How Are They Used?

What Do They Include?





1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truth, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 3 lessons for each Bible Truth.



- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

"Our story is called: The Case of the Day of Blazing Brightness. Here is your listening assignment." Read from Detective Dan's Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

I need to find out:

- 1. What was the special celebration on the Day of Blazing Brightness?
- 2. What caused the Blazing Brightness? What did it mean?

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is John 4:24, ESV

"God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth."

I need to find out:

- 1. What did God do on the Day of Blazing Brightness that showed the people He had come to meet with them in the new, worship house?
- 2. What did the people do that showed they wanted to worship the LORD in spirit and truth?

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but only 4 of them are in the story.

Our six clues were: gold; popcorn; a special box; a trumpet; a man named Hiram, and a ball. Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

I need to figure out:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don't?
- 2. Who praised the LORD on the Day of Blazing Brightness? What did they ask Him to do?

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

Answers to questions; the gospel; and, ACTS prayer are included with the story text.

The Case of the Day of Blazing Brightness 1 Kings 6:8; 2 Chronicles 3-4,6-7

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1) King David lived in a big, beautiful house made of the finest wood, but the (Take off BG3) Ark of the Covenant (the special, golden box where God would meet with His people) lived in a tent.

"Why should I live in a palace and God meet with us in just a tent! I want to (SB2) build a fine, worship house for the LORD," he told Nathan, God's messenger.

But (SB3) Nathan told King David, "The LORD says, "No, I don't want you to build the Worship House for Me. I want your son, Solomon to build it. He will build it when he becomes king, after you die."

David obeyed the LORD. He did not build the Worship House; BUT, he did do something to get ready for it.

Can you guess what he did?

King David saved up (SB4) lots of golden money. He would make sure that Solomon could buy everything needed to build the beautiful Worship House when he became king.

At last, David died and (SB5) Solomon became king. Solomon didn't forget that he was to build the Worship House for the LORD. He went right to work!

Solomon hired thousands of workers. He sent some of them to Lebanon, a nearby country where there were the best building supplies. "Go to the (SB6) forests of Lebanon and cut down lots of the tall, cedar trees. (SB7) Float them down the sea and bring them here to Jerusalem," the king told the workers.

Other workers he sent deep down to the stone quarries. "Go down to the (SB8) quarries and cut huge blocks of the beautiful, white, limestone. Drag them up here," Solomon told others. "This Worship House will be made from the best wood and the most beautiful stone!" he exclaimed.

The men worked hard. They brought all (SB9) the wood and the (SB10) stone to Jerusalem. Now it was time to build!

King Solomon searched for the best builder he could find. He chose (SB11) a man named Hiram. "Hiram, take all of this wood and limestone. Build the best Worship House you can. My workers will help you. (SB12) Carve it with beautiful designs. Decorate it will fine cloth. Cover it with gold, too. Nothing is too good for the LORD's Worship House. It will be His Temple," Solomon told him.

Hiram and the workers (SB13) worked for a long, long time. They used the wood and the stones, the fine cloth, and the gold to make the Temple. The LORD helped Hiram make it just right.

Hiram used the white limestone on (SB14) the outside of the Worship House. It glistened in the sun. It reminded the people of the LORD's glory--the beautiful shiny, brightness that shines out from His Spirit.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

Hiram used the wood (SB15) inside the Temple to make walls. He carved angels and trees, fruits and flowers into it. He covered the floors and walls in gold and there were lots of beautiful, sparkly jewels. It would remind the people of the perfect Garden God had put people in, way back at the beginning of the world-the place where people had enjoyed special closeness with God before them disobeyed Him.

Best of all was the little room where the Ark of the Covenant would be. God would meet with His people there. It was hidden behind tall curtains decorated with angels and trees. Everything in the room was covered in gold! When Hiram finished everything, it was time to gather the people.

At last the Worship House was done. Can you guess what it was time for now?

Can you guess?

It was time for everyone to worship the LORD!

King Solomon sent (SB16) messages to the people, far and wide: "The Worship House is done. It's time to get ready to worship the LORD!"

"People, bring your worship gifts of sheep and goats and cows. Come and gather with me at the great altar outside the Worship House," the king told them. "Come, priests and Levites! You are the only ones allowed to carry the Ark and other special, worship things into the new, Worship House. It's time to put them in," the king ordered. "Come, worship leaders, get ready to lead us! Wash yourselves and put on your special, white, worship clothes. Get your musical instruments ready to play," Solomon told them. "You're going to lead us all in worshipping the LORD."

Everyone did what King Solomon told them to do. " (SB17) Maa, maa, baa, baa, moo, moo!" (SB18) The people came with thousands and thousands of worship gifts of sheep and goats and cows. They gathered together with the (SB19, SB20) King by the altar outside of the Temple, the new Worship House.

"(SB21) Wash, wash, scrub, scrub," the worship leaders washed themselves and put on their special, white clothes. They (SB22) got out their musical instruments and tuned them up. There were trumpets and cymbals and harps and lyres. Everyone waited by the altar. What were they waiting for?

Can you guess?

It was the Ark and all of the other special worship things! And here they came: (SB23) the priests and Levites carrying them all from the tent and to the new Worship House. And as they came, King Solomon and the people began to offer their worship gifts to the LORD.

Everyone watched as (SB24) the Levites and priests set all the golden, worship things in place in the big room. Then last of all, they put the Ark beneath the cherubim in its special, little room. As the priests and Levites came out of the Temple, the musicians picked up their instruments and began to play and sing, "(SB25) Praise to the LORD, for He is good, for His love goes on and on and on." How happy they were that the Ark of the Covenant had come home to the new Worship House!

King Solomon and the people kept offering thieir worship gifts (SB26). Higher and higher and higher the worship gifts piled up. Oh, how everyone wanted to honor the LORD!

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italicss

Then, shhhh! Everyone got very quiet as King Solomon led them in a prayer to the LORD.

(SB27) Solomon spread out his hands before God and prayed: "LORD, there is no God like you, in heaven or on earth. You are too great to live in this Worship House. The whole world isn't even big enough to hold You," the king prayed. "But please, LORD, make this a special, Worship House where all people can come and pray to You, and praise You, and bring their worship gifts to You. Please have Your special presence dwell here. Accept our prayers," he prayed.

The LORD heard King Solomon's prayer. He WOULD have His special presence dwell there at the Worship House. He WOULD listen to their prayers and receive their praises and worship gifts!

But how would King Solomon and the people know that the LORD answered their prayer? After all, the LORD is a Spirit. They could not see Him with their eyes. They could not touch Him with their hands. How would they know if His special presence had really come to dwell in the new Worship House?

Can you guess what the LORD would do?

King Solomon and the people did not have to wait long to find out. (SB28) Suddenly, there was a bright flash of light and a big wave of heat as the LORD sent a great fire down from heaven that whooshed down and burned up that huge pile of worship gifts on the altar. That was one, amazing "yes" answer to their prayers!

But that was not all. Next, the LORD did something even more amazing than that great fire from heaven. Something that would show the people FOR SURE that He can chosen the special, Worship House as His meeting place with them.

Can you guess what He did?

God showed the people some of His beautiful, shiny glory--the wonderful, shiny brightness that shines out from His Spirit.

Yes! King Solomon, the priests, Levites, worship leaders, and all the people watched (SB29) as God's beautiful glory came down from heaven like a great, sparkly cloud. It covered up the top of the whole Worship House. And inside, it filled (move SB29) so full that none of the worship leaders could even go in!

Now everyone really knew that the LORD had said "yes" to all of their prayers!

He had accepted all their worship gifts and showed them some of His glory. His presence would dwell in the worship house. He would meet with the people there.

Then, everyone including (SB30, SB31) the great, King Solomon, himself, fell down flat on his face and worshiped the LORD. They gave thanks to the LORD, saying, "Praise to the LORD, for He is good, for His love goes on and on and on."

And they stayed right there next to the Worship House for seven, whole days, (SB32) worshipping and celebrating with a big party.

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson 1 Listening Assignment:

- **1.** What was the special celebration on the Day of Blazing Brightness? The new Worship House was finished and ready to be used for worship.
- 2. What caused the Blazing Brightness? What did it mean? The blazing brightness was the glory of the LORD that came down from heaven and filled the special worship house. It was how the LORD showed the people that He would meet with them in the new Worship House.

For You and Me:

How wonderful it must have been to see the beautiful glory of the LORD's Spirit that day! But how more amazing it is that God's own Son, Jesus would come to earth to live among us, and to suffer and die for our sins! He can be our Savior, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior. Then, He will send the Holy Spirit to live inside our very hearts and meet with us, His dearly-loved people, there!

Detective Dan's Lesson 2 Listening Assignment: Our Bible Verse is John 4:24

"God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth."

- 1. What did God do on the Day of Blazing Brightness that showed He had come to meet with the people in the new Worship House? He let them see the blazing brightness from the glory of His Spirit as it came down and filled the new Worship House.
- 2. What did the people do that showed they wanted to worship the LORD in spirit and truth? They brought their worship gifts to the LORD. They sang praises to Him. They prayed to Him and bowed before Him.

For You and Me:

God wants us to worship Him in spirit and truth, too. How can we do that? We can sing praises to Him and pray to Him, like those people did long ago. Most of all, we can turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God can help us do this. Ask Him!

Detective Dan's Lesson 3 Listening Assignment:

Our six clues were: gold; popcorn; a special box; a trumpet; a man named Hiram, and a ball.

1. Which four belong in our story?

The gold; the special box; the trumpet; and, Hiram.

2. Who praised the LORD on the Day of Blazing Brightness? What did they ask Him to do? The King, the worship leaders and all the people praised the LORD. King Solomon asked the LORD to make the special, worship house the place where He would meet with them.

For You and Me:

Long ago, the people needed the special, worship house to meet with God, but no more! Jesus came and He made the way for us to meet with God and be His people without the special, worship house. Jesus paid for the sins of God's people when He suffered and died on the cross. He rose from the dead on the third day, showing He had done it! Now all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior, can be saved. They can know special closeness with God in their hearts by His Holy Spirit. And one day, they will go to live with Him in all His glory forever! God can help us become His people. Ask Him!

The Gospel (story wrap-up if NOT using Listening Assignments)

Our Bible Truth is:

Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else... He is a Glorious Spirit!

God is a glorious Spirit who we cannot see. But God sent Jesus, His Son to earth to be our Savior. He was still God, but now He was human, too. How amazing!

And what did Jesus have to do to be our Savior? He lived a perfect life, then He gave it up as He suffered and died on the cross. He took the punishment for sin that we deserve so we could be God's people. He was our special worship gift. The last one we would ever need. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, showing He had really beaten sin and death for us. Now all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior will be forgiven. They will enjoy wonderful special closeness with God as His people, now. And when they die, they will go to live in His glorious presence forever. God can help you become one of His people, too. Ask Him! He loves to do this!

Close in prayer.

- **C** God, many times we forget how great You are. We cannot see You and we act like You are not there. We forget to praise You. Please forgive us.

- S God, help us to tell others about You so they can know how great and awesome You are. Help us to know and love You truly from our hearts. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.



Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?
He's Not Like Anyone Else!
He Is a Glorious ????!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "What does God glory shine out from? It starts with an "s" and it rhymes with "hear it."

Can you guess? It's "spirit."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else! He Is a Glorious SPIRIT!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

God is a spirit, great and glorious. We cannot see God's spirit with our eyes or touch His Spirit with our hands. So how can we know what God's Spirit is like? God's Word, the Bible tells us! The Bible tells us of times, long ago, when God let people see some of His glory--the shiny brightness of His pure goodness and greatness. And, it tells us that God made each of us with a spirit a bit like His great and glorious Spirit so that we can know and love Him.

Best of all, God sent His Son, Jesus to earth, giving Him a body so He could be our Savior. Jesus showed us what God is like. He was fully God AND fully a man, all together in one! How amazing!

How Are They Used?










There are five, different resources included in this book:

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

"Our story is called: The Case of the Fight with Fire. Here is your listening assignment." Read from Detective Dan's Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

I need to know:

- 2. Who won the fight? How did He use fire to show He had won?

The Case of the Fight with Fire 1 Kings 18

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1) The LORD and the (SB2) people of Israel made big promises to each other.

The LORD (SB3) promised that He would always love them and take care of them. He would keep them safe and give them everything they needed to be happy. Best of all, He would give them Himself to know and enjoy forever.

The people of Israel promised the LORD something in return, too. Can you guess what that might be?

Can you guess?

They promised to (SB4) love the LORD.

Now, that might sound very simple at first. But the love the LORD wanted His people to have for Him was not a little, tiny love—like a love that wakes up in the morning and says "Good morning, LORD! I love you," but then forgets Him the rest of the day.

No, the kind of love the LORD wanted was a love that loved Him with their whole lives, through the whole day, in everything they did and said and even thought. It meant obeying (SB5) all of His good laws and worshipping Him as the One, True God. It meant obeying His good laws about loving others, too. So you see, this was a very BIG love that the LORD asked the people to promise Him... and they happily promised Him they would.

But it is one thing to make a promise and another thing to keep it, especially big promises like the LORD and the people of Israel made to each other. And while the LORD kept His promises to the people of Israel. the people did NOT.

They forgot Him as they lived each day. They (SB6) broke His good laws. They stopped worshipping Him as the One, True God and (SB7) turned to worship other, fake gods instead....especially the fake god that (SB8) their neighbors worshipped: a (SB9) fake god named Baal. And (SB10) their king--King Ahab--led the way.

Baal was supposed to be the god who gave people rain, good crops, and big families. Those were the three, big things that the people especially cared about then. Can you guess what the three things might be?

Can you guess?

There were (SB11) rain and big families and good food!

Now you might think of three OTHER things you especially care about, but back in those days there were no grocery stores or hospitals. You needed rain to grow your food and keep you and your animals alive. And since there weren't really doctors back then, getting sick was very scary. Rain, big families, and good crops meant LIFE to these people! Rain, big families and good food meant LIFE to these people! Who could want to worship Baal if he could give them that!

But what about the people of Israel? Didn't they need rain, big families, and good food to live, too? Yes, they did! But they didn't need to turn to Baal for these. Who SHOULD they have turned to instead?

Can you tell me?

They SHOULD have turned to the LORD. He had already made big promises to always love them and take care of them. Hadn't He always provided them with rain, big families, and good food in the past? Wouldn't He keep on giving these good gifts to them? Of course, He would! The LORD never breaks His promises!

But, the people of Israel chose to forget all of this. They chose to worship the fake god, Baal, instead. Their king,

This was sad news! This was BAD news! The people of Israel had turned away from the LORD. They had broken their promises to Him. What would the LORD do? Would He turn away from them and stop caring for them, as they deserved?

What do you think the LORD did?

The LORD COULD have done that, but He did not. He chose to go on loving them. He would bring them back to Him. He would show them in a mighty way that Baal was just a fake, and that He, the LORD, was the one, true God. And He would do it by stopping the very thing that Baal was supposed to be in charge of: the rain.

The LORD sent (SB12) His special messenger, Elijah, to tell King Ahab and the people what He was going to do.

"The LORD says: 'You have broken your promise to love Me," Elijah told them. ""You have chosen to worship Baal as giver of rain, big families, and good food, but he isn't. He is just a fake god. He is not the One True God. I am, as I am going to show you!" the LORD told the people.

"I am going to take away all the rain. I am going to take away all the good food from you...the food you need so you can have big families. And no matter how much anyone prays to Baal, there will be no more rain or good food until I say so. Then you will see that I, not Baal, am the One True God," the LORD warned the people through Elijah.

Those were big words. Could the LORD really do this? Could He really stop Baal's power? Everyone waited and watched.

What do you think happened?

Sure enough, day after day after day went by and there was no rain.

The (SB13) water in the streams dried up. The good food that should have grown in the fields, died. The big families and their animals grew hungry and thirsty. They took their worship gifts to Baal and prayed, "Oh, Baal, send us the rain we need to grow good food and feed our big families."

But for one, two, THREE whole years, no matter how much anyone prayed to Baal, there was no rain or good food. Oh, how sad the neighbors were! Oh, how sad the people of Israel were!

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

At last, the LORD knew the people had learned enough from their suffering. They were ready for the great showdown. The big fight with fire that would make it clear to them and their neighbors who really was the one, true God.

(SB14) Elijah went back to King Ahab with a new message: "The LORD says: 'For three years I've taken away your rain and good food. It has been hard to feed your big families. I did this because the people and you chose to stop worshipping Me and obeying My good laws. I wanted you to see that I am the one, true God, not Baal," the LORD said.

"I'm not done yet. There's more thing I want to do. Gather all of the people and all of the messengers of Baal on top of Mount Carmel. There, you will see who really is the One, True God," the LORD promised.

King Ahab obeyed. Up, up, up to the top of dry Mount Carmel went (SB15) Elijah, with King Ahab, the people of Israel, and (SB16) the messengers of Baal. It was time for the big showdown.

Elijah gathered them all together and said, "The time has come to see who is the One, True God. If it is Baal, follow him. If it is the LORD, follow Him."

"I am the only messenger of the LORD here, but Baal has (SB17) many messengers," Elijah told them. "We will each give a worship gift of a bull to our god. Baal's messengers will give Baal their worship gift; and I will give my worship gift to the LORD," Elijah explained.

"But we're going to make this a fight with fire between the LORD and Baal," Elijah said. "We won't light the wood under the worship gifts, like we usually do. We will leave that to the One, True God. We will ask Him to send down fire from heaven to burn up the worship offering," Elijah told them.

"This shouldn't be hard for Baal. He's the rain god. He can throw down one of his lightning bolts and set the worship gift on fire," Elijah said. "I will even let the messengers of Baal go first."

Everyone agreed. The messengers of Baal (SB18) took a bull and set it on top of some stones and firewood. Their worship offering was ready. They (SB19) began shouting their prayers to Baal: "O great Baal, show that you are the One, True God! Accept our worship gift! Send fire to burn it up!" they prayed.

What do you think happened?

Nothing happened at all. But Baal's messengers didn't give up. Next, they tried (SB20) shouting louder and dancing a worship dance to Baal. But still, nothing happened. On and on, all day, Baal's messengers tried many things; but still no fire came down.

At last they gave up. it was Elijah's turn. With (SB21) twelve, big stones, Elijah rebuilt the altar to the LORD. He put lots of wood. on it, and the bull on top of the wood. He had (SB22, SB23) men pour lots and lots of water on the everything to make it even harder to burn up.

Then (SB24) Elijah prayed to the LORD: "O LORD, let it be known today that You are the God of Israel and I am Your servant. Answer me that the people may know that You, O LORD, are the One, True God, and that You have turned their hearts back to loving and obeying You."

What do you think happened? Would the LORD send down fire?

What do you think?

Yes, He would! (SB25) Suddenly, a huge, hot, blaze of fire down from heaven. WHOOSH! It burned up the bull, the wood, the water, the stones, and even the soil. Can you imagine! Fire so hot that it could burn up stones!

When all the people saw this, they (SB26) fell down on their faces and said, "The LORD, He is God; the LORD, He is the One True God!"

Then they turned on the messengers of Baal and got rid of them all. At last, the people of Israel had turned back to obeying and worship the LORD! And at last, it was time for rain.

(SB27) Elijah bowed down low to the ground, with his face between his knees, and prayed to the LORD. The skies soon grew (SB28A,B) black with clouds and a great rain began to fall. All the people rejoiced in the rain and the good food that would grow again now. And which God did they thank?

Can you tell me?

They thanked the LORD! For now it was very, very clear: Baal was only a fake god; and the LORD was the One, True God. There was no other God, and there never will be.

The people of Israel are not the only people who disobey the LORD and choose to worship other things. We have all chosen to disobey Him. We have all chosen to worship other things besides Him. How we deserve His punishment!

But how kind is the LORD! He offers us forgiveness through His Son, Jesus! Jesus suffered and died on the cross as the perfect payment for our sins. He rose from the dead on the third day, showing He had really beaten sin and death for us. How can Jesus be OUR Savior? By turning away from our sins and trusting in Jesus as our Savior. If we do, we become God's people. We will know special closeness with Him in our hearts now. And one day, we will go to live with Him forever. God loves to help us trust in Jesus! Ask Him!

Close in prayer.





We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "How many true Gods are there? It starts with an "o" and it rhymes with "done."

Can you guess? It's "One."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else! He Is the ONE, True God!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means: (read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)


People look for a god to worship: someone or something that they honor as best; who is most important to them; who they will love most of all, and serve. And, someone or thing they can depend on to take care of them.

Sometimes, people make their own gods. They cut them out of wood or stone and worship them. Sometimes, people make things their god. They make having many nice things most important. They trust in their money to take care of them. They never seem to have enough of it. Sometimes people worship other people or even themselves! People are most important to them. They change what they say and do to please them, even if it's wrong. What others think of them matters to them too much.

Money, people, and even wood and stone are all good things, but they were not meant to be worshipped. There is really only one SOMEONE we are made to worship: it is the LORD, the one, true God. The LORD made heaven and earth and everything in it... even us! He is all-loving and all-good. He knows everything there is to know and He can do whatever He wants to do. He's the one who can we can depend on to take care of us. He is the only one who is really worthy of our worship. There is no one like Him.

Seek after the LORD! Live for Him! He promises that all who seek Him will find Him. How wonderful it is to know and live for the LORD, the one, true God!

About the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?





1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truth, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 3 lessons for each Bible Truth.



- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labeled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.
- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Long, long ago, there was a time before this world was made.

There were no mountains, no stars, no oceans, no plants. There were no birds, no animals, no fish, and no people. There was just the LORD, the one, true God.

Now that might sound very lonely, but actually it was (SB1) Perfect Wonderfulness—the most wonderful thing anyone can ever know. Why? Because while the LORD IS just one, true God, He is something else that is very, very special. He is God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit: three Persons, but just one God. Three-in-One. And the friendship—the fellowship—that He enjoyed in Himself was better than anything we can ever imagine. And that's why I call it "Perfect Wonderfulness."

The LORD did not need this world or anything in it to be happy. He was perfectly happy in Himself. But nonetheless, He wanted to make this world. He had a plan for it. A plan to create (SB2) a people for Himself. A people to share in His Perfect Wonderfulness with Him forever.

So way back in the beginning, God began His plan for the world and for His people. He created it all beautifully and perfectly--both the heavens and the earth (SB3,SB4). And last of all, He made (SB5) the first people who would share in that Perfect Wonderfulness with Him.

Do you know the names of those first people who God created?

What are their names?

They were named Adam and Eve.

How wonderful life was for Adam and Eve! God placed them in a beautiful garden with everything they needed. Best of all, He gave them Himself. (SB6) He gave them a spirit--a special heart. And through this spirit, Adam and Eve knew and loved God. They enjoyed His Perfect Wonderfulness. They obeyed Him and trusted Him. They loved their beautiful home. Yes, life was very wonderful with nothing wrong in it at all!

But then (SB7) God's enemy came. He tricked Adam and Eve into disobeying God. They thought they would be happier doing things their own way; but, oh, they were not! They lost their beautiful home and the perfect love they had for each other. Now, their bodies would get sick and one day would die. (SB8) Now, they and all their children after them would live in world broken with sin. Worst of all, they lost the bit of God's Perfect Wonderfulness they had in their hearts... and they deserved to stay separated from God forever. Oh, what a very, very sad day!

But God is so kind. He knew what people would do even before He even created them. And back then, before the beginning, He had already woven their RESCUE into His plans for the world. And what an amazing rescue it would be! Can you guess who He would send?

Can you guess?

He planned to send (SB9) Jesus, the Son of God. Yes, Jesus would choose to leave heaven and the full, close fellowship of Perfect Wonderfulness with God, His Father and the Holy Spirit. Down, down, down to earth He would go. He would make the way to save God's people. He would rescue them, so they could share in God's Perfect Wonderfulness once more.

So, at just the right time, (SB10) Jesus was born a baby in Bethlehem. He was still the Son of God, but now He was a human, too.

Life on earth was not like the Perfect Wonderfulness Jesus fully enjoyed in heaven. Can you imagine what it would be like to leave behind all that Perfect Wonderfulness and live in this broken world? Oh, how God must love us, that He would choose to do this to save us!

Every day, Jesus prayed to His Father and was helped by the Holy Spirit. But He looked forward to the day when He would once more enjoy that full, Perfect Wonderfulness with God, His Father and the Holy Spirit in heaven. And Jesus knew that because of what He was doing for God's people on earth, that they would get to be in heaven with Him, knowing and enjoying God fully. That was worth it all!

So for thirty, long years, (SB11) Jesus lived here on earth. He grew up, up, up until He was a man. He slept and he played. He did His chores and learned a job. And all the while, Jesus never, ever did anything wrong. He was preparing to be our perfect Savior.

No, Jesus wasn't going there for any of those reasons. Jesus was going down to the River Jordan because it was time to complete God's amazing rescue plan. And, it would start out there, at the River Jordan, with His funny-looking, funny-living cousin who lived there.

Do you know his name?

It was (SB14) a man named John.

Yes, John certainly looked funny! He never cut his hair or his beard. And he wore camel's hair for clothes!

John certainly lived funny, too...out there in the desert-y wilderness, eating nothing but (SB15) wild honey and hoppy, bumpy, crunchy locusts for food. Yum! Yum!

But John looked this way and lived this way for a very good reason: God had told him, too. God was preparing John for a special job. God would use him to get the people ready for Jesus.

John started preaching the message God gave him: (SB16) "It's time! The LORD is sending His Savior! Repent! Stop disobeying God and turn back to Him! Be baptized! Show that you want to live for God! Make sure you are ready for the Savior when He comes!" John told all who came out to the River Jordan to listen to him.

(SB17) All kinds of people came. Strong, army soldiers. Bad, cheating men like tax collectors. Other people came to listen, too. What do you think happened as they listened to this funny-looking, funny-living man?

How Are They Used?



The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?





1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truth, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 3 lessons for each Bible Truth.



- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labeled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.
- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

Answers to questions; the gospel; and, ACTS prayer are included with the story text.

The Case of the God Who Would Never Leave Genesis 27-28

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Jacob (SB1) was about to be in big trouble! He was up to his tricky tricks again and what big tricky tricks they were! Jacob had (SB2) tricked his big brother, Esau, out of the special, firstborn gift he was supposed to get from their father. And now, Jacob wanted to trick their father into giving him the special, firstborn-blessing Esau was supposed to get from him, too. But time was running out. Jacob needed to think fast, if he was to get Esau's blessing.

Jacob and Esau's father, (SB3) Isaac, was a very old man who lay in bed. Before he died, he would give each of his sons a special blessing.

Isaac called for (SB4) Esau first. Esau was the oldest son in the family. Isaac would give him the best blessing—the special, firstborn blessing. That's what fathers did back then. "Esau, come here. I want to give you my special, firstborn blessing, " Isaac told him. "But first, go hunting and bring me back some meat and make it into my favorite stew," Isaac said.

Esau happily obeyed. He (SB5) picked up his bow and arrows and set off into the fields. He hoped God would help him find good food for his father quickly. How he was looking forward to getting that special, firstborn blessing!

Rebekah, their mother, hurried to Jacob with the news. She and Jacob (SB6) wanted Jacob to have that best blessing, not Esau. It would take tricky tricks to get it. Could Rebekah and Jacob trick Isaac into giving Jacob the firstborn blessing instead?

This wasn't going to be easy. You see, Esau and Jacob might have been brothers (they were even twins!), but they were very, very different, as their father, Isaac, knew.

(SB7) Esau loved to work and hunt outdoors. He smelled of the fresh air and the fields. But Jacob loved to stay near the family tent and help his mother, Rebekah cook and do other chores. He smelled more like smoke from the fire and food. Esau had very hairy arms and legs, but Jacob had silky smooth skin. Jacob and Esau's voices were very different, too.

So, yes, indeed, it was going to take a particularly good tricky trick to fool Isaac into thinking Jacob was really Esau.

Before long, Jacob (SB8) had come up with just the trick...and it all depended on his father's bad eyes.

What do you think Jacob did?

Here's what Jacob did: (SB9) First, he dressed up in Esau's best clothes. Now he would smell like Esau. Then, he put goat's fur on his neck and hands. Now he would feel hairy, like Esau. Would this be enough to fool their father? Jacob hoped so.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

While Esau was still hunting far from the tents, Jacob put his tricky trick into action. (SB10) He filled up a bowl with his mother's yummy goat stew and went to his father pretending to be his brother: (SB11) "Here I am father. It's your son, Esau," Jacob lied.

Jacob thought this was odd. "Hmmmm...Esau has come back from hunting very quickly! Too quickly. And this voice. It doesn't sound like Esau. It sounds like Jacob! Could this be Jacob up to another of his tricky tricks?" Isaac wondered.

"Are you really my son, Esau?" Isaac asked the son standing before him.

"Yes, Father, it is I. The LORD helped me get some meat quickly. Eat your delicious stew and bless me. "Please bless me!" Jacob lied again.

Something still didn't seem right to Isaac. Since his old eyes didn't work very well, Isaac decided to use his nose and hands to make sure this son standing before him was really Esau.

What do you think Isaac used his hands and his nose to do?

(SB12) Isaac stretched out his arm and placed it on his son. He felt lots of hair. Yes, this felt like Esau all right!

Then Isaac leaned over to kiss his son and smell his son's clothes. They smelled like the outdoors. Yes, this smelled like Esau smelled all right. Now Isaac was sure. Yes, this really was Esau! So he stretched out his arm, put his hand on his son's head and gave him the special, firstborn blessing.

Ha! Jacob's tricky trick had worked! His father had given him the best blessing! How pleased Jacob was as he hurried away from his tent!

Yes, Jacob was very happy...but there was someone else who soon wouldn't be happy at all. Someone who came back from hunting and went into his father with his favorite stew, only to find out that his brother had been there before him with his tricky trick. Can you guess who it was?

Can you quess?

(SB13) It was Esau..the REAL Esau! And he was furious! Jacob had tricked him out of his father's firstborn gift to him and now he had tricked him out of his father's special, firstborn blessing to him, too! BOTH of his father's best gifts that should have been his were both GONE!

So, now it was Esau's turn for a tricky trick. As soon as old, father Isaac died, Esau (SB14) would get rid of Jacob and take back those best gifts for himself! That would take care of him once and for all!

Uh, oh! What should Jacob do?

There was only one thing Jacob could do: run away. But to where? Rebekah had an idea: "(SB15) Run away to the far away country where my family lives. They will take care of you and you can find a wife there," she told Jacob. So that's just what Jacob did. With the blessing of his father and mother, he packed up his little bundle of things and set off at once.

The trip to Rebekah's family was long and hard. They lived faraway. Jacob would have to (SB16) walk many days through the lonely, dry wilderness to get there. Each day, the hot sun would beat down on him. He would have to find his own water and food. He could easily get lost.

Bible Story for Big Question 4, Bible Truth 4 use with all THREE lessons

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

The (SB17) nights could be as hard as the days, out in that deep, deep darkness, all alone. The desert-y wilderness could be windy and cold at night. The ground was bumpy and hard. Jacob had only a rock for a pillow and his coat for a blanket. Ooh...ouch... brrrr...Cover up, Jacob!

The desert-y wilderness was home to lots of (SB18) creepy crawly bugs. Spiders and scorpions and other little wiggling, biting creatures could wriggle their way inside his clothes as he lay on the ground. Wriggle... wriggle...nip...snap...snap...Watch out, Jacob!

There were (SB19) lions and bears and other creatures around. They had hungry tummies and sharp teeth. They prowled around in the dark, looking for food to eat. Roar....growl...chomp, chomp.... Hide, Jacob!

Why, there might even be (SB20) bad guys who would sneak up on him and take his bundle of things. Whoo, whoo...ha, ha! Beware, Jacob!

Jacob had never been away from home like this before, so very all alone, in the middle of nowhere. Who would be with him, as he traveled so far from home? Could anyone help him?

Can you think of anyone?

Yes, there was who someone could. The LORD could help Jacob! He is the God who is everywhere, all the time. He had been there when Jacob tricked his father and took his brother's special firstborn blessing. He had been there when Esau wanted to kill him and he had to run away. And He was right there, in the middle of that nowhere in the deep darkness where Jacob camped that night.

Now, Jacob's tricky tricks were very bad things and he deserved nothing but the LORD's punishment for them. After all, the LORD is good. He hates wrong-doing... and Jacob had most certainly done wrong!

But the LORD is also so very kind and merciful to sinners, even sinners like Jacob. And many times, the LORD takes very bad things and does very good things, things that we could never, ever deserve. And so it was that the LORD chose to be very kind and merciful to Jacob. The LORD chose to use the bad things that Jacob did to do some very good things. Things that would one day bring good to all people, everywhere... even to people like you and me.

So right there, in the middle of nowhere, in that deep darkness, on that cold ground, with that hard, rock pillow. Right there, with those bugs wriggling, those wild animals prowling, (and maybe even bad guys lurking), the LORD helped (SB21) Jacob fall asleep. And as he slept, the LORD gave Jacob a special dream about the good things He would do through Jacob and his family.

In his dream, Jacob saw (SB22) a VERY tall ladder. It was so tall that it stretched from the ground all the way up to (SB23) heaven.

The LORD, the God who was everywhere, all the time. HE was always with Jacob. He would make sure Jacob had everything he needed. He would keep all of his promises to him.

And so He did! The LORD helped Jacob get all the way to his mother's family in the faraway country. He (SB28) blessed Jacob with a big family and many good things. He worked inside Jacob, too. He changed Jacob into a man who loved Him and trusted in Him. And many years later, the LORD led (SB29) Jacob safely back home to his family... where everyone was happy to see him—even his brother, Esau!

Jacob praised God for taking care of him. He truly was the God who is everywhere, all the time.

God also kept His promise to bless all peoples through Jacob's family. At just the right time, (SB30) Jesus, God's Son, was born--Jacob's great, great, etc. grandson. He was called Emmanuel, God with us. He came to give us the greatest blessing of all: forgiveness of our sins, when we turn from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior. If we do, the LORD will be OUR God who is with US, everywhere, all the time, bringing good to us. No matter where we go or what we do, He will be right there with us: loving us, taking care of us, and working inside of our hearts, helping us to love Him and trust in Him. How kind the LORD has been to us through Jacob and his family!

It was amazing that the LORD didn't leave Jacob because the LORD hates wrong-doing (sin) and Jacob had done a very bad thing by tricking his father to get the special, firstborn blessing

For You and Me:

Isn't the LORD amazing! He is good and He hates wrongdoing (sin); but, He is so merciful, too. The LORD stayed with Jacob and promised to bless him. He changed Jacob into a man who loved Him and lived for Him. The LORD even used Jacob to bless us, too. How? By sending Jesus through Jacob's family to be the Savior for our sins. Meaning:




Who would like to hand me the picture with our eight Bible truths on it? It's in the Big Question Box/Briefcase."

Choose a child to get it and hand it to you, then hold it up and show them the pictures of the eight truths they will be learning.

After everyone has had a good look say...

"Ok, we've learned three truths about the gospel. They are: "He is a Glorious Spirit", "He Is the One, True God"; and, "He is God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit: One God, but Three Persons." (point to pictures as you identify each Bible Truth). Now let's look at our Bible Truth Clue sign and see if we can figure out which of these four truths we will be learning about today. Who would like to get it out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the Bible Truth Clue sign and hand it to you.



Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?
He's Not Like Anyone Else!
He Is ????, All the Time!"He Is ????, All the Time!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "It's a word that means all places? It rhymes with "teddy bear."

Can you guess? It's "Everywhere."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else! He Is EVERYWHERE, All the Time!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

How many places can you be at once? Can you be here with us and out on the playground at the same time? Can you hear what your parents are saying in the kitchen and what the king in a faraway country is saying at the same time? No, you can't and neither can!

Other Visual Aids

Big Question Box/Briefcase

What You Want

The Big Question Briefcase is a briefcase or other container with these characteristics:

- Ideally, this should be around 17" x 12", but needs to be at least big enough to fit a 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper inside it.
- Have various pockets to put these sheets in
- Is attractive or curious looking to preschoolers
- · Not necessary, but extremely fun, if is has a combination lock

Finding a Briefcase:

You can certainly buy one new, but you always may find a used one at a thrift shop. Or, someone may have one they want to donate. We use one that stores valuables in it and is the 17" x12" size. Very durable and has the lock feature that the kids love.

You also can move away from the briefcase idea and use a little trunk or other box for your substitute briefcase. Just change the name to the Big Question Box, if you use a box instead. A boot box or the cardboard box that 10 reams of copy paper comes in is a great size, if you are using a box.

If you use a box, but want a lock-like feature, that's easy to do. Simply cut "straps" out of felt or vinyl and glue in place to the top and bottom sides of the box on one side, with the top strap overlapping the bottom straps. Add velcro to the top and bottom pieces so that they meet and fasten. Make back "hinges" for the box with the felt/ vinyl straps, too. Or, you can simply add a belt around the box that has to be unfastened before the box can be opened.

Here are some suggestions for decorating a box or even the outside of your briefcase to make it appealing.

Supplies

Your box/briefcase
Plain white contact paper or white cardstock
Colorful wrapping paper
Glitter glue
Markers
Sequins, fake jewels, buttons, rick rack, etc.
Other decorating supplies
Stickers
Glue
Clear packing tape

Directions

- 1. If you are using a box that has wording on it, you will first need to make plain surfaces for decorating and a hinge for the lid. Stick the white contact paper or white cardstock to each side of the box. On the other hand, you can also use colorful wrapping paper. Then, make a lid by sticking the clear packing tape along one long side of the box, attaching the lid to the box.
- 2. Use the craft decorating supplies to decorate the box. If desired, you can put a big question mark on top of the box, but remember that you are working with two and three year olds: the question mark symbol is not very meaningful to them yet.

Making a Flannelgraph Storyboard

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

While you may decide to use sticky tac and stick your storyboard pictures to a white board, it is very easy to make a flannelgraph board. The advantage to the flannelgraph board is that the pictures stick very easily and there is no messing with the sticky-tac.

Supplies

Large Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $36'' \times 48''$ foamboard or corkboard (We actually use a far bigger canvas and attach it to the wall) A science project board with the two sides that fold out makes a good $36'' \times 48''$ board. Small Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $24'' \times 36''$ (to $36'' \times 48)''$ board

Large piece of neutral-colored felt to cover your board with extra to overlap over to the back, if desired. Glue gun and glue sticks

Directions

1. Center felt on front side of board. Turn over. Secure in place with glue.

Making Durable Storyboard Pictures

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

Whether you purchase the Deep Down Detectives storyboard pictures from Amazon or print them off the website (included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book), you will want to find some way to make them more durable. They are used not only as a part of telling the story, but are integral in the story review games. Here's how we make ours durable enough to be used over and over again. **See note below for other simpler options for using these pictures.**

Supplies

Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book (purchased or downloaded)

White cardstock or printer paper (if downloading pictures)

Sticky-back velcro, circles or cut pieces; or sticky tac putty

Laminator or Self-laminating sheets

Sturdy Sheet Protectors, preferably the "Secure Top" kind, like offered by Avery

Flannelgraph pictures for the Bible stories found at www.praisefactory.org with each unit's resources.

Directions

- 1. Purchase from Amazon or download and print out the storyboard figures.
- 2. Cut out flannelgraph figures.
- 3. Laminate the figures.

Special tip: When laminating the big background pictures that are two (and sometimes even three or four) pieces put together, leave a small gap between the two pieces before laminating together. This small space acts like a hinge and allows you to fold up pictures without hurting them into a manilla envelope that fits 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper along with all of the smaller, regular-sized storyboard pictures.

4. If using a flannelgraph board: Stick a piece of sticky backed velcro (ROUGH SIDE) onto the back of each figure. If using sticky tack and whiteboard: simply stick a small amount of sticky tack on the back of a picture when using it. Remove and store sticky tack in airtight container.

Note: Instead of using all of the pictures as separate flannelgraph pieces, you can choose to use only a few (helpful to have 10 for the story review game); you can clump them onto posterboard and make them into picture scenes; or, you can simply use the Storyboard Picture Guide as a single picture. At praisefactory.org, go to DDD Bits and Pieces for a 22" x 28" poster size jpg of this picture guide if you want to create a large version.

The Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder

This is a homemade folder that looks (kinda) like the cover of a Bible. You will use this to put the Bible verse, the Bible Story and storyboard pictures to help make the point that the truths you are teaching them come from the Bible.

Supplies

1 piece of 22" x 28" posterboard (white is fine. Green or brown is nice)

Glue

Stapler and staples or packing tape

The Bible Cover pictures (see online with resources for this unit or from the back of each Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book.)

NOTE: The Bible Cover pictures included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids books cannot be created larger than 8.5" x 11". That means that they will be under-sized for a Bible Folder of the dimensions you are making. However, you can go online to the Deep Down Detectives curriculum and there is a pdf of a bigger version of these covers that will actually fit the size of this Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder.

Directions

- 1. Lay out poster board with long side along the bottom.
- 2. Fold in 2" on each side.
- 3. Take packing tape and tape the folded in 2" flaps to the main section of the posterboard, all the way down.
- 3. Fold up 8 1/2" on the bottom of the poster board.
- 4. Use packing tape to tape this flap in place, all the way down.
- 5. Take scissors and snip through the tape where the flap is attached to the folder. This will give you a bit more room in the folder.
- 6. Fold the poster board in the middle to make the center fold.
- 7. Cut out the Bible Cover Pictures. If possible, laminate these. They will last longer.
- 8.. Glue the two cover pieces to the outside of the folder.
