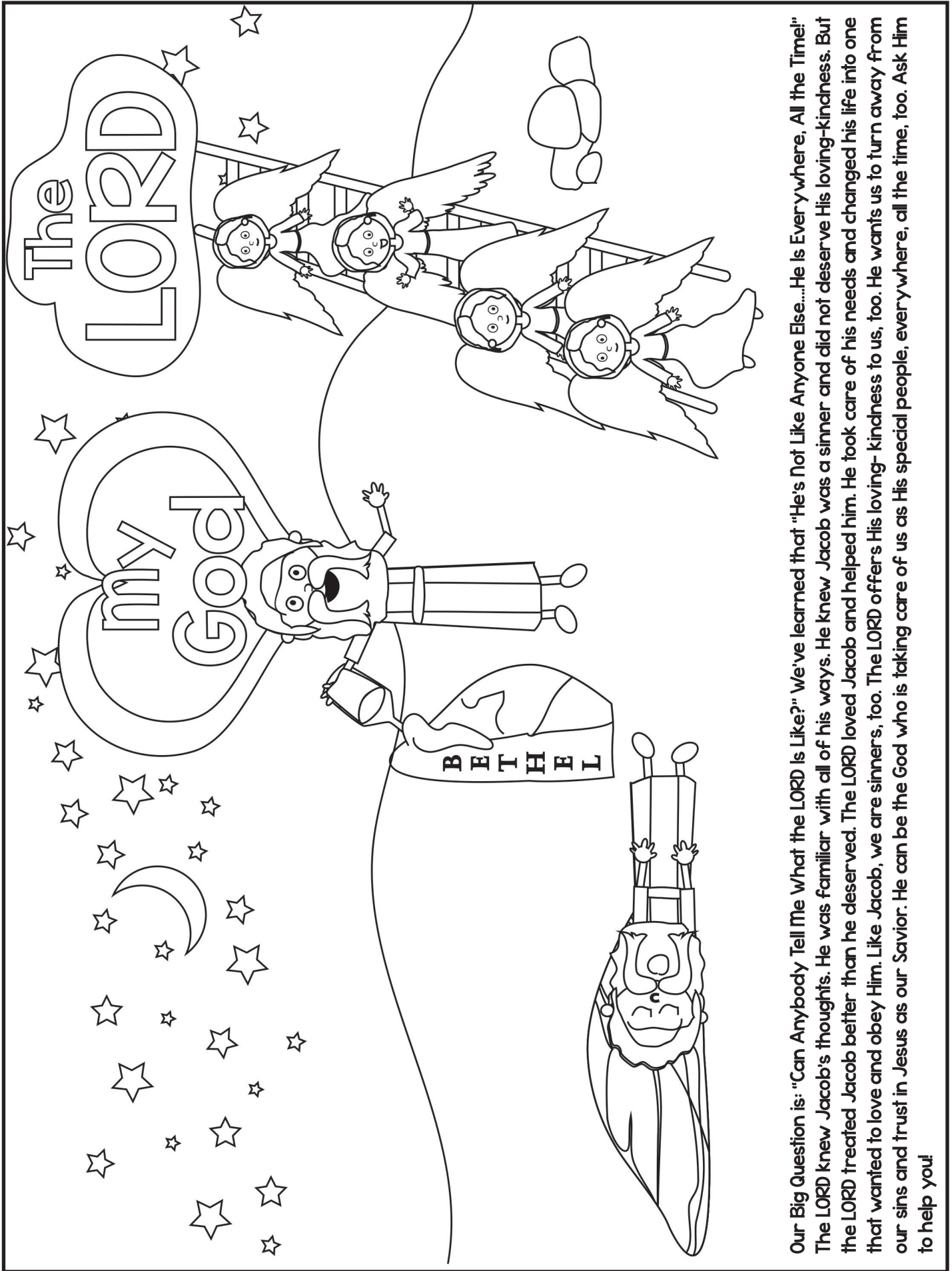
