

Session Prep (especially good for newbies!)



Pray for the Holy Spirit to be at work in your and the children's hearts.

Review



If new to the curriculum, look at the **Getting Started with Deep Down Detectives section of the Core Curriculum book.** (p.5) It will be especially helpful to read through the Deep Down Detectives section of **The Praise Factory Tour: Extended Version Book.** This is a visual way to understand what goes on in the classroom. (A pdf of the book is found in the samples section on the website.)

Look through and Learn the Lesson



Read over **lesson plan**. Practice any **songs or action rhymes** you are using. Choose/make up motions to go with these. Choose less with younger children and more with older preschoolers. **Practice the lesson with the visual aids** and using the Big Question Box/Briefcase.

Read and Rehearse the Bible Story with Pictures



Read the Bible story from the Bible. Read the curriculum version. Practice telling it with the storyboard pictures. (If you have not previously laminated the story pictures, do that now.)

Let There Be Music



Download the music and listen to the songs. Choose which of the songs you will use with the children. If using live musicians, make sure they have the sheet music (Appendix A, Core Curriculum book).

Put the Props in Place



1. Prepare your Visual Aids. Put the Big Question, Unit Bible Truths, Bible Truth, Bible Verse, and Listening Assignment signs, as well as the Bible Story script in one side of the Bible folder.

2. Get out your storyboard. If using Simple Story Scenes, put these in your Blble Folder. Or, if using the individual storyboard figures, put all background pictures in place (they have a BG by the number). Put the rest of the storyboard pictures (these have a SB by the number) in order of use in the other side of the Bible folder.

3. Put the DDD Bible Folder as well as the Big Question sign in the Big Question Box/Briefcase and shut it. If your box/briefcase has locks and you want to use the unlocking the box as part of your session, lock it now....but make sure you have the key or know the code first.

4. Prepare the music CD or sheet music or mp3 device for use in your session.

Set Out Free Play Activities



Choose and set up free time activities you will use with the children. Choose a variety of different activities that will be enjoyed by different types of children. Rotate the activities you provide to keep them interesting and fresh to your children. (Suggestions in Appendix D, Core Curriculum books.)

Prepare Any Activities



Choose which (if any) of the Bible Truth games and crafts activities you want to use in the session. Bear in mind your time frame as well as the developmental abilities and attention span of your children as you decide which/how many to prepare. **Look over the Discussion Sheet** and choose a few questions you might use to spark discussion with the children as they do their activities (especially good for ages 3's+). Pray for God to give you opportunities to talk about these things with the children.

Let Them Take It with Them



Make copies of the craft/take home sheets, if you are not already using them as one of your activities. You may also want to make copies of the story (see take-home version of each story included in Appendix C with the other take home resources) to have for parents to use with their children at home. There's a link on each craft/take home sheet to the story, if you don't make hard copies.

Store It



After your session is over, collect the resources and store them for future use. This curriculum can be used over and over for years to come.

Unit 9: Jesus, Immanuel, God with Us

UNIT OVERVIEW

In the beginning, God created the world perfectly and people had a wonderful, special closeness with Him. Yes, it was perfect wonderfulness knowing God and living in His world. It could have lasted forever... but it did not. It was broken when people disobeyed God. The big Bible word for disobeying God is sin. So much in this world is not perfect or wonderful anymore. When we look around us, we can see the sadness that sin brought into God's good world long ago. We've lost the special closeness with God, too. We can see it when we look inside our heart. Yes, when sin came into the world it spoiled so many things.

Would all this sin and sadness last forever? People certainly deserved it to. After all, they had turned their backs on God. They had chosen to live life their own way instead of God's good way. Now they actually deserved God's punishment, not His love, for what they had done. But God is so kind and treats us so much better than we could ever deserve. So even way back then in the beginning, God had an amazing plan to rescue us. He promised to send a Savior—a special person who would rescue us from the sin and sadness, and bring us back to Him and His love. Who was that Savior? God's Son, Jesus. Yes, Jesus came to bring us to God.

In this unit, we will learn six truths about Jesus, our Savior.

Unit Big Question (and Answer): What Did Jesus Come to Do? Jesus Came to Bring Us to God!

Unit Bible Verse: "Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God." 1 Peter 3:18

Bible Truth 4 Concept: Jesus Came to Bring Us to God... He Died on the Cross for the Sins of God's People!

Sadly, we are all sinners who disobey God. We all deserve God's punishment for our sins. But Jesus never, ever sinned. He never deserved any punishment from God. Yet Jesus chose to suffer and die on the cross. He didn't suffer and die because He deserved to. He suffered and died in the place of God's people so they wouldn't have to. Yes, He offered up His perfect life as the full payment for their sins.

Jesus suffered so much on the cross! His body hurt so badly as He hung there by the nails. But Jesus' spirit inside Him hurt even more, as He took the punishment for our sins and was separated from God, His Father. But when at last Jesus finished suffering on the cross, He had paid for all of the sins of God's people.

Jesus died and was buried in a cave-grave that day, but He didn't stay there! On the third day, Jesus rose from the grave to live forevermore. He had really done it! He had beaten sin and death for God's people. Now they could have special closeness with God in their hearts. Now they would be His dearly loved people forever. We can become God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God will forgive our sins. He will give us special closeness in our hearts with Him now. And one day, we can go to live with God forever.

Bible Truth 4 Bible Verse: Hosea 13:14

"I will ransom them from the power of the grave, I will redeem them from death."

Learn a Little: "I will redeem them from death."

Meaning

Ransom! Redeem! What do those big words mean? To pay the price to rescue someone and make them your very own. What did God ransom His people from? The power of the grave and death ("Sheol" is another Bible word for the grave and death.)

Yes, indeed! When Jesus suffered and died on the cross, He paid for all of the sins of God's people, so they could be forgiven! When we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus, we can be God's people, too. All of our sins will be forgiven through Him, so we can know God now and get to live with Him forever!

Bible Truth 4 ACTS Prayer

- A Jesus, we praise You for being our Savior. You came to bring us to God. We praise You for being willing to suffer and die on the cross for the sins of God's people.
- **C** Jesus, how we need You to be our Savior! We are all sinners who disobey God. We all deserve God's punishment. Please forgive us!
- **T** Thank You, Jesus, for suffering and dying on the cross to save all who turn away from their sins and trust in You as their Savior. Thank You for taking all of God's punishment, so we might be forgiven. Thank You that no one is too sinful for You to save. You are a big enough Savior for any of us.
- **S** Jesus, work in our hearts. Help us to turn away from our sins. Help us to trust in You as our Savior. Help us to love You and live for You more and more. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

The Case of the Great PriceMatthew 27; Mark 15; Luke 23; John 19Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

The Roman king did NOT put up with lawbreakers! Some lawbreakers he punished by putting them in jail for a long time. And some, he punished by whipping them with painful, sharp ropes. Others, he sent away to sea to row big warships for his soldiers. But the worst kinds of lawbreakers, the king sent to a hill outside of Jerusalem called Golgotha. And there, these worst kinds of men were given the worst kind of punishment. They were put up on big, wooden crosses (with nails!), and they were left there to suffer and die.

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The cross was a terrible punishment! It was so terrible that people in Jesus' day would not even say the word "cross". "Cross" was a bad word that good people did not say, let alone think about.

What kinds of lawbreakers died on crosses? Traitors died on crosses (men who tried to get rid of the king). Murderers died on crosses (men who killed other people). Robbers died on crosses (men who took other people's things). These worst kinds of lawbreakers were given the worst kind of punishment.

The cross. It was for bad men being punished for the bad things they had done. That's the way it was back in those days. At least, that was the way it was supposed to be.

But what a strange thing people saw on Golgotha, one Friday long ago! For there, on that, hill stood three crosses for three men. Two of the men were robbers, but the third one was a man no one expected to see there. Can you guess who it was?

Can you guess?

It was Jesus!

Now, everyone could understand why the two robbers had been put on their crosses. These men had snatched other people's things, and now they were being punished for the bad things they had done. That was the Roman king's law.

But Jesus? Why was He there? What bad thing had He done? Can you tell me?

Can you think of anything bad that Jesus had done?

Had Jesus snatched other people's things, like the robbers? No! Had He killed someone like, the murderers? No! Had He tried to get rid of the king, like the traitors? No! Jesus had never done any of these bad things. As a matter a fact, Jesus had never sinned. He had never done EVEN ONE bad thing in His whole life!

Jesus always kept God's laws. He always loved God most of all. He always loved others as the Bible tells us to. In EVERYTHING Jesus thought in His heart; and in EVERYTHING Jesus said and did, He never, ever disobeyed God. Jesus was the only person who ever lived a PERFECT LIFE. That's why Jesus, of all people, did not deserve to be up there on that cross!

So, why WAS Jesus on that cross, if not for bad things He had done? Was it all just a big mistake?

What do you think?

Far from it! This was God's plan. Yes, it was the Roman king who ordered Jesus to be put on that cross, and it was his soldiers who put Jesus on it. But God had woven their evil deeds into His much, much bigger, GLORIOUS, LOVING, GOOD plan to rescue His people from their sins.

Jesus was up on that cross because He CHOSE to be there to take the punishment God's people deserved from GOD!

From God?! Why would HE need to punish His people? Didn't He love them? Yes, He loved them very much.

But you see, the LORD is the one, true, perfectly good God, and (SB20) He is the big king over everyone. He has given us His perfectly good laws to live by, but have we obeyed them?

Have we?

No, we have not! None of us! We have ALL disobeyed God, and we ALL deserve His punishment for disobeying Him and His good laws. That makes us all sinners. And oh, what a terrible punishment we all deserve! We deserve to be separated from God and all His goodness forever. Forever punishment! Isn't that awful?

But God loved the world so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to suffer and die on that cross. He took the punishment for the sins of God's people upon Himself, so they wouldn't have to. Jesus' perfect life paid for their sins, so they could be FORGIVEN. And, so they could be loved by God forever, instead of punished!

Who are God's people? They are all who would ever turn away from disobeying God and trust in Jesus as their Savior. All who come to God like this are God's people! So, that's why Jesus suffered and died on the cross that day. Not for anything He had done, but because He loved God, His Father, and God's people so much. Isn't Jesus amazing!

And how do we KNOW that Jesus really took all of the punishment for God's people that day? It's because of what happened on the third day after Jesus died. Do you know what happened?

Can you tell me?

On Day One, Jesus' body stayed dead in the cave-grave. On Day Two, Jesus' body stayed dead in the cavegrave. But on Day Three, Jesus rose up from the dead, showing that He had really done it!

Now, God's people were forgiven forever! Now, they never would have to have God's punishment. Now, they would get to know and love Him in their hearts their whole lives! And one day, when they die, they would get to go live with God forever! What a wonderful thing it is to be God's dearly-loved people!

Thank You, Jesus, for taking all of God's punishment for God's people on the cross! Thank You, that You offer for us to become God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in You as our Savior! Help us to do this, even today!
