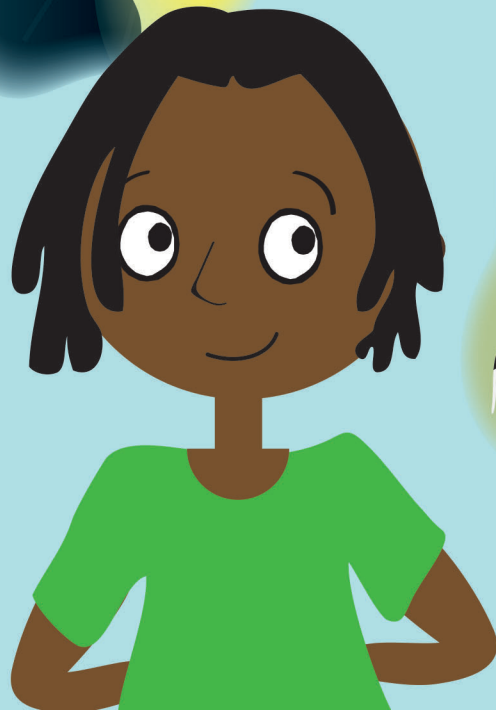

The Big Question we are investigating today is
Big Question Number 5:

Can You Tell Me What God Made?
and the Answer is:
God Made All Things Good!

Meaning:

Did you ever wonder where everything in this world came from? All of the plants, animals and insects...the fish and birds...the sun, moon, stars and planets...the tall mountains and the beautiful oceans...the people here around us and the angels up in heaven? Did they just get here on their own? No, they did not! God made them. And when God made them, He made them good—perfect and without sin. He made them just right for His good plan for the world.

What was God's good plan for the world? He planned for everything He made to show us what He's like so we could know delight in how wonderful He is.

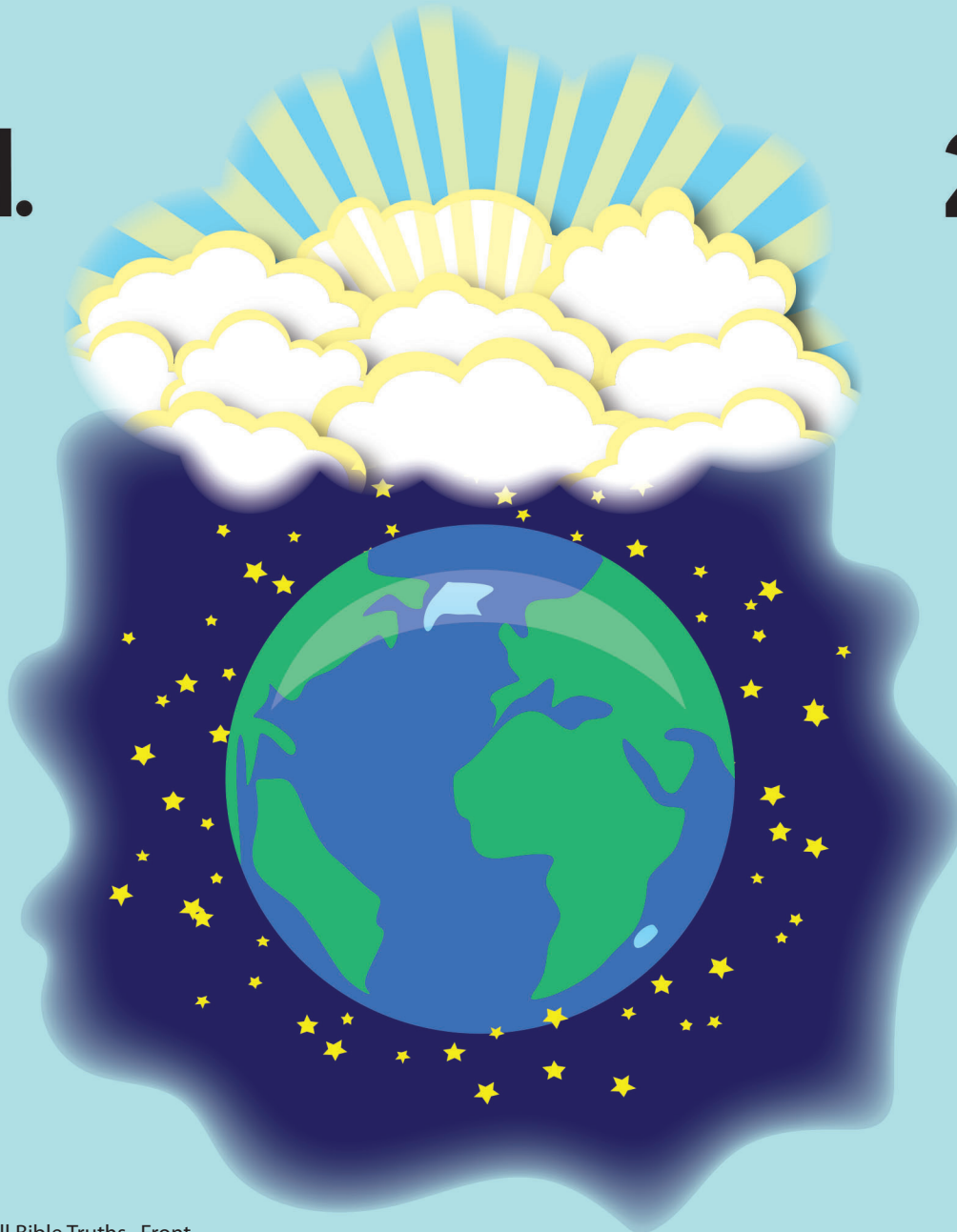

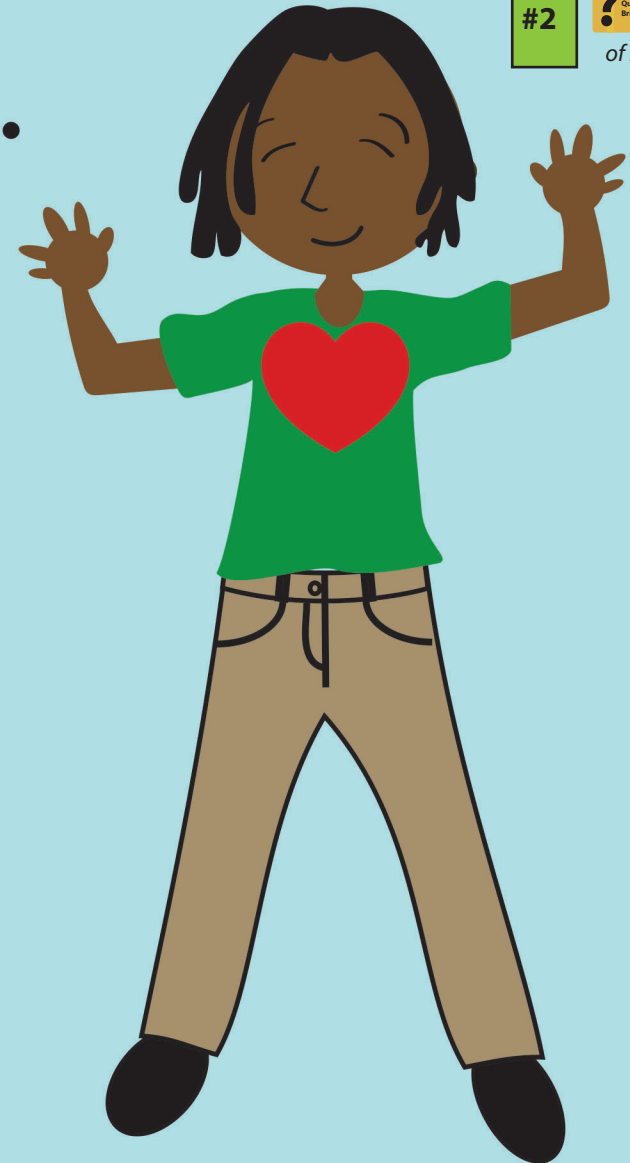
BIG QUESTION 5: Two truths about what the LORD made

This Unit's Bible Truths

"God made all things good" is a good beginning, but there's so more to learn. So it's time for us to dig down even deeper for more answers to our Big Question about God. We're going to be learning TWO Bible truths that all tell us more about the good things that God made.

Who would like to hand me the picture with our two Bible truths on it? It's in the Big Question Box/Briefcase." Choose a child to get it and hand it to you, then hold it up and show them the pictures of the two truths they will be learning. After everyone has had a good look, say...

"Ok, now let's look at our Bible Truth Clue sign and see if we can figure out which of these two truths we will be learning about today. Who would like to get it out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the Bible Truth Clue sign and hand it to you.

Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

**“Can You Tell Me What God Made?
God Made All Things Good!
He Made Everything in Heaven and ??? ? !”**

We’re missing one word. Here’s the hint to what the missing word is. It says: “What is the name of the world we live in? It starts with an “e” and it rhymes with “birth.”

Can you guess? It’s “earth.”

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

**“Can You Tell Me What God Made?
God Made All Things Good!
He Made Everything in Heaven and Earth!”**

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

God made everything in the beginning. He made the angels in heaven. He made the stars and moon we see at night, and the sun we see during the day. He made rivers, and mountains, and valleys. He made all the fish, the birds, the plants, the bugs, and the animals. He even made people. How did God make everything? He made it by His powerful word. He spoke, and everything was created. And it was all good—very good. There was no sin in any of it. It was all made just exactly right for God’s good plans.

Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" folder and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

Isaiah 44:24 tells us:

Isaiah 44:24

"I am the LORD, who has made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, who spread out the earth by myself."

Learn a Little: "I am the LORD, who has made all things."

What does that mean?

Who made everything? The LORD did! And who helped Him? No one! He alone made the heavens and everything in them. He alone made the earth and everything in it. Isn't God amazing!

1. Look around you. Look out the window. What do you see? Trees? Flowers? Birds? Squirrels? Dogs? The sun? The sky? People? This story is about how all these things came to be.

THE LORD

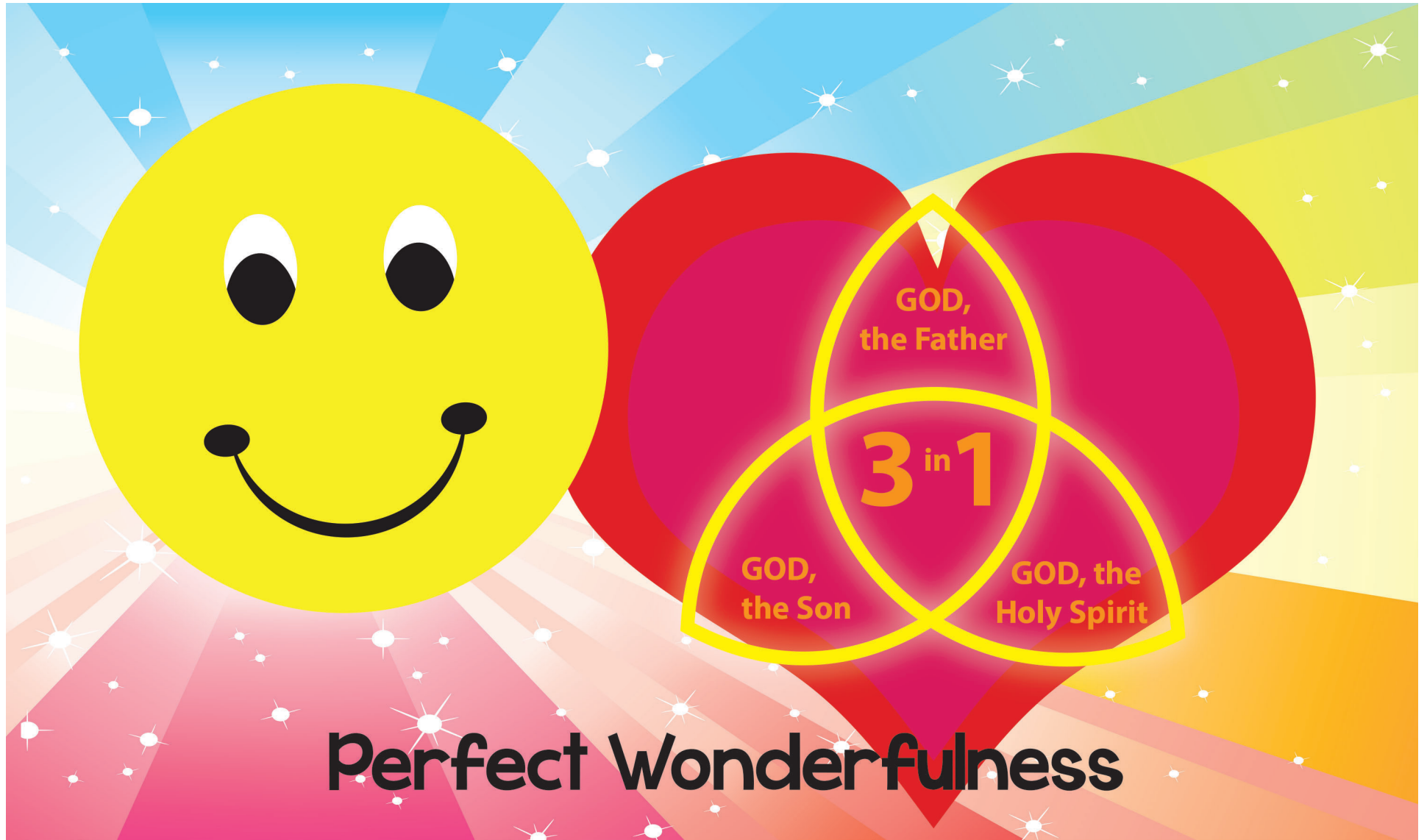
2. Our story starts long ago when everything was a BIG NOTHING! That's right! Nothing at all! Nothing, that is, except the LORD. The LORD has always lived. He had no beginning, and He will have no end! How amazing He is!



3. I don't know about you, but I don't like "nothing." I love all the wonderful things I see around me in our world. I can't imagine being very happy living in a world of BIG NOTHING, like it was, long ago. I can only imagine being sad and lonely!



4. But the LORD wasn't lonely at all, when our world was just a BIG NOTHING. He was happy. And God wasn't just a LITTLE happy, He was COMPLETELY happy. Yes, He was as happy as He could be back then, before everything in this world was made.



5. How could He be that happy? Because the LORD is always perfectly happy just in Himself—God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. After all, there is no one more wonderful to know and love than God. All the creatures and things we love and enjoy in this world are just little reflections of how wonderful He is. God didn't need any of those little reflections to be happy. He already had Himself! And that was best of all! It was Perfect Wonderfulness!

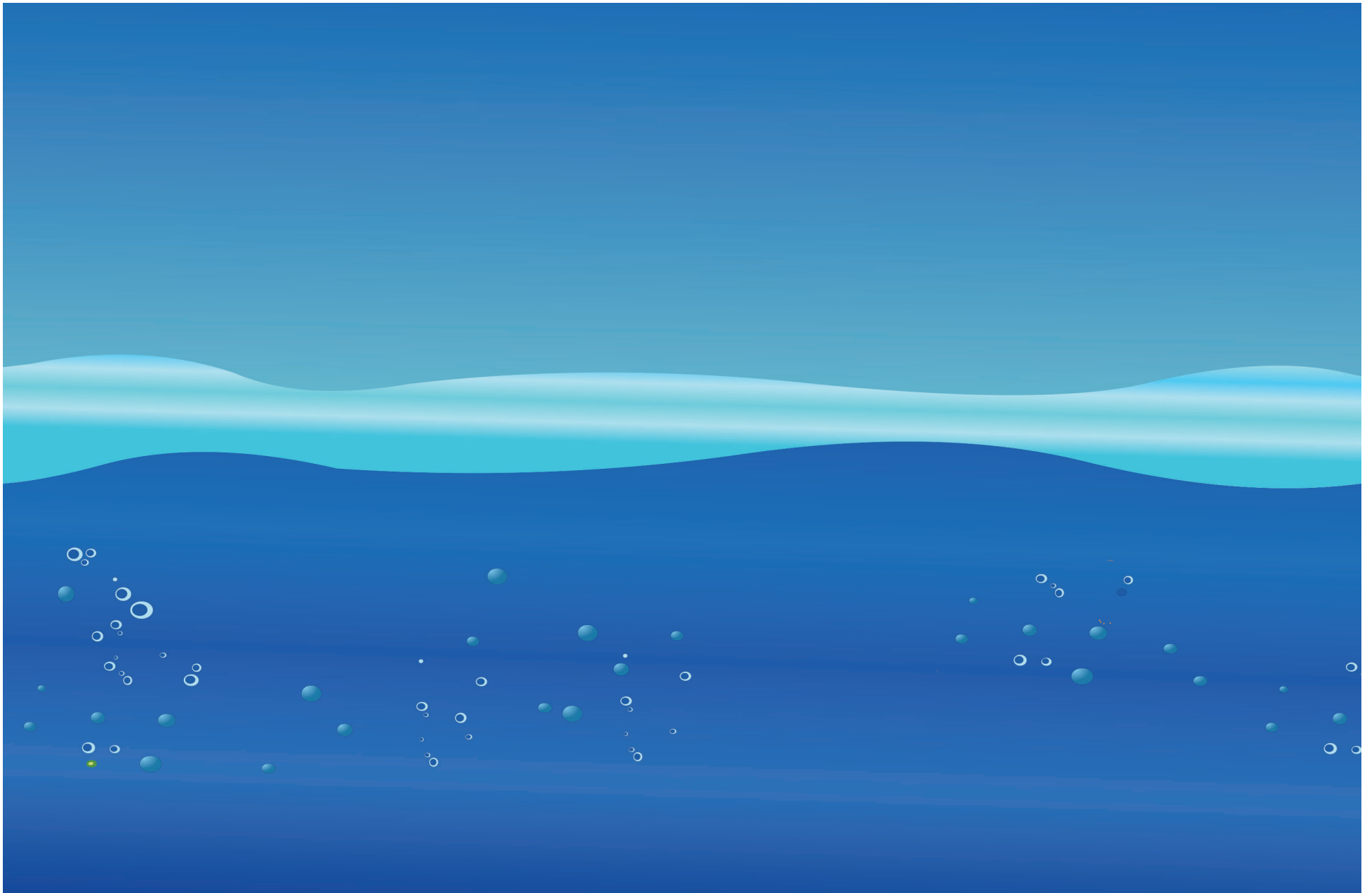
6. But even though the LORD wasn't lonely and didn't need anyone or anything else to be happy, He CHOSE to make something. Actually, A LOT of somethings. He chose to make our whole world. He did it, just because He wanted to. He did it, because He had a great plan for it. A plan to display His beautiful goodness in millions of different ways. And, He would share this amazing display with one, very special kind of creature: people! Best of all, He planned for these people to know and enjoy Him, in all His Perfect Wonderfulness. And so, what God planned, He began...



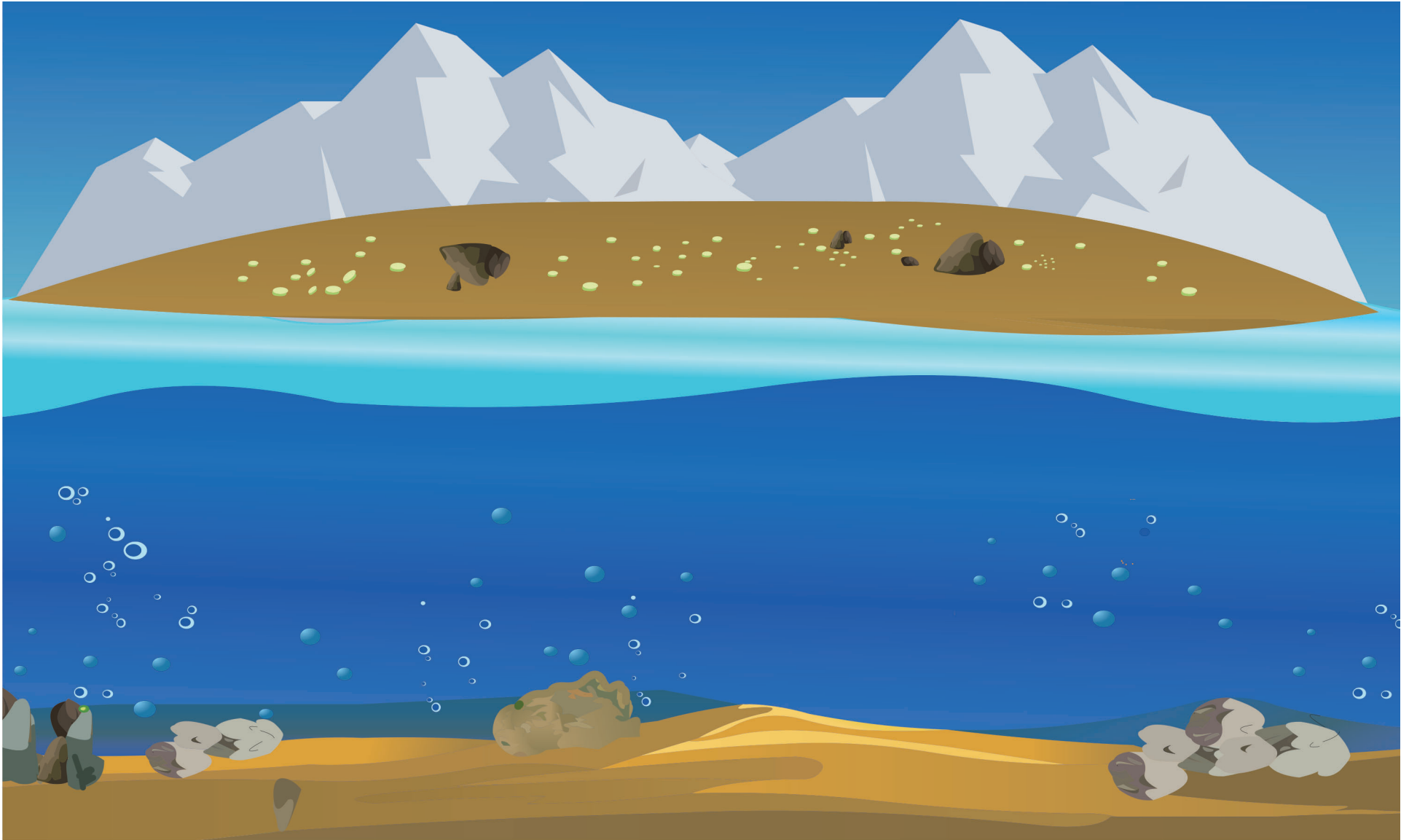
7. Now, if you or I make something new, we have to begin with some sort of STUFF: clay, or paper, or cardboard, or sticks, or something. But not the LORD. He didn't need any stuff to make this world. He started just with a BIG NOTHING... and Himself. He would create everything by His own, powerful word. Yep. He simply said what He wanted to be, and it was made. Just right. And just as simple as that.



8. God started His great work with the earth. At first, it didn't have any shape. It was empty, and watery, and oh, so dark. God's Spirit hovered over the waters. He was ready to bring shape and life to everything. "Come, light!" God said, and a beautiful light began to shine. He separated it from darkness. He gave names to each. The light, He called "Day." The darkness, He called "Night." That was what the LORD did on the first day He made things.



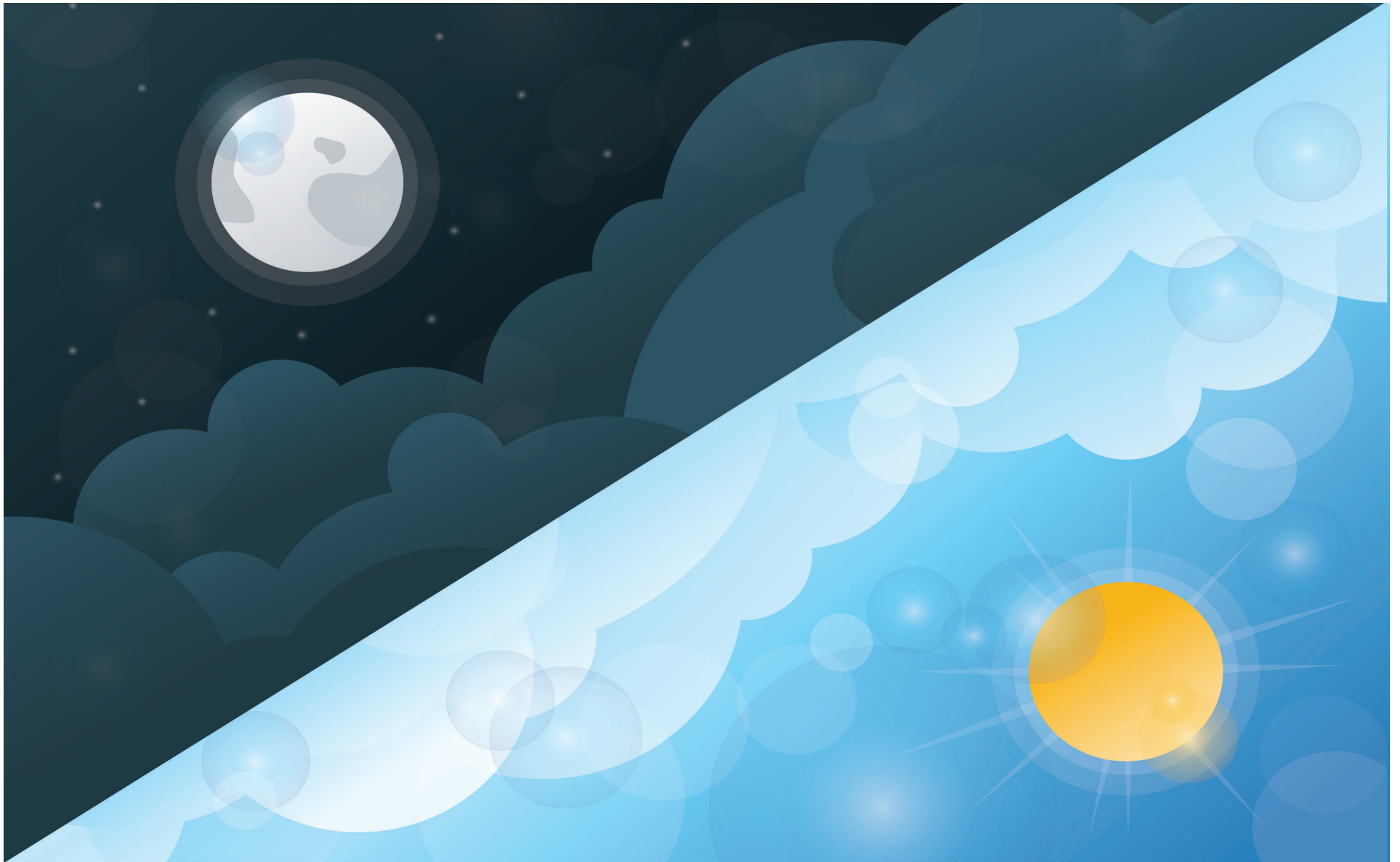
9. On the second day, the LORD separated the watery stuff into two parts. He called the watery stuff up above the earth, "Sky" (this is where rain and clouds would come from). The rest of the waters stayed down on the earth. That was what God did on the second day He made things.



10. On the third day, the LORD said, “Waters on the earth, gather together! Dry land, appear!” So, the waves of the water bunched together, and soon land could be seen. Mountains and flatlands. Hills and valley. God named the dry land “Earth,” and the waters He called, “Seas.” God looked at the wild, splashing waves. He looked at the rich, dark ground, and it was good. There was no sin in it. It was just the way He wanted it to be for His great plan.



II. Now, the LORD began to fill all the spaces He had made. “Trees and plants, sprout up on the earth!” And as soon as He said it, up popped grass and leafy plants all over the earth --all over the mountains, and the hills, and valleys, and the flatlands. And oh, what wonderful trees with such yummy fruit! God looked at the beautiful, green world, and it was good. There was no sin in it. It was just the way He wanted it to be for His great plan.



12. On the fourth day, the LORD said, "Lights, fill the sky!" He made soft lights for the night: the stars and the moon. He made a big, blazing light for the day: the sun. "Give light to the earth, day and night. Make hot summer, crisp fall, cold winter, and warm spring, year after year," the LORD commanded them. And so, they did. That was what God did on the fourth day He made things.



13. On the fifth day, the LORD made creatures to live in the sky and seas. "Fish and sea creatures, fill up the waters!" He said. "Wriggle and splash! Have families, and make lots more fish! Birds, fill up the skies! Flap around and soar! Have families, and make lots more birds!" He commanded. And so, they did. Brightly colored fish, mighty sharks, huge whales, and twisty-turny dolphins swam in the seas. Eagles glided on the wind, parrots squawked from the trees, and hummingbirds buzzed busily around all the flowers. That was what God did on the fifth day He made things.



14. On the sixth day, the LORD filled the earth with land animals. "Come, cows and horses, goats and sheep! All you farm animals! Come, bears, and lions, and elephants! All you wild animals! Come, ladybugs and lizards! All you little creatures that creep along the ground! All of you: Have families and fill up the earth!" God said. And so, all those creatures came to be, by God's command.



15. The LORD looked at the beautiful, busy world of creatures He had made. It was good. There was no sin in it. It was just the way He wanted it to be for His great plan.

God had only one more creature left to make. It was that one, very special kind of creature He planned to share Himself with: people! People were to be the best creature of all, for the LORD planned to give them a special gift that He would give to no other creature on earth.



16. This special gift was a spirit --a special heart-- to know and love God and each other. "Let's make people in our own image," said God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. So, God made man and woman, each with a spirit inside. And He named these first people "Adam and Eve."



17. The LORD put Adam and Eve in Eden, the garden home He made for them. "Eat the good fruit from the trees. Have a family, and fill the earth!" He told them. "I'm putting you in charge over everything I've made on earth. Explore it all and make it your home."



18. Adam and Eve were happy to obey the LORD. What a beautiful world He had given them. How wonderful it was to live in it. How fun it would be to explore it and to make it their very own home. There was so much to do. So much to enjoy. And most enjoyable of all, was knowing and loving God! It was all Perfect Wonderfulness.



19. At the end of the sixth day, the LORD was done creating everything He had planned. He looked at it all and He was very pleased. It was all good. It was all VERY GOOD. There was no sin in it. It was just right. It was perfect for His good plans. And then, God rested from His work.
