Get It



Order the **Praise Factory Tour: Extended Version** (or download it from the website in the Getting Started with Hide 'n' Seek Kids section). It is going to be your easiest, most visual way to learn about this curriculum. Order/download the **Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum (ESV/NIV)** and the **Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids books (Small Format/Large Format pictures)** resources.

Tour It....Three Times

1

1. Read through the whole Praise Factory Tour: Extended Version book once.

Learn how each curriculum in the Praise Factory family is related to each other. Pay special attention to the section on Hide 'n' Seek Kids.


2. Go back and read through just the section on Hide 'n' Seek Kids in the Tour book again.

3. Now go back and read the Hide 'n' Seek section of the Tour book a third time, only this time, get out your two resource books (Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum and Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids books) and follow along.

This will help you see how the curriculum flows and where to find each of the resources visualized in the Tour Book.

Rip It Up



The **Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids book** is meant to be taken apart. These will be made into your visual aids and storyboard pictures used in each lesson.

You May Want to Second It



The **Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum book** contains resources you will probably want to photocopy--such as, the lesson plans, the crafts/take home sheets, and the music for the songs. **For this reason, you might want to print out a second copy (from online) or buy a second copy of the book.** This will allow you to take apart one copy for easy photocopying and still have another one intact for reference. Or, you can photocopy a copy from your original and keep that on hand.

Choose It



Choose how you want to use the curriculum resources with your kids and your setting. There is a questionnaire and other resources in the Getting Started section of the praisefactory.org website that can help you make the best custom fit for your situation. You may want to follow the curriculum as written and use them all. Or, you may want to pick and choose. Do what is best for your situation.

Prepare It and Protect It



Cut out and laminate the Big Question Box resources (Big Question and Answer; Bible Verse; and, Listening Assignment signs) as well as the storyboard pictures from the **Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids book**. Stick velcro on the back of the storyboard pictures to get them ready to be used on the storyboard and in the Story Review games. **More information about making storyboard pictures can be found in Appendix E of the Core Curriculum books.**

Download It

Make It... Before You Get Started



There are a few more resources that Hide 'n' Seek Kids uses that you will need to make before you use the curriculum. You need to purchase/make a **Big Question Box**; a **HSK "Bible" folder**; and a **flannelgraph storyboard**. Directions for making these are found in the **back of the Core Curriculum books in Appendix E**.

Are You Game?



There is one more set of resources you will be glad you made ahead of time: the games! Hide 'n' Seek Kids is a very active curriculum, with a number of different games suggested for each lesson. The good news is that they are used in a rotation throughout the curriculum. That means, once you make these games, you store them and use them over and over (and for years to come!).

While you only need to make whatever games you choose to use with each lesson, **I strongly recommend that you make all the games before you start using the curriculum**. Get the prep work over with at the beginning and coast your way through years of enjoyment!

Store them in ziploc bags or baskets and pull them out when needed. So simple! Your teachers will love how easy it is to have an engaging learning session with so little work for them to do! Happy teachers are more likely to be repeat teachers! **A full list of the games and the supplies needed to make them can be found in the back of the Core Curriculum books in Appendix B with the instructions for all the games.**

Session Prep



Prepare the curriculum for your teachers. Largely, this will mean making copies of the lesson plan, the crafts and take home sheets...especially if you have already assembled the games. We give the teachers a **basket of curriculum and materials they will use to teach the class each session**. This has worked very well for us.

Don't Ignore It, Store It!



This is a curriculum that keeps on giving, year after year. If you do a good job of storing the curriculum, it will serve your church well and at little cost for many years. We store the resources for each unit in **manilla envelopes and magazine storage boxes**.

About the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Hide 'n' Seek Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?



There are five, different resources included in this book:

1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 5 lessons for each unit.

2. The Storyboard Picture Key--a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labelled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labelled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.


3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.

4. The pictures, themselves. Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)

5. Directions for making the Hide 'n' Seek Kids "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.)

(Directions for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**)

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Hide 'n' Seek Kids is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labelled by unit. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for at home use.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard pictures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
3. Practice telling story with the pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary to fit your allotted time.

During your presentation:

1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

“Our story is called: The Case of the Wild and Wonderful Words. Here is your listening assignment...”

Read from Detective Dan’s Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan’s Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Who spoke the wild and wonderful words?
2. What good things were made when he did?

Detective Dan’s Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible verse is Genesis 1:1,31: “In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth...God saw everything that He had made, and behold, it was very good.”

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. What were some of the things that God created in the beginning?
2. What was so very good about everything He made?

Detective Dan’s Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found four clues, but one of them is NOT in the story.

They are: A star; a bird; a plant; and a car.

Hold up each of the four pictures for the children to see as you identify them. Better yet, put them up on your flannelgraph board, off to one side.

I need to know:

1. Which three pictures belong in the story and which one does not?
2. What did God use to make these things?

Detective Dan’s Lesson #4 Listening Assignment:

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. What special earth creature did God make in the beginning to know Him and praise Him more than all the others?
2. What is something they could praise God for being like as they looked at all He created?

Detective Dan’s Lesson #5 Listening Assignment:

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. Did God’s beautiful world stay as perfect as it was when He first made it?
2. What did God send Jesus to do when bad things came into the world?

Read the questions, THEN SAY,

“Ok, Hide ‘n’ Seekers! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan’s questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions.”

"The Case of the Wild and Wonderful Words" Genesis 1-2

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Always feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply, black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical order before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Long, long ago, there was only God.

Back then--just as right now-- God was very GLORIOUS! That means God was all good, and beautiful, and loving, and powerful, and everything that is perfectly wonderful.

And even though there was only God...He was (SB1) very happy.

Can you show me your happiest face? God was even happier than that!

God... this Glorious, Happy God... had a (SB2) big plan to do something gloriously wonderful....to MAKE something gloriously wonderful.

What could God's plan be? What would He make? Let's see...

What do you think God is going to make?

All around was (SB3) darkness, then God said, "(SB4) Come, light!" And POP! Out came shiny, bright light.

Don't you love the light? I do. Can you make a shimmery bright light by wiggling your fingers with me?

"This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Then God said, "Come, dry land!" And POP! (SB5) Out came the land from the cool, splashy water. There were (SB6) tall mountains, (SB7) and deep valleys, and lots of flat land, too.

Stretch up high and make tall mountains with your arms.

"This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Then God said, "Come, green plants!" And POP! Out came (SB8) tickly, green grasses, sweet-smelling flowers and (SB9A,SB9B) big, tall trees.

Can you pretend your feet are tickled on the bottom by grass?

"This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

Then God said, "Come sun, moon, and stars!" And POP! Out came (SB10) the bright sun, (SB11) the softly glowing moon, and the twinkling stars.

Can you make your arms into a big, round sun?

"This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Then God said, "Come, fish! Come, birds!" And POP! (SB12) Fish wriggled and jumped in the water. (SB13) Birds swooped and soared in the skies.

Can you make a fishy noise: blub, blub, blub? Can you flap your arms like a bird?

"This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Then God said, "Come, animals!" And POP! (SB14) Bears growled.

Can you growl like a bear?

(SB15) Dogs wagged their tails and barked. (SB16) Bunnies wiggled their noses and hopped around.

Can you bark like a dog? Can you wiggle your nose and hop like a bunny?

(SB17) Kangaroos went bounce, bounce, bounce, all around! (SB18) Lizards slithered along the ground.

Can you bounce like a kangaroo? Can you slither like a lizard?

God made (SB19. SB20) many other creatures, too... more than you can count! "This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."

What did God say it was? Can you say it with me? "This is GOOD!"

Last of all, God made (SB21) a man and a woman.

God put something special inside their bodies that wasn't inside ANYTHING ELSE that He made on earth. Do you know what it was? He put a (SB22) spirit--a special HEART-- inside their bodies so they could know and love Him.

The man and the woman were very, very happy. They knew God and loved Him. They loved each other, too. They delighted in all the wonderful things God made.

Can you show me your happiest face?

*Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in **bold**, optional interaction cues in italics)*

God looked at everything He made, and said, “This is good. This is all VERY GOOD.” It is ALL just what I had planned. It is ALL gloriously wonderful.”

What did God say it was this time? Can you say it with me? “This is VERY GOOD!”

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:**1. Who spoke the wild and wonderful words?**

God did.

2. What good things were made when he did?

God made everything in the heavens and the earth... even us! He just spoke and they came to be.

For You and Me:

We can look all around us and see some of the many good things God made. He wants us to learn about them and enjoy them. And do you know what else He wants to happen as we look at what He's made? He wants us to come to know Him better, too. We can ask Him to help us. He delights to do this!

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:**Our Bible Verse is: Genesis 1:1,31**

"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth...God saw everything that He had made, and behold, it was very good."

1. What were some of the things that God created in the beginning?

Night and day; stars and the planets; the earth; the fish in the seas and the birds in the skies; the animals and us!

2. What was so very good about everything He made?

Everything God made was very good. It had no bad in it. He made it perfect for all His good plans.

For You and Me:

What are some of your favorite things that God made? What makes them so special? Each thing God made has its own, special beauty. Each thing is amazing in its own way. God made people the most amazing of all! He made us with a special heart (a spirit) so that we could know more about Him as we look at all the good things He made. Ask God to help you know more of Him as you look at His creations! He loves to help us do this!

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found four clues, but one of them is NOT in the story. They are: A star; a bird; a plant; and a car.

I need to know:

1. Which three pictures belong in the story and which one does not? The car does not belong.**2. What did God use to make these things?**

God only used His powerful word. He spoke and they came to be. That's it!

For You and Me:

God used just His powerful words to create everything in heaven and earth. And did you know His word is still powerful today? Did you know the Bible is also God's Word--written down for us. When we learn God's Word, the Bible, He can work in our hearts and help us to know Him. Ask Him to do this in you!

Detective Dan's Lesson #4 Listening Assignment:**1. What special earth creature did God make in the beginning to know Him and praise Him more than all the others?**

People.

2. What is something they could praise God for being like as they looked at all He created?

They could praise Him for being so beautiful, powerful and great.

For You and Me:

Those first people had so much to praise God for, as they looked at all He created. So do we. We can look at the mountains and see a little bit of how mighty God must be. We can look at a sunset and understand a bit of how beautiful God is. We can look up at the millions of stars in the sky and see how great God must be. God has given us so much to praise Him for!

Detective Dan's Lesson #5 Listening Assignment:

1. Did God's beautiful world stayed as perfect as it was when He first made it? Sadly, it did not! Bad things came through sin when we disobeyed God.

2. What did God send Jesus to do when bad things came into the world?

God sent Jesus to be our Savior. He came to take the punishment for the sins of God's people, so they could know God and be His people forever.

For You and Me:

We all disobey God. We need a Savior. Jesus can save us from our sins and make us God's people, too, when we repent of our sins and trust in Him as our Savior. God loves to help us do this!

The Gospel (story wrap-up if NOT using Listening Assignments)**Our Bible Truth is:****Can You Tell Me What God Made?****God Made All Things Good!**

How wonderful life would have been, if people had kept on loving God as He created them to! How wonderful life would have been, if nothing bad had ever come into God's good world! But bad things DID come into God's good world. People have not kept on loving or obeying God, have they? Why, even you and me, we disobey God. We do bad things. And now, we all deserve God's punishment. This is such sad news.

But there's good news, too. God loved us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to suffer and die on the cross, taking all the punishment for the sins of God's people. On Day Three, Jesus rose from the dead, proving He had really beaten sin and death for them. Now, God will forgive all who turn away from their sins, and trust in Jesus as their Savior. That's how we can become God's people. If we do, what a wonderful beginning that will be! We will get to know God in our hearts, now. And one day, we will get to live with Him in heaven forever.

About the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Hide 'n' Seek Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?



There are five, different resources included in this book:

1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 5 lessons for each unit.

2. The Storyboard Picture Key--a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labelled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labelled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.


3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.

4. The pictures, themselves. Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)

5. Directions for making the Hide 'n' Seek Kids "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.)

(**Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**)

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Hide 'n' Seek Kids is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labelled by unit. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for at home use.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard pictures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
3. Practice telling story with the pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary to fit your allotted time.

During your presentation:

1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Always feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply, black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical order before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Adam and Eve (SB1) were the first people. God, Himself, made them in the very beginning, long ago. He gave them a wonderful home in a beautiful garden.

God (SB2) loved Adam and Eve. Adam and Eve loved God. And everything was happy, happy, happy!

Can you show me your happiest face?

But then something very bad happened...

God's enemy, (SB3) Satan, came. He wanted to spoil God's perfectly wonderful world (SB4). He especially wanted to spoil the perfect happiness and wonderful friendship that God had with people (SB5). So he tricked Adam and Eve.

Satan used (SB6) the serpent to trick Adam and Eve into wanting to disobey God... and they did! They took (SB7) fruit from the one tree in their garden home God had told them NOT to eat... and they (SB8) ate it!

Now everything was sad, sad, sad! Sin (SB9) had come into God's good world!

Why? Because Jesus had really done it! He had saved God's people. He had beaten Satan, just like God said He would! Yay!

Let's jump up and down and cheer, "Yay!" for Jesus beating Satan!

Because of Jesus, God's people would get to know and love God in their hearts while they live here on earth. And one day, they (SB18) will go to live with God forever! And that will be best of all!

What do God's people get to do? They get to know God in their hearts here on earth now. And one day, when they die, they will go to live with Him forever! What will that be like? Happy, happy, happy! Can you make your happiest face again?

Who are God's people? They are everyone who will turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. We can be God's people, too, if we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Ask God to help you. He loves to answer this prayer!

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:**1. What made this day so terrible?**

This was the day that bad things came to God's good world, when Adam and Eve disobeyed God. Now all people would know sin and death.

2. What did God promise to do to rescue us from what happened that day? God promised to send Jesus to beat Satan and be our Savior.

For You and Me:

This was a terrible day for all of us. We are all in Adam and Eve's family and we all disobey God, just like they did. How good it is that God sent Jesus to rescue us! He will save us from our sins when turn away from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior.

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible verse is Romans 5:12: "Sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned."

As you listen to the story, see if you can figure out:

1. How did sin come into the world? Satan tempted Adam and Eve and they disobeyed God. That's how sin came into the world.

2. How did their sin hurt all of God's good world?

Sad things, sickness and death came into God's good world, when Adam and Eve disobeyed God long ago. They still hurt everything in our world even today.

For You and Me:

We are all in Adam and Eve's family. We all disobey God just like they did. How good it is that God sent Jesus to rescue us! He will save us from our sins when we trust in Jesus as our Savior and live for Him.

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found four clues, but one of them is NOT in the story. They are: a serpent; Jesus; fruit; and, ice cream.

1. Which of these things was not in our story today? Ice cream.

2. How were the other three things important in our story? Satan used the serpent to trick Adam and Eve into listening to him. His trick worked. They disobeyed God and ate the fruit that God had told them not to eat. Sin had come into God's good world. But that wasn't the end of the story. God promised to send them a Savior--Jesus--to beat Satan and rescue us from our sins.

For You and Me:

Like Adam and Eve, we too often choose to disobey God. Like them, we deserve God's punishment. Yet, God has sent Jesus and He can be our Savior. We can ask Him to help us turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus and be forgiven!

1. Who was sorry for their sins and looked for hope in God? Adam and Eve.

What a terrible thing happened when Adam and Eve sinned! How sad and lonely they were when they lost the special closeness they had with God!

But how kind God was to promise to one day send Jesus to destroy Satan and to save sinners like them and us from our sins! Jesus came and took the punishment for the sins of God's people on the cross. On the third day, He rose from the dead, proving He had really beaten sin and death.

We can become God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Ask Him to help you. He loves to answer this prayer.

About the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Hide 'n' Seek Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?



There are five, different resources included in this book:

1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 5 lessons for each unit.

2. The Storyboard Picture Key--a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labelled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labelled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.


3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.

4. The pictures, themselves. Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)

5. Directions for making the Hide 'n' Seek Kids "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.)

(**Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**)

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Hide 'n' Seek Kids is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labelled by unit. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for at home use.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard pictures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
3. Practice telling story with the pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary to fit your allotted time.

During your presentation:

1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Always feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply, black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical order before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1) "Get ready! God is coming to meet with you at the big mountain," Moses told (SB2) the people. "He is giving you His laws. He wants you to be His people," he said.

Can you stretch your arms up high and touch your fingers together to make the shape of a big mountain?

"Yay! Yay!" the people said. "We will get ready!"

Say, "Yay" with the people!

The people (SB3) got ready. They put (SB4) stones all around the bottom of the big mountain. No one was to go up on it. They washed themselves; and then, they went to the bottom of the big mountain and waited.

When we wait, we sit quietly and very still. Can you do that?

The people saw the thick, grey smoke and the great, blazing fire, and the bright, crashing lightning. They heard the loud, earth-shaking thunder and the loud, blasting trumpet.

They listened to God's big, big, BIG voice as He gave them His Ten, Big Rules... and they were (SB21) TERRIFIED! They moved back from the mountain and trembled with fear!

Can you show me a very scared face? Can you shake your body like you were trembling from being so scared?

How amazing was the LORD! He was so great! He was so good! He was the one, true, living God! The people could see that!

And oh, how very different they were from Him! They weren't great like He was! They were just people... little, weak people! And they weren't good like Him, either. They had sin in their hearts. They disobeyed God and His good ways.

He promised to send His Son, Jesus, to save them from their sins, if they would turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. This promise is for us, too. God will forgive our sins and save us through Jesus, when turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

About the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Hide 'n' Seek Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?



There are five, different resources included in this book:

1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 5 lessons for each unit.

2. The Storyboard Picture Key--a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labelled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labelled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.


3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.

4. The pictures, themselves. Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)

5. Directions for making the Hide 'n' Seek Kids "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.)

(**Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**)

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Hide 'n' Seek Kids is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labelled by unit. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for at home use.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Always feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply, black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical order before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Saul (SB1) worked hard to keep rules. Not just God's rule, but lots of extra rules that weren't in the Bible. He thought keeping all those extra rules was how to please God. Rule-keepers like Saul were called Pharisees.

Saul tried to please God, but...he HATED Jesus (SB2)! Saul didn't think Jesus was God's Son. He thought Jesus was just a fake!

And Saul didn't just hate Jesus, he also (SB3) hated the people who believed in Jesus. (People who believed in Jesus were--and still are--called Christians.)

"(SB5) Shh! Be quiet!" Saul ordered the Christians. "Jesus ISN'T God's Son, the Savior!" he told them.

"I will hurt you and put you in jail, if you say Jesus is God's Son, the Savior," Saul warned the Christians... and many times (SB6) he DID just that! Saul hated Christians in Jerusalem so much that hurting them and putting them in jail wasn't enough for him. Saul even wanted them dead! Oh, Saul!

Can you make a really mad, hateful face? That's how Saul felt about Jesus and the Christians!

But Saul didn't stop there. He didn't want to just get rid of the Christians in Jerusalem. He wanted to get rid of them EVERYWHERE. So one day, (SB7) Saul went to talk to the (SB8) leaders at the Temple. They also wanted to get rid of the Christians. Saul asked them for a special job.

"Send me to the big city of Damascus," Saul asked them. "There are lots of Christians there who are telling people about Jesus. We have to stop them. Give me some soldiers and I will go and find those Christians. We will arrest them and put them in jail," Saul told the leaders.

The leaders agreed. Saul and the soldiers set off for Damascus. He was going to stop those Christians who said Jesus was God's Son. Jesus was just a fake! Saul was sure of that. He would make those believers be quiet, once and for all!

But Saul was wrong! Jesus really WAS God's Son! Jesus saw everything Saul was doing. He knew Saul hated Him. He knew Saul hated the people who believed in Him, too. Jesus knew that Saul was hurting them. But soon, all of this would change. Who would change things? Why Jesus, Himself!

Saul and the soldiers were almost to Damascus when suddenly (SB9) a bright light shone around Saul. Saul (SB10) fell down to the ground when he saw the light.

This was no regular light. It was coming from SOMEBODY in HEAVEN! Can you guess who it was? It was (SB11) JESUS, all bright and shiny with God's wonderful glory! Wow!

Then out of that bright light, Saul and the soldiers heard Jesus speak, "Saul! Saul! Stop hating Me! Stop hurting My people!"

"Who are you?" Saul asked, shaking with fear.

Can you make a scared face?

"I am Jesus, God's Son, the Savior!" Jesus told him.

Uh oh! Saul was in big trouble! He had been WRONG! Jesus really WAS God's Son! The Christians had been right.. and he had been hurting them--God's dearly loved people! What would Jesus do? Would Jesus hate Saul? Would Jesus hurt Saul, just like Saul had hurt the Christians?

No, Jesus would not! Jesus loved (SB12) Saul. Jesus chose to forgive Saul, even though Saul had done all those bad things! Jesus wasn't going to hurt or hate Saul. He was going to SAVE Saul. He had (SB13) a wonderful plan to use Saul to tell others how they could be saved, too.

(SB14) Saul thought about Jesus. And as he thought about Jesus, God's Holy Spirit started working in his heart. He helped Saul see that he was a sinner. Saul couldn't please God by being good enough on his own. He helped Saul see that only Jesus' perfect life could please God. Only Jesus' perfect life could pay for his sins against God and bring God's forgiveness.

The Holy Spirit helped Saul want to stop disobeying God (the Bible calls that "repenting"). He helped Saul trust in Jesus as his Savior. Isn't God so kind even to His enemies, even terrible enemies like Saul?

Saul joyfully accepted these gifts of repentance and faith from God. Now Saul knew Jesus was God's Son, the Savior of God's people! Saul was forgiven! He had become one of God's dearly loved people!

Saul was a changed man! Now he wanted to love Jesus and live his life for Him! He was such a changed man, that God even gave him a new name: Paul!

Let's cheer and praise God for being so kind to sinners, like Saul and even like us! Yay!

"I'm sorry for hating You, Jesus," Paul prayed. "I'm sorry for hurting the people who believed in You. Now I believe in You, too. Thank You for not hating me. Thank You for forgiving me and making me one of God's people!" Paul said.

How happy Paul was that Jesus forgave people like him--people who had done very bad things. Paul was so happy that he couldn't keep this good news to himself! So, what do you know Paul did next?

Can you remember what Jesus had planned for Saul to do?

Paul started telling others (SB15) the good news of Jesus: "Hey, everybody! I was wrong! Jesus IS God's Son, the Savior! Believe in Him! And oh, how WONDERFUL is His love! It is more than I could ever deserve... that He would love and forgive even me!" Paul told them. "You can know God's love, too! Yes! God will forgive you, when you turn away from disobeying Him and trust in Jesus as your Savior! Come, repent and believe in Jesus!" he exclaimed.

(SB16) God's Holy Spirit worked in the hearts of many as Saul spoke. They put their trust in Jesus and were saved, just as God had planned! Isn't that amazing! God would use Saul to tell others about Jesus!

However, you can go online to the Hide "n' Seek Kids curriculum and there is a pdf of a bigger version of these covers that will actually fit the size of this HSK "Bible" Folder.

Directions

1. Lay out poster board with long side along the bottom.
2. Fold in 2" on each side.
3. Take packing tape and tape the folded in 2" flaps to the main section of the posterboard, all the way down.
3. Fold up 8 1/2" on the bottom of the poster board.
4. Use packing tape to tape this flap in place, all the way down.
5. Take scissors and snip through the tape where the flap is attached to the folder. This will give you a bit more room in the folder.
6. Fold the poster board in the middle to make the center fold.
7. Cut out the Bible Cover Pictures. If possible, laminate these. They will last longer.
- 8.. Glue the two cover pieces to the outside of the folder.

Making a Flannelgraph Storyboard

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

While you may decide to use sticky tac and stick your storyboard pictures to a white board, it is very easy to make a flannelgraph board. The advantage to the flannelgraph board is that the pictures stick very easily and there is no messing with the sticky-tac.

Supplies

Large Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a 36" x 48" foamboard or corkboard (We actually use a far bigger canvas and attach it to the wall) A science project board with the two sides that fold out makes a good 36" x 48" board.

Small Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a 24" x 36" (to 36" x 48)" board

Large piece of neutral-colored felt to cover your board with extra to overlap over to the back, if desired.

Glue gun and glue sticks

Directions

1. Center felt on front side of board. Turn over. Secure in place with glue.

Making Durable Storyboard Pictures

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

Whether you purchase the Hide 'n' Seek Kids storyboard pictures from Amazon or print them off the website (included in the Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids book), you will want to find some way to make them more durable. They are used not only as a part of telling the story, but are integral in the story review games. Here's how we make ours durable enough to be used over and over again.

Supplies

Hide 'n' Seek Kids Visual Aids book (purchased or downloaded)

White cardstock or printer paper (if downloading pictures)

Sticky-back velcro, circles or cut pieces; or sticky tac putty

Laminator or Self-laminating sheets

Sturdy Sheet Protectors, preferably the "Secure Top" kind, like offered by Avery

Flannelgraph pictures for the Bible stories found at www.praisefactory.org with each unit's resources.

Directions

1. Purchase from Amazon or download and print out the storyboard figures.

2. Cut out flannelgraph figures.

3. Laminate the figures.

Special tip: When laminating the big background pictures that are two (and sometimes even three or four) pieces put together, leave a small gap between the two pieces before laminating together. This small space acts like a hinge and allows you to fold up pictures without hurting them into a manilla envelope that fits 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper along with all of the smaller, regular-sized storyboard pictures.

4. If using a flannelgraph board: Stick a piece of sticky backed velcro (ROUGH SIDE) onto the back of each figure. If using sticky tack and whiteboard: simply stick a small amount of sticky tack on the back of a picture when using it. Remove and store sticky tack in airtight container.

Big Question Box/Briefcase

What You Want

The Big Question Briefcase is a briefcase or other container with these characteristics:

- Ideally, this should be around 17" x 12", but needs to be at least big enough to fit a 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper inside it.
- Have various pockets to put these sheets in
- Is attractive or curious looking to preschoolers
- Not necessary, but extremely fun, if it has a combination lock

Finding a Briefcase:

You can certainly buy one new, but you always may find a used one at a thrift shop. Or, someone may have one they want to donate. We use one that stores valuables in it and is the 17" x 12" size. Very durable and has the lock feature that the kids love.

You also can move away from the briefcase idea and use a little trunk or other box for your substitute briefcase. Just change the name to the Big Question Box, if you use a box instead. A boot box or the cardboard box that 10 reams of copy paper comes in is a great size, if you are using a box.

If you use a box, but want a lock-like feature, that's easy to do. Simply cut "straps" out of felt or vinyl and glue in place to the top and bottom sides of the box on one side, with the top strap overlapping the bottom straps. Add velcro to the top and bottom pieces so that they meet and fasten. Make back "hinges" for the box with the felt/vinyl straps, too. Or, you can simply add a belt around the box that has to be unfastened before the box can be opened.

Here are some suggestions for decorating a box or even the outside of your briefcase to make it appealing.

Supplies

Your box/briefcase

Plain white contact paper or white cardstock

Colorful wrapping paper

Glitter glue

Markers

Sequins, fake jewels, buttons, rick rack, etc.

Other decorating supplies

Stickers

Glue

Clear packing tape

Directions

1. If you are using a box that has wording on it, you will first need to make plain surfaces for decorating and a hinge for the lid. Stick the white contact paper or white cardstock to each side of the box. On the other hand, you can also use colorful wrapping paper. Then, make a lid by sticking the clear packing tape along one long side of the box, attaching the lid to the box.

2. Use the craft decorating supplies to decorate the box. If desired, you can put a big question mark on top of the box, but remember that you are working with two and three year olds: the question mark symbol is not very meaningful to them yet.
