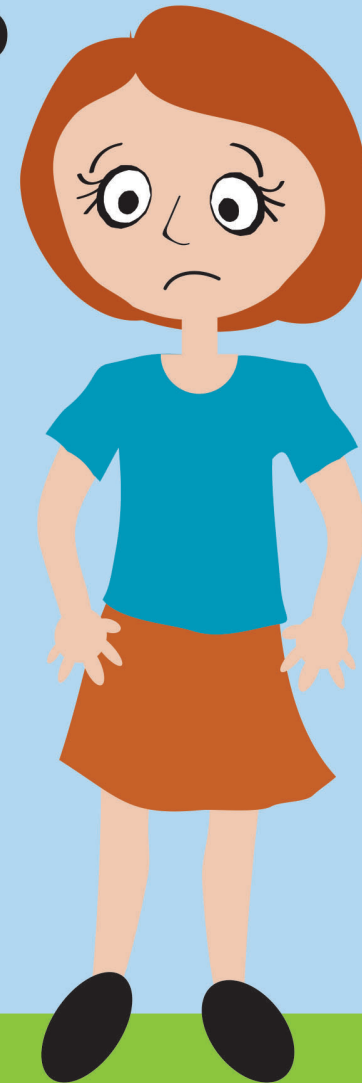


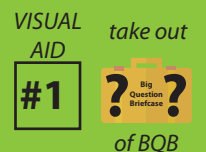


How did bad things come to God's good world?

The Big Question we are investigating today is
Big Question Number 6:

How Did Bad Things Come to God's Good World?
and the Answer is:
Bad Things Came through Sin!

Meaning:

When God created the world in the beginning, He created all things good; but, now there are many bad and sad things in God's good world. All these bad things came through sin when people disobeyed God. How good it is that God sent Jesus to be our Savior! He can forgive our sins and make us God's people!

Unit 6 Bible Verse

"Who would like to get our Bible verse out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the "Bible" with the Bible Verse in it and hand it to you. Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

Romans 5:12, ESV

"Sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned."

Meaning:

Long ago, Adam and Eve disobeyed God's good ways. Oh, such sadness came into God's good world when they did! Instead of living forever in the beautiful world God created, now their bodies would get sick and die. No longer did they enjoy the same special closeness they knew with God. And now everything else in the world would also hurt with sin and death. That's why we disobey God, and why there's so much sadness in the world today. Thank God for sending Jesus to rescue us from sin and death!

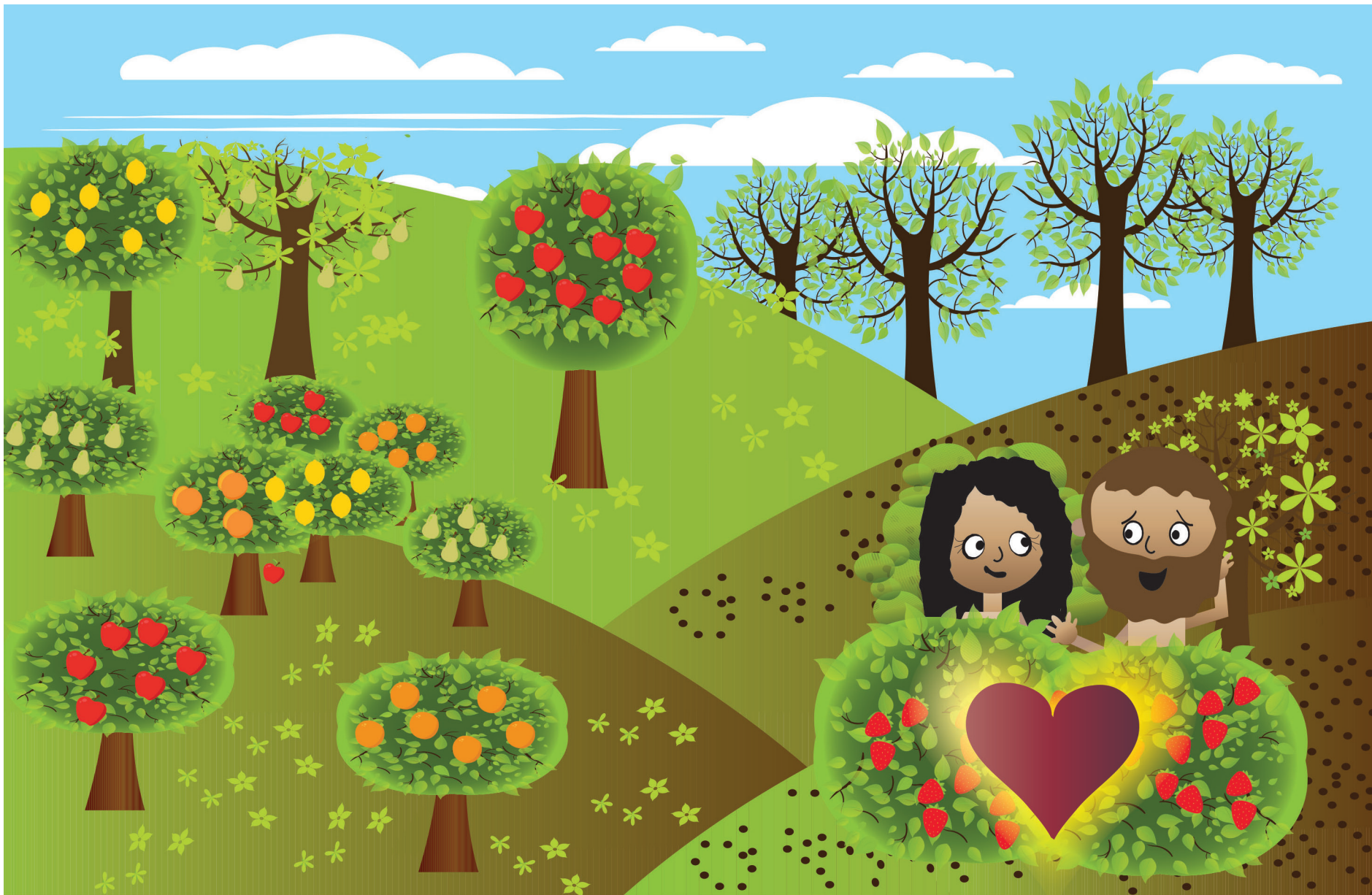
Detective Dan's Listening Assignment #2

1. Adam and Eve were the first people. God, Himself, made them in the very beginning, long ago. He gave them a wonderful home in a beautiful garden. God loved Adam and Eve. Adam and Eve loved God. And everything was happy, happy, happy!

2. But then something very bad happened. Satan --God's enemy-- came. He wanted to spoil God's perfectly wonderful world. He especially wanted to spoil the perfect happiness and wonderful friendship that God had with people. Satan came up with a tricky trick.



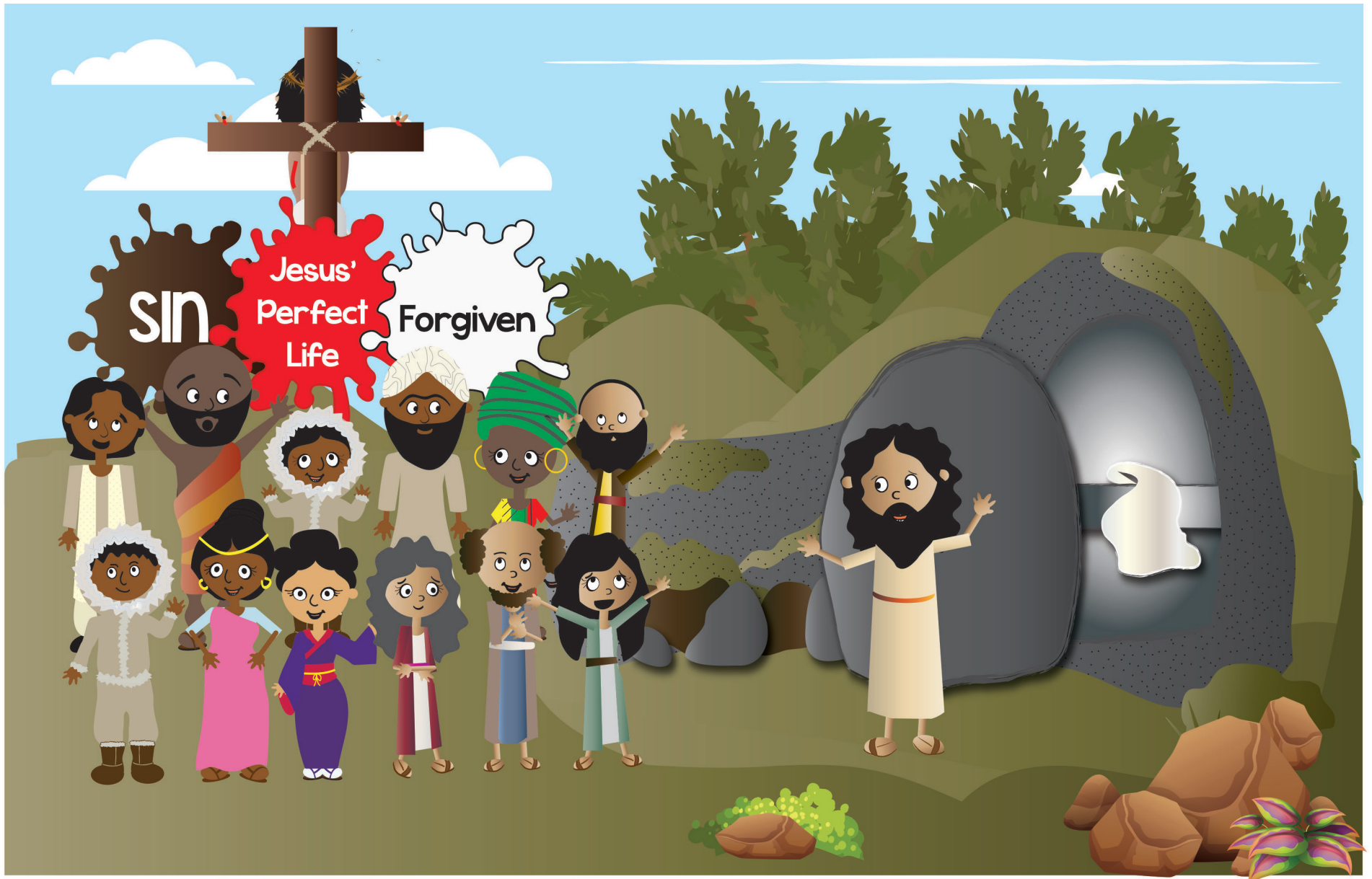
3. Satan used the serpent to try to trick Adam and Eve into disobeying God. The trick worked! Adam and Eve picked fruit from the one tree in the garden God told them NOT to eat. And then, they ate it!



4. Now everything was sad, sad, sad! Sin had come into God's good world. Now, there would be disobeying. Now, there would be hurting, and crying, and dying. Not just for Adam and Eve, but for all people and everything else in God's world. Worst of all, the perfect happiness and friendship that God had with people was broken.



5. It looked like Satan had won, but had he? NO, HE HAD NOT! On that sad, sad day, God gave Adam and Eve a wonderful promise: "One day, I will send a Savior. He will beat Satan. He will save all of God's people from their sins. He will make the way for them to know perfect happiness and have friendship with Me again... and it will last forever!"



6. That Savior was God's Son, Jesus. He came to earth and lived a perfect life. He suffered and died on a cross to take all the punishment that God's people deserved for their sins, so they wouldn't have to. Then on Day Three, He rose from the dead in victory!



7. Jesus had really done it! He beat God's enemy, Satan, that day. He beat sin, sickness, sadness, and even death, itself. Because of Jesus, God's people can know and love God in their hearts: a little of the Perfect Wonderfulness of life with God. But the best is yet to come...



8. Because of Jesus, God's people will get to live with God in heaven forever! And that really will be Perfect Wonderfulness! We can be God's people, too, if we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Ask God to help you. He loves to answer this prayer!
