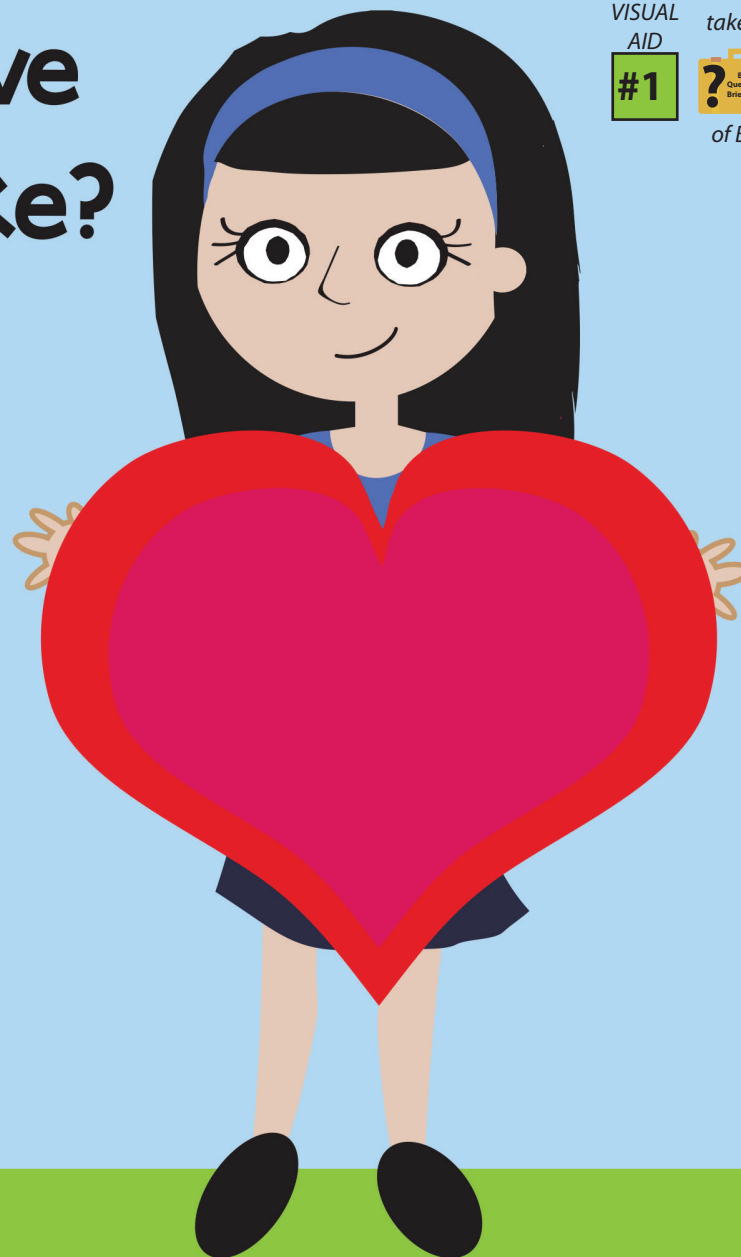

The Big Question we are investigating today is
Big Question Number 8:

What Is God's Love for His People Like?
and the Answer is:
It's More than They Could Ever Deserve!

Meaning:

God has a special people He loves. They come from all over the world. They've lived in every time --from long ago, all the way up to today. And there's millions and millions of them!

There is nothing better than being one of God's special people! God has adopted them as His children. He promises to love and care for them always. They have special closeness with Him in their hearts; and one day when they die, they will go to live with Him forever.

God's people know His love for them is more than they could ever deserve. They know God didn't make them His special people because they were so good. They are sinners who have disobeyed His good laws, just like everyone else. They know that God loves them just because He loves them.

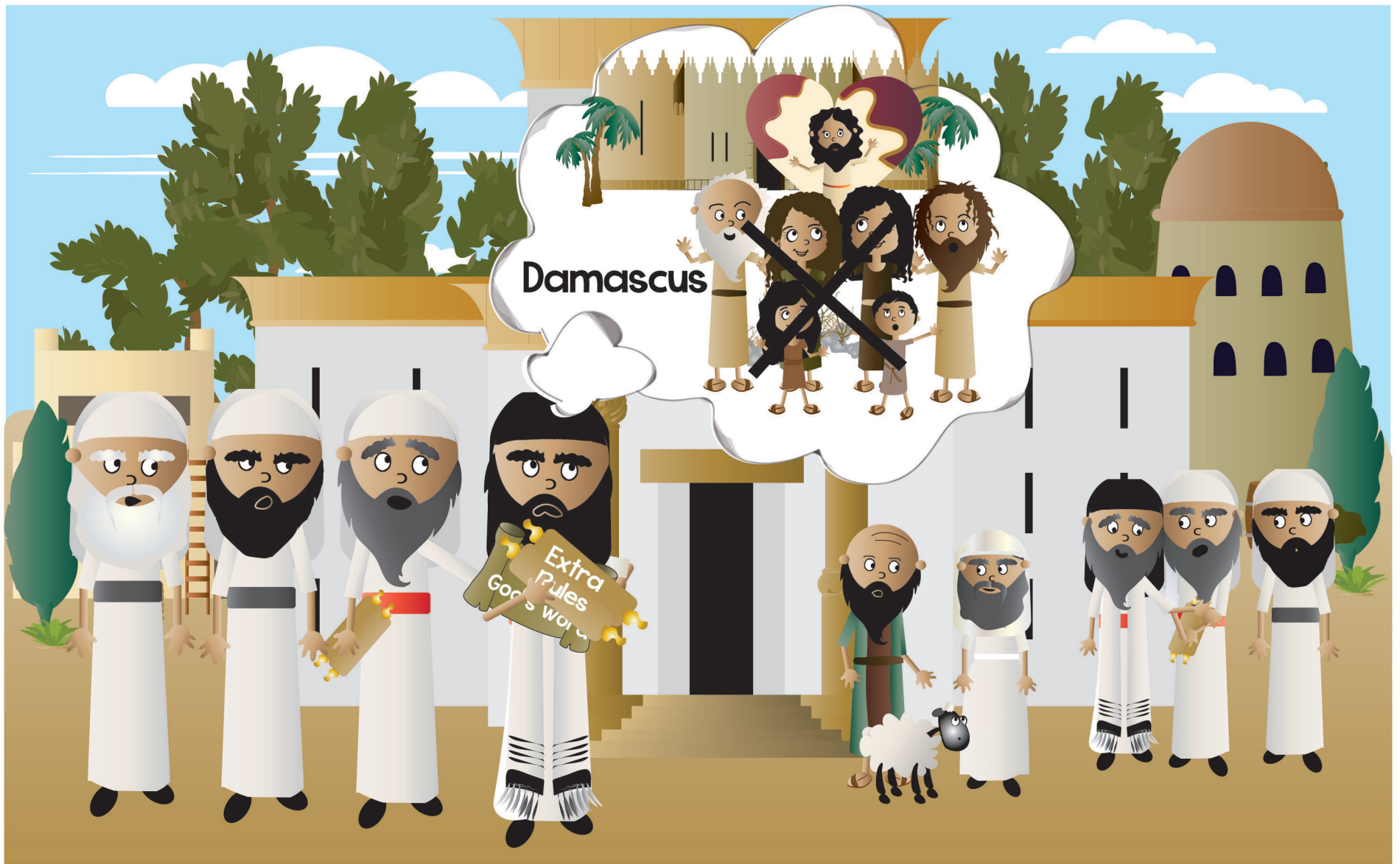

I. Saul was a Pharisee. He tried hard to please God by obeying lots of rules. He didn't think Jesus was God's Son, the Savior. He hated Jesus and the people who believed in Him. Saul would do **ANYTHING** to get the Christians to stop saying one thing: "Jesus is God's Son, the Savior!"



2. "Shhh! Be quiet!" Saul ordered the Christians in Jerusalem. "Jesus isn't God's Son, the Savior!" he told them. "I will hurt you and put you in jail if you say He is." And that's just what Saul did.



3. Saul wanted to get rid of Christians everywhere. "Send me to Damascus," he asked the leaders at the Temple. "I want to get rid of the Christians there, too." The leaders agreed. Saul and the soldiers set off for Damascus. Saul was going to stop those Christians who said Jesus was God's Son. He would make those believers be quiet, once and for all!



4. But Saul was wrong! A bright light from heaven suddenly shone down on Saul. It was Jesus!

"Stop hurting Me and God's people!" Jesus told Saul. "Who are you?" Saul asked in a scared voice. "I am Jesus, God's Son, the Savior!" Jesus told him. Uh oh! The Christians had been right. What would Jesus do to him? Would Jesus hurt Saul just like Saul had hurt the Christians?



5. Saul deserved God's punishment, but Jesus loved Saul more than Saul could ever deserve! The Holy Spirit worked in Saul's heart. Saul turned away from his life of hating. He trusted in Jesus as his Savior. How amazing that an enemy like Saul could become one of God's dearly-loved people!



6. Everything about Saul changed. God even gave him a new name: Paul. Now, Paul would tell everyone about Jesus, too! "Jesus IS God's Son," Paul told them. "How wonderful is His love!" Come trust in Him!" The Holy Spirit worked in the hearts of many as they listened to Paul, and they believed in Jesus, too. This was just what Jesus planned would happen. It was all more wonderful than Paul could ever deserve!

1. How did the LORD love and change the Eager Enemy?

The LORD could have punished Saul for hating Him and being so mean to the Christians. Instead, He showed Saul that Jesus really was God's Son, the Savior. God's Holy Spirit worked in Saul's heart and helped him trust in Jesus as his Savior.

2. Why was it so amazing that the LORD would love him?

Saul deserved God's punishment for how he had hated Jesus and God's people. But instead of punishment, God loved Saul and forgave his sins through Jesus.

For You and Me:

There is no one so bad that God cannot forgive or change them. God can even work in the hearts of people who do not love Him at all. He can work in our hearts, too. He can help us turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.
