



Big Question 4 : Can You Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?

Answer: He's Not Like Anyone Else... He Is Always Faithful, through and through!



How do I know this is true? The Bible tells me so!

"Incline your ear, O LORD, and answer me, for I am poor and needy... But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. Turn to me and be gracious to me; give your strength to your servant." --- Psalm 86:1,15,16, ESV

Learn a Little: "You... are a God... abounding faithfulness."

Meaning

This verse reminds us that the LORD is always faithful to His people. He is merciful and gracious to them. He is slow to anger and abounding in love that never ends. Even when they are unfaithful to Him and deserving of punishment rather than kindness, the LORD goes on being faithful to them. How amazing is the LORD!

Listening Assignments

"Hey, Kids! Detective Dan, here. Listen carefully to the story and help me answer these questions:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

I need to find out:

- 1. Who needed bread? Why was it so hard to get it?
- 2. Who never forgot to give them bread? What was special about it?

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is Psalm 86:1,15,16, ESV:

"Incline your ear, O LORD, and answer me, for I am poor and needy... But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. Turn to me and be gracious to me; give your strength to your servant."

I need to find out:

- 1. What did the people of Israel think the LORD would NOT be faithful to provide for them?
- 2. How did the LORD show He was faithful to His promises to take care of the people of Israel?

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but only 4 of them are in the story.

- 2. Who thanked the LORD for rescuing them from the mean king of Egypt?

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

The Case of the Never-Forgotten Food Exodus 16

Rocks and weeds. Weeds and rocks. That's all that the people of Israel could see around them. No water. No food. They were out in the dry, deserty wilderness.

They USED to live in Egypt. The king had forced them to work very, very hard for him. He had been very mean to them. He didn't care if they were hurt. He just wanted them to work and work and work.

But the LORD cared. He sent a man to rescue them and take them away from Egypt and that mean king. Do you know what the man's name was?

Do you know?

It was Moses! Yes, the LORD would use Moses and his brother, Aaron, to show His mighty power to the king and all his people. He would use him to free them from all that hard work, and take them to a wonderful homeland.

At first the king refused to let Moses take the people of Israel away. But as the LORD used His mighty power to send sad thing after sad thing upon the king and his people, the king finally said yes.

The people gathered up their things and Moses led them out of Egypt and into the wilderness. They were off to the wonderful homeland the LORD promised them! Yay!

How happy the people were as they left Egypt! They had so much to thank the LORD for!

Can you think of what they could thank the LORD for doing for them?

No longer did they have to work for that mean king! No longer did they have to live as his slaves. The LORD was caring for them and He would lead them home.

They shouted their thanksgiving to the LORD: "O LORD, there is no God like You! You fight for your people! You rescue them! You beat the king and lead us away! Your love never fails!"

How happy the people of Israel were that all their troubles were over. But were their troubles really over? Yes, they were far away from that mean king... but now they were in the wilderness, surrounded by all these rocks and weeds! Where would they get food?

Now the people weren't so happy anymore. Now they were... well, how would YOU feel if you were out in the hot, dry wilderness with no food in sight?

How would you feel?

The people were scared and upset...VERY UPSET! They didn't know what to do and they forgot about the ONE who was with them and COULD take care of them, even out in that wilderness--the LORD!

They forgot how good the LORD had been to them already. They forgot that the LORD always keeps His promises. And, they forgot how mighty the LORD is. He could always take care of their needs!

And because they forgot, they began to grumble to Moses and his brother, Aaron. "It would have been better for the LORD to let us die working for the mean king in Egypt! At least in Egypt we sat by pots of meat and ate our fill of bread!! Now we're going to die out here in this wilderness surrounded by nothing but these rocks and weeds!" they exclaimed.

Were they right? Had the LORD brought them out into the wilderness to die?

What do you think?

Of course, not! The LORD had brought them out there in that dry wilderness to grow their trust in Him. He had brought them out there to show how great He was. He had brought them out there to lead them home.

The LORD is always faithful to His people, through and through. They could trust Him to take care of them. He wouldn't let them die! He knew exactly what they needed, and He would give it to them.

The LORD told Moses: "Gather the people together and tell them that I am about to rain bread from heaven...enough to feed EVERYONE! Tell the people to go out every day and gather what they need for the day. On the day before Sabbath worship day, have them gather extra bread. Then they can rest and worship Me on the worship day, instead of gathering food," the LORD said.

So, Moses got all the people together, and told them: "The LORD has heard you grumble to us about food. He wants you to know that you're really grumbling against Him. You are acting like He isn't faithful to you. Now He's going to show you yet again how faithful He is. He's going to give you meat to eat at night and bread to eat in the morning. He freed you from Egypt, and He will keep on taking care of you," Moses promised them.

But weren't there just weeds and rocks around? How could the LORD provide meat and bread for all those thousands and thousands of people with hungry, grumbling tummies for even just one meal, let alone every morning and every night over and over and over again?! How would He do it?

Soon the people saw. That evening the air was suddenly filled with a loud, flapping noise. What could it be?

What do you think made that noise?

The people looked up and saw the sky filled with more quail birds than you could count! Thousands and thousands of them!

That great flock of birds landed all over the camp until it was covered in them. Here was the meat the LORD promised to give them!

The people gladly took the birds and roasted them. How they enjoyed that tasty meat that night! The LORD had been faithful to His promises that evening. Everyone went to bed with a full belly that night!

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson 1 Listening Assignment:
