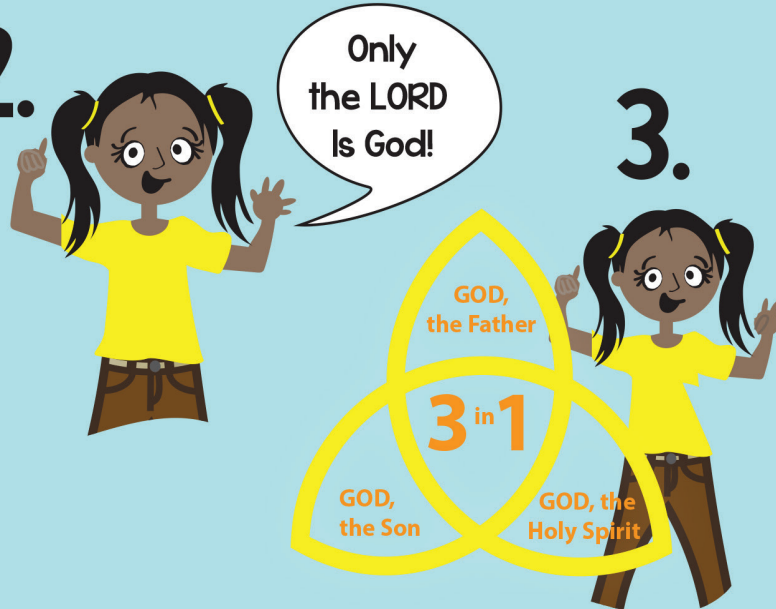

This Unit's Bible Truths

Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

**“Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?
He’s Not Like Anyone Else!
He Is a Glorious ???? !”**

We’re missing one word. Here’s the hint to what the missing word is. It says: “What does God glory shine out from? It starts with an “s” and it rhymes with “hear it.”

Can you guess? It’s “spirit.”

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

**“Can Anybody Tell Me What the LORD Is Like?
He’s Not Like Anyone Else!
He Is a Glorious SPIRIT!”**

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

God is a spirit, great and glorious. We cannot see God’s Spirit with our eyes or touch His Spirit with our hands. So how can we know what God’s Spirit is like? God’s Word, the Bible tells us! The Bible tells us of times, long ago, when God let people see some of His glory--the shiny brightness of His pure goodness and greatness. And, it tells us that God made each of us with a spirit a bit like His great and glorious Spirit so that we can know and love Him.

Best of all, God sent His Son, Jesus to earth, giving Him a body so He could be our Savior. Jesus showed us what God is like. He was fully God AND fully a man, all together in one! How amazing!

Bible Truth | Bible Verse

Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" folder and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

John 4:24 tells us:

Learn a Little: "God is spirit."

What does that mean?

Jesus tells us in these verses that God is spirit. He tells us that anyone who wants to be a true follower, a true worshipper of God, will worship God with the spirit He put inside of us. How do we do this? By turning from our sins, believing in Jesus, the Son of God, and trusting in Him as our Savior. When we do, God puts His Holy Spirit inside our spirit. He works powerfully inside us, helping us to live out our faith in Him by seeking to know Him more and more, and to love Him in everything we do in our lives.

I. King David lived in a big, beautiful house made of the finest stone and wood, but the Ark of the Covenant (the special, golden box where God would meet with His people) lived in a tent. King David didn't like that. "Why should I live in a palace and God meet with us in just a tent! I want to build a fine, worship house for the LORD," he told Nathan, God's messenger.



2. But Nathan told King David, “The LORD says, “No, I don’t want you to build the Worship House for Me. I want your son, Solomon, to build it. He will build it when he becomes king, after you die.”



3. David obeyed the LORD. He did not build the Worship House; BUT, he did do something to get ready for it. King David saved up lots of golden money. He would make sure that Solomon could buy everything needed to build the beautiful Worship House when he became king.



4. At last, David died and Solomon became king. Solomon didn't forget that he was to build the Worship House for the LORD. He went right to work! Solomon hired thousands of workers. He sent some of them to Lebanon, a nearby country where there were the best building supplies. "Go to the forests of Lebanon and cut down lots of the tall, cedar trees. Float them down the sea and bring them here to Jerusalem," the king told the workers.



5. Solomon sent other workers deep down in the earth to get stone. "Go down to the quarries and cut huge blocks of the beautiful, white limestone. Drag them up here," Solomon told others. "This Worship House will be made from the best wood and the most beautiful stone!" he exclaimed. The men worked hard. They brought the wood and the stone to Jerusalem. Now it was time to build!



6. Next, King Solomon searched for the best builder he could find. He chose a man named Hiram. “Hiram, take all of this wood and limestone. Build the best Worship House you can. My workers will help you. Carve it with beautiful designs. Decorate it will fine cloth. Cover it with gold, too. Nothing is too good for the LORD’s Worship House. It will be His Temple,” Solomon told him.



7. Hiram and the workers worked for a long, long time. They used the wood and the stones, the fine cloth, and the gold to make the Temple. The LORD helped Hiram make it just right. Hiram used the white limestone on the outside. It glistened in the sun. It reminded the people of the LORD's glory--the beautiful shiny, brightness that shines out from His Spirit.



8. Hiram used the wood inside the Temple to make walls. He covered the floors and walls in gold. He carved in angels, trees, fruits and flowers. He added beautiful, sparkly jewels. The Temple would remind the people of the beautiful Garden that God gave people at the beginning of the world. There, Adam and Eve enjoyed perfect closeness with God before they disobeyed Him.

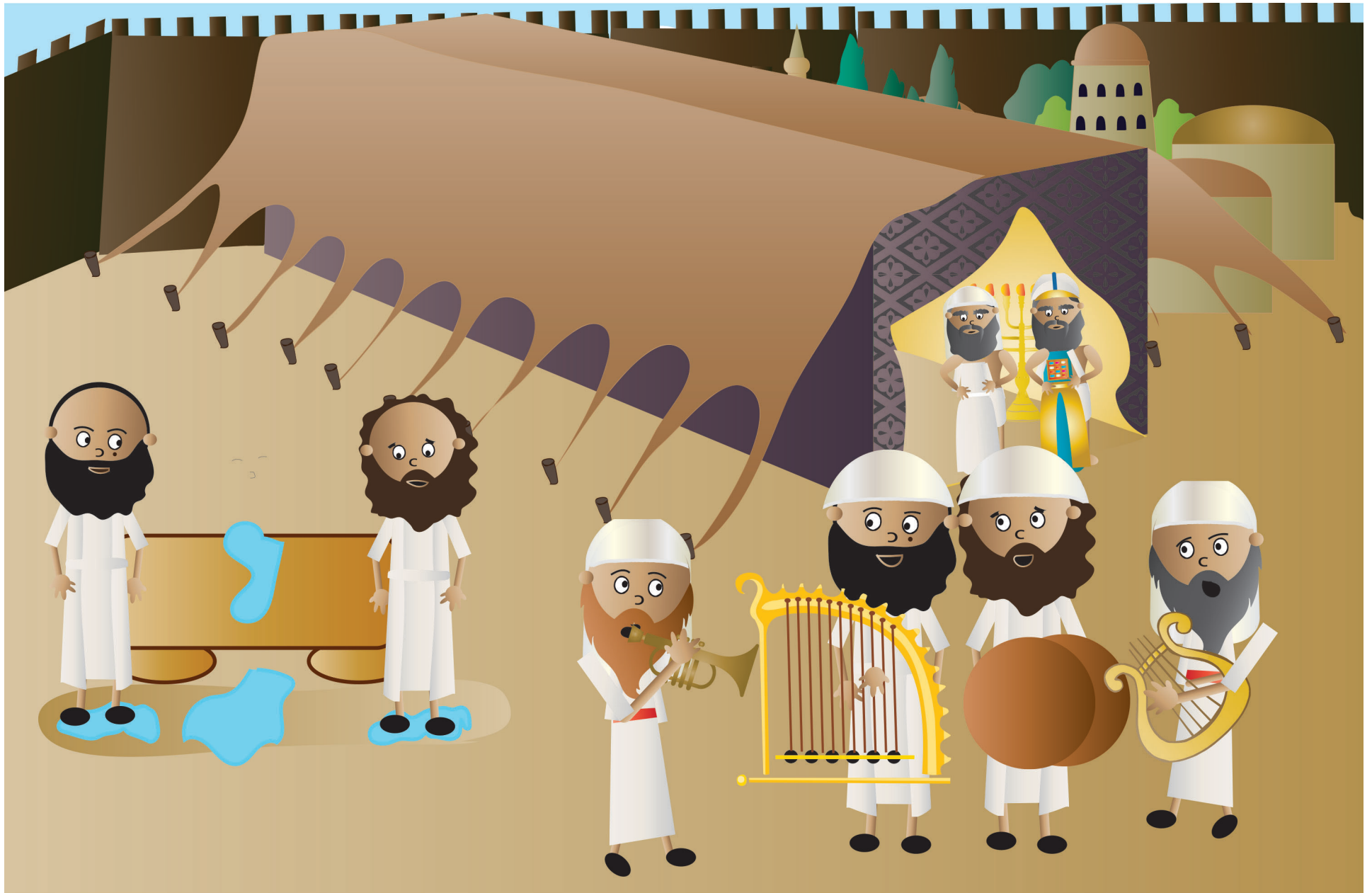
Best of all, was the little room where the Ark of the Covenant would be. God would meet with His people there. It was hidden behind curtains decorated with angels and trees. Everything in this room was covered in gold! When Hiram finished everything, it was time to gather the people.



9. King Solomon sent messages to everyone: "The Worship House is done. It's time to worship the LORD! People, bring your worship gifts of sheep, goats, and bulls. Come and gather with me at the great altar outside the Worship House," the king told them. "Come, priests and Levites! You are the only ones allowed to carry the Ark and other special, worship things into the new, Worship House. It's time to put them in," the king ordered. "Come, worship leaders, get ready to lead us! Wash yourselves and put on your special, white, worship clothes. Get your musical instruments ready to play," Solomon told them. "You're going to lead us all in worshipping the LORD."



10. Everyone did what King Solomon told them to do. “Maa, maa, baa, baa, moo, moo!” The people came with thousands and thousands of worship gifts of sheep, goats, and cows. They gathered together with the King by the altar outside of the Temple, the new Worship House.



II. "Wash, wash, scrub, scrub," the priests, Levites, and worship leaders washed themselves, then put on their special, white clothes. They got out their musical instruments and tuned them up. There were trumpets and cymbals and harps and lyres.



12. Everyone watched and waited by the altar for the bringing of the Ark and other worship things into the Temple. And here they came: the priests and Levites carrying them from the tent to the beautiful, new Worship House. And as they came, King Solomon and the people began to offer their worship gifts to the LORD.



13. The worship leaders set all the golden worship things in place in the big room. Then, last of all, they put the Ark of the Covenant beneath the cherubim in the little room (The Holy of Holies).



14. As the priests and Levites came out of the Temple, the musicians picked up their instruments and began to play and sing, "Praise to the LORD, for He is good, for His love goes on and on and on." How happy they were that the Ark of the Covenant had come home to the new Worship House! King Solomon and the people kept offering their worship gifts. Higher and higher and higher the worship gifts piled up. Oh, how everyone wanted to honor the LORD!



15. Then, shhhh! Everyone got very quiet as King Solomon spread out his hands before God and prayed: "LORD, there is no God like you, in heaven or on earth. You are too great to live in this Worship House. The whole world isn't even big enough to hold You," the king prayed. "But please, LORD, make this a special place where all people can pray to You, praise You, and bring their worship gifts to You. Please have Your presence dwell here. Accept our prayers," he prayed.

THE LORD



16. The LORD heard King Solomon's prayer. He **WOULD** have His presence dwell there in the Worship House. He **WOULD** listen to their prayers and receive their praises and worship gifts!

But **HOW** would King Solomon and the people **KNOW** that the LORD answered their prayers? After all, the LORD is a glorious Spirit. They could not see Him with their eyes. They could not touch Him with their hands. How would they know if His presence had really come to dwell in the Temple, the new Worship House?



17. King Solomon and the people did not have to wait long to find out. Suddenly, there was a bright flash of light and a big wave of heat as the LORD sent down a great fire from heaven. It whooshed down and burned up the huge pile of worship gifts on the altar. The LORD was answering their prayers with one, amazing “YES”!



18. But that was not all. Next, the LORD did something even more amazing than sending that great fire from heaven. Something that would show the people FOR SURE that He had chosen the Temple as His meeting place with them. God showed the people some of His beautiful, shiny glory--the wonderful, shiny brightness that shines out from His Spirit.



19. Yes! King Solomon, the priests, Levites, worship leaders, and all the people watched as God's beautiful glory came down from heaven like a great, sparkly cloud. It covered up the top of the Worship House. And inside, it filled it so full of God's glory that none of the priests or Levites could even go in! Now everyone really knew that the LORD had said "yes" to all of their prayers! He had accepted their worship gifts and showed them some of His glory. His presence **WOULD** dwell in the Temple. He **WOULD** meet with the people there.



20. Then, everyone including the great, King Solomon, himself, fell down flat on their faces and worshiped the LORD. They gave thanks to the LORD, saying, "Praise to the LORD, for He is good, for His love goes on and on and on." And they stayed right there next to the Worship House for seven, whole days, worshipping and celebrating with a big party.
