DDD 4 Big Question and Answer Sign

The Big Question

Hold up the Big Question sign for all the children to see, and say:

The Big Question we are investigating today is Big Question Number 4:

Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? and the Answer is: He's Not Like Anyone Else!

Meaning:


There are many gods that people worship, but none is like the LORD. He is the one, true God. He's not like anyone else! He's always been alive--and He will never die. He's completely good and loving. He's all-powerful and all-wise. And that's just the beginning of what the LORD is like. He is so great! There will always be more of Him to know.

This Unit's Bible Truths

"He's not like anyone else" is a good beginning, but there's so more to learn. So it's time for us to dig down even deeper for more answers to our Big Question about God. We're going to be learning EIGHT Bible truths that all tell us more about what God is like.

Who would like to hand me the picture with our eight Bible truths on it? It's in the Big Question Box/Briefcase."

Choose a child to get it and hand it to you, then hold it up and show them the pictures of the eight truths they will be learning.

After everyone has had a good look say...

"Ok, we've learned four truths about what the LORD is like. They are: "He is a Glorious Spirit," "He Is the One, True God," "He Is Father, Son and Holy Spirit: Three Persons, but Just One God," and, "He Is Everywhere, All the Time" (point to pictures as you identify each Bible Truth). Now let's look at our Bible Truth Clue sign and see if we can figure out which of these eight truths we will be learning about today. Who would like to get it out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the Bible Truth Clue sign and hand it to you.

DDD 4.5 Bible Truth 5--Front

Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else! He Knows???? There Is to Know!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "It's a word that means the opposite of "nothing." It starts with the letter "E."

Can you guess? It's "Everything."


So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

"Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like? He's Not Like Anyone Else! He Knows EVERYTHING There Is to Know!" And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

God knows everything. He knows everything about the world. He knows everything that has happened and everything that will happen. He knows everything about us, too. He knows everything we do and say. He even knows everything we are thinking in our hearts. There is nothing about us that is hidden from God, good or bad. God even knows every one of our sins. He knows we deserve His punishment and He has provided us with a Savior—Jesus! When we tell God our sins and turn to live for Him and trust in Jesus as our Savior, He will forgive us and make us His dearly loved people. Then we can know and love God in the wonderful special closeness that He made us to enjoy with Him.



Bible Truth 5 Bible Verse

Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" folder and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

Daniel 2:20 tells us:

I. Kish had a problem. Some of his animals were missing... animals that were worth a lot! It wasn't his chickens. It wasn't his sheep or goats. It was another kind of animal--the kind that he used to pull his wagon and ride on, like we would use a truck or car. Can you guess what kind of animals were missing?




2. Kish was missing his donkeys! He looked everywhere for them. He looked all over his farm, but no donkeys. He looked in the stable, but no donkeys. He looked in the fields, no donkeys there either. He looked faraway to the hills, but still no donkeys!



3. Kish's donkeys were lost, there was no doubt about that now. He just had to find them! So, Kish made a plan. He would send his son, Saul, and a servant to look for them. "Saul, take one of the servants and go look for the donkeys," Kish told Saul. Saul obeyed and soon he and the servant were on their way in search of the lost donkeys. Where could they be?



4. For three, long days, Saul and the servant walked and looked. They climbed up hills and searched there, but no donkeys. They walked down into valleys of green grass and searched there, but no donkeys. They looked by sparkling streams of cool water, too. These were the places donkeys liked to go. But still, there were no donkeys! Where WERE those donkeys? Kish didn't know. Saul and the servant didn't know. Did anyone know?



5. Yes, someone DID know-- the LORD! He is the God who knows everything there is to know. He knew exactly where those donkeys had gone off to. And not only did the LORD know exactly where the donkeys were, He even planned for something very good to happen to Saul as he looked for them. The LORD had planned to use this little journey looking for donkeys to put Saul in just the right place, with just the right person, to make Saul the first king of Israel. And the LORD was going to do all of this without Saul knowing even one, little bit of His good, big plan!



6. Saul didn't know about God's plans yet, but a man named Samuel did. Samuel was a prophet--one of the LORD's special messengers. The LORD had told Samuel about Saul and His plans to make him king. "Samuel, tomorrow the man I've chosen to be king over Israel is coming to Zuph. He will lead the people in fighting off their enemies, the Philistines. I want you to pour the special anointing oil on his head and make him king over Israel," the LORD told him.



7. This was big news! The LORD had chosen a man to lead the people against their enemies. And, this man was coming to Zuph to be anointed king, the very next day! A worship feast to the LORD was planned. Samuel and Saul would be there for it. Up in the hills, they would offer worship gifts to the LORD, and would honor Saul with a fine dinner. There was so much to do in so little time! There were guests to invite. There were worship gifts to buy. There was the table to set for the feast, and all of the good food to prepare.



8. At last, everything was ready. The worship gifts were offered, and the guests gathered in the dining hall up at the worship place. The delicious food was set out on plates. It looked like it was time for the feast to begin, but it couldn't. Something --really, someONE-- was missing. It was Saul, the special guest, himself! After all, no one had told HIM about the worship feast. No one had told HIM he was going to be anointed king of Israel. He was just out looking for lost donkeys.



9. It seemed silly to think that Saul would show up at the worship feast that night, don't you think? I guess it WOULD be silly, except that this was the LORD's plan, and He is the God who knows everything there is to know. If HE said that Saul would be there, then Saul would be there. Samuel was sure of that. And sure enough, just as Samuel was on his way up to join the guests at the feast, who should be looking for him at the city gates? You guessed it! Saul and his servant! "This is the man I told you about," the LORD told Samuel. "The man I've chosen to be king."



10. Saul went up to Samuel and said, "My servant says you are a great man of God and God tells you things. Can you tell me where my father's donkeys are?"

"Don't worry about your father's donkeys," Samuel told Saul. "They've been found. They are back at home. Go with me to the worship feast up in the hills. Sit at the most important place. Eat the best food. I've been waiting for you to come," Samuel said.



II. Saul didn't understand why Samuel had been waiting for him, but he didn't complain. He went with Saul up to the worship place and took the place of honor next to Samuel. He enjoyed the good food and the worship feast. And what a feast it was! Why, Samuel had even saved the very best piece of meat for HIM! Yum!



12. After dinner, Samuel took Saul and his servant to his house for the night. He made them a bed on the roof, and there, they slept out under the stars.



13. At sunrise, Samuel woke Saul and his servant. "Get up, so I may send you on your way," Samuel told them. Samuel walked with them out of town. "Send your servant on ahead, Saul. I have something important from God to tell you alone," Samuel said. Saul and his servant obeyed.



I4. When the servant had passed ahead of them, Samuel took out his jar of anointing oil and poured it on Saul's head. He kissed Saul, then said, "I have poured this oil on your head as a sign that you are to be king of Israel. The LORD has chosen you of all men. You will rule over them and you will rescue them from the enemies who live in the lands around them. In a few days, we will tell all the people. But for now, keep this a secret."



15. What a lot Saul had to think about as he went home with his servant! The LORD had planned to use those lost donkeys to make him king over Israel! And, the LORD had told Samuel what he would do and where he would go, even before he did it!

How could the LORD do this? Because He is the God who knows everything there is to know! He is like no one else. How amazing is the LORD!


I. What stranger did the LORD tell Samuel to prepare for? Saul
