

The Big Question

Hold up the Big Question sign for all the children to see, and say:

The Big Question we are investigating today is Big Question Number 15:

Why Do God's People Go to Church? and the Answer is: To Worship God and Love One Another!

Meaning:

A church is God's people gathering together. Some churches meet in special buildings. Some churches meet in homes. Some meet outside. No matter where they meet, when God's people gather together, they are a church. When God's people gather together as a church, they worship God. They worship Him for being the one, true God, who is not like anyone else. They worship Him for saving them through Jesus. They sing songs and pray to God. They listen to the Bible and learn how to obey it. God's people also gather together to love one another. They talk with each other, take care of each other, and pray for each other. The Bible tells us that God's people are to meet together often. Usually, this is on Sundays, the day that Jesus rose from the dead. Jesus promised that when God's people gather together, He will be there with them in a special way. Let's sing our Big Question Song:"

Unit 15 Bible Verse

"Who would like to get our Bible verse out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the "Bible" with the Bible Verse in it and hand it to you. Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" (held in place by velcro) and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

Meaning:

Why do God's people go to church? To worship God and love one another. The Bible tells God's people to not neglect meeting together! They need to keep on meeting together, week after week. At church, they learn about God from the Bible. At church, they sing songs of praise to God together. They pray to God and pray for each other. They help each other to love one another more and to love God, most of all. They do good works that take care of each other's needs and help everyone live like Jesus. That's why we're at church even today! "We've said our Bible verse, now let's sing it!"



I. Walk, walk, walk! Look at all the people walking! One, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, and so many, many more. More than I can count! Who are all these people? Where are they going? These are God's people, the people who love Jesus. They are gathering together as a church.



2. Let's see what they are doing. They are gathering together to worship the LORD God. Together, they are singing to Him: "Praise God! Praise God! He is so good and so great! He loves us so much!" And together, they are praying to God: "God, forgive our sins. Thank you for sending Jesus. Help us live like Him by loving You and loving others."



3. Together, they are listening to teaching from the Bible. They want to know more about God. They want to learn to love people better, and to love God most of all. They are remembering Jesus died to save them. "Praise God for Jesus! Praise God for Jesus!" they say. "He has saved us. He is bringing us to God." That's what God's people do when they gather together. They worship God.



4. God's people also gather together to love one another. They care for each other and make sure everyone has what they need. They share what they have with each other. They comfort one other when they are sick or sad. They pray for one another and help each other learn God's Word and live it out. They help each other love God and love one another.



5. And Who is working inside their hearts, helping them to worship God and love one another like this? God's Holy Spirit! He is doing these beautiful things inside of God's people. He is changing them to be more like Jesus.



6. Sunday is a special worship day for God's people. That's the day Jesus rose from the dead. God's people gather together each Sunday to remember how Jesus beat sin and death for them. So, while some people sleep late on Sundays; and, while others keep on working like it was any other day, God's people keep Sunday special to gather together as a church.



7. Other people watch God's people. What do they think? What do they say? "Look at God's people as they gather together. See how much they love God. See how they worship Him. See how much they love each other. It's amazing how these people worship God and love one another. We want to know about Jesus, too!" they exclaim.



8. "Come, gather together with us," God's people invite them. "Come, worship God with us! Come, let us love you. Come, hear the gospel, the wonderful good news of Jesus, God's Son. He came to bring us to God. Turn from your sins and trust in Jesus as your Savior, You can become one of God's people, too!" they exclaim. God's people want everyone to become God's people, too!

And that's why God's people gather together every Sunday: to celebrate what Jesus has done for them. Oh, how wonderful it is, that Jesus would do all of this to be their Savior!

You and me, we have disobeyed God, too. We deserve God's punishment, too! But we can praise God for Jesus, too. Do you know why? Because if we turn away from disobeying God and trust in Jesus as OUR Savior, He will forgive us and save us, too!

If we do, what a wonderful beginning that will be! We will get to know Him in our hearts now. Then one day, we will go to live with God in heaven forever.
