How Are They Used?



What Do They Include?







There are five, different resources included in this book:



2. The Storyboard Picture Key-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labeled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.



- 3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
- 4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

"Our story is called: The Case of the Big Ten. Here is your listening assignment." Read from Detective Dan's Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

I need to find out:

- 1. What were the "Big Ten"? What made them so big?
- 2. To whom did God give the "Big Ten" to obey?

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is Deuteronomy 5:1,7-21

"Hear, O Israel, the statutes and the rules that I speak in your hearing today, and you shall learn them and be careful to do them...You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself a carved image. You shall not bow down to them or serve them...'You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain...Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy...Honor your father and your mother...You shall not murder. And you shall not commit adultery. And you shall not steal. And you shall not bear false witness...And you shall not covet... anything that is your neighbor's."

I need to find out:

- 1. How did God tell the people of Israel these Ten, Big Rules?
- 2. Why did the people need to know these rules?

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but only 4 of them are in the story.

Our six clues were: a mountain called Sinai, laws written in stone, a tree, clean clothes, a tent, and an airplane. Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

I need to figure out:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don't?
- 2. What did the "Big Ten" laws show the people of Israel they needed to ask God to give them?

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

Answers to questions; the gospel; and, ACTS prayer are included with the story text.

The Case of the Big Ten Exodus 16,19,20

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1)"Praise the LORD! He is the great, one, true God," the Israelites shouted. They had so much to celebrate! God had freed us from their enemies, the Egyptians. He was taking them to a new home, a very special place called the Promised Land. Moses would lead them there. How happy the Israelites were! Life would be good in God's Promised Land.

But before they could go to their new, beautiful home, there was somewhere else they had to go: to great Mt. Sinai, out in the desert. It was there the LORD would meet with them.

Can you guess what He wanted to do?

The LORD was going to make them His people. The LORD would promise to always take care of them and give them everything they needed. The people would promise to love and obey Him. This is how the people would become God's people. This is how they could live happily with the LORD and each other in the Promised Land. First, must come the promises; then, the Promised Land.

(SB2) So tramp, tramp, tramp, they went, across the dry, dusty wilderness. How very hot the sun was, as it beat down on them! There was hardly a cloud in the sky, or a tree on the ground, to give them any shade. Day after day they traveled until at last, they reached Mt. Sinai --the very mountain where Moses had first met with the LORD.

And in the shadow of that mountain, (SB3) they set up their camp. As they worked, Moses headed to the mountain. What was he going to do?

What do you think he was going to do?

Moses was climbing up to meet with the LORD.

(SB5) "It's time to get the people ready to meet Me," the LORD told Moses. "I am holy, and the people are not. I can only meet with them if they are very, very careful. Tell them to set up fences around the bottom of this mountain, so that no animal or person will step foot on it. Have everyone take a bath and wash their clothes. Tell them to prepare their hearts for My coming," the LORD told Moses. "And tell them to do this in the next two days. On the third day, I will come to them."

(Move SB4 back down to camp) Moses went back down the mountain and told the people what the LORD had said. There was much to do in two days! (SB6, SB7) All that fence had to be put in place! All those people (SB8) needed to take baths and wash their clothes! All those hearts must be made ready for the LORD!

Day One passed, then Day Two. Everything was completed. How exciting it must have been as everyone went to bed that second night! The LORD would meet with them the very next day. What would it be like?

What do you think it would be like?

Soon they would know!

Yes, sure enough, the next morning they found out. Sinai was usually a land of bright sunshine and cloudless days, but not this day. The people awoke to (SB9) the sound of loud rumbles of thunder and a blaring trumpet blast. They peered out of their tents to find Mt. Sinai covered in (SB10) thick clouds with great flashes of lightning. (SB11) Everyone trembled with fear.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

(SB12) Moses led the people out of the camp to the very foot of Mt. Sinai. They watched (SB13A,B) great, billowing clouds of smoke rise as (SB14A,B) the LORD descended on the top of the mountain in fire. They could feel the ground under their feet move as the whole mountain shook. The (SB15) LORD, the one, true God, had come to meet with them! (Move SB4 back up mountain) Moses went up the mountain to talk with the LORD.

The trumpet blasted louder and louder, as the LORD and Moses spoke together on the mountain. Then, after making sure the people stayed off the mountain one last time, the LORD spoke in a loud voice for all the people to hear. This is what He said to them:

(SB16)"I am the LORD your God who rescued you from your enemies, the Egyptians. I want to make special promises to you. I will love you and take care of you. You will be My people. But you must make special promises to Me, too. You must keep My laws if you are to be My people. (SB17) Here are My laws:

(SB18) Worship Me alone. (SB19) Don't make gods out of anything you see, in the sky or on the earth around you. Worship Me alone. (SB20) I am the LORD. Honor My name. Don't misuse it. (SB21) Keep one day a week (the Sabbath day) a day of worship and rest. (SB22) Honor your father and mother. Listen to them and obey them. (SB23) Don't murder anyone. (SB24) Don't treat someone else's husband or wife as if they are yours. (SB25) Don't steal and (SB26) don't lie. (SB27) Don't covet. Don't keep longing after something someone else has that you want. Be happy with what I give you."

Do you know what we call these Ten, Big Laws of the LORD?

Can you tell me?

They are called the Ten Commandments.

When the people they saw the lightning and the whole mountain in smoke and fire, and they heard the crashing thunder, the loud, heavenly trumpet, and the voice of God, Himself, how do you think they felt?

What do you think?

(SB28) They trembled with fear! They stayed away from the mountain and said to Moses, "Speak to us yourself and we will listen. We will do whatever the LORD wants us to do. We want to be His people. But do not have Him speak to us. We are afraid we will die, we are so scared by His mightiness and holiness," they exclaimed.

"Don't be afraid," Moses told them. "(SB29) The LORD hasn't come to hurt you. He has come in this mighty way so you will know what He is like and so you will not want to break the good laws He is giving you," he explained. "But I will go and meet with God for you, then I will come back down and tell you what He says."

Away went Moses once more. The people watched as (Move SB14 back up mountain) he climbed up Mt. Sinai and disappeared in the thick, dark cloud to meet with the LORD. Up on the mountain, (SB30) the LORD, Himself, wrote His 10 Big, Laws into pieces of stone and (SB31) gave them to Moses. Then, the LORD told Moses many other laws to teach the people, so they could know how to love Him and love each other. "Write down all these laws, so the people will always know how to love and obey Me," the LORD said.

And that was what Moses did. (SB32) He wrote down all of the LORD's good laws in Bible. God had Moses write them down, so that not just the Israelites, but all peoples, in all times, could know God's laws and how God's people should live. And so by those laws, we could get ready for the Savior. How? By showing us that none of us live as God requires. We all need a Savior, if we are to be God's people. (SB33) That Savior was Jesus, God's very own Son! Jesus came and lived a perfect life. Only He obeyed all of God's laws. He gave His life as the full payment for the sins of all who turn away from their sin and trust in Him as their Savior. He died on the cross for them and rose from the dead in victory! Through Jesus, we can become God's people.

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson 1 Listening Assignment:

1. What were the "Big Ten"? What made them so big? The "Big Ten" were the Ten Commandments that the LORD gave the people of Israel at Mt. Sinai that day. We call them BIG because they are so important. They are the laws behind all of the other laws the LORD would give. They tell us how to love the LORD and love each

Jesus gave His life as the full payment for the sins of God's people when He suffered and died on the cross. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead in victory. He had beaten sin and death for God's people. How can we become God's people? By turning away from our sins and trusting in Jesus as our Savior. Ask Him to help you! He delights to do this!

God is good and loving, wise and fair. He is perfect! God's laws are just like Him. They are good and loving, wise and fair, too. They are perfect!





Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"What Are God's Laws Like?
God's Laws Are Perfect!
They are Written in the ????, God's Word!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "What's the name of God's Word? It starts with a "B."

Can you guess? It's "Bible."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)


"What Are God's Laws Like?
God's Laws Are Perfect!
They are Written in the BIBLE, God's Word!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

A law is big rule that we are supposed to obey. God told His laws to godly people long ago. These people wrote them down in the Bible, God's Word, so everyone can know them. God's Holy Spirit helped them write them down just right.

God's laws are the most important laws of all. They are rules that God wants everyone to keep. That's why God's people take time to learn God's laws and ask Him to help them obey them. They love God and want to please Him. They want to show the world what God is like by living the way He wants us to live.



Bible Truth I Bible Verse

Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" folder and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

Deuteronomy 5:1,7-21 tells us:

Learn a Little: "Hear the rules... learn them and be careful to do them."

What does that mean?

Long ago, the LORD gave the 10 Commandments and many other good laws to the people of Israel. The Israelites promised to keep them. He would be their God; they would be His people. He would bless them and take care of them. These verses are the Ten Commandments (laws) that God gave them. But even though God gave these laws to the people of Israel that day, they are laws for all of us to keep. They tell us how God wants us all to live.

"We've said our Bible verse, now let's sing it!"

About the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?





1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truth, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 3 lessons for each Bible Truth.



- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labeled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.
- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
- 4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

"Our story is called: The Case of the Rotten Innards. Here is your listening assignment." Read from Detective Dan's Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

"Innards" is a funny word that means a person's insides. And in this case, it means a person's heart, meant to love and obey God.

I need to know:

- 1. Who had a rotten heart and knew it? Who had a rotten heart and DIDN'T know it?
- 2. What did Jesus want them all to do?

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is Romans 3:20,21,22,23, HCSB

"For no one will be justified in [God's] sight by the works of the law...But now, apart from the law, God's righteousness has been revealed... God's righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ, to all who believe...For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

I need to know:

- 1. Who thought they were justified (good) in God's sight? Why weren't they?
- 2. What did Jesus want these people to do?

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but two of them are **NOT** in the story.

They are: a drum, a Pharisee, a golden box, a sick man, the Temple, and a bag of money...

Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

I need to know:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don't?
- 2. What did the bad, bad, bad man pray that pleased God? What did God do for this man?

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

Bible Story for Big Question 7, Bible Truth 2 use with all THREE lessons

The Case of the Rotten Innards Luke 18:9-14

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

Many sick people came to see Jesus. (SB1) They came with their limping legs, their blind eyes, their skin with sores, and their bleeding that wouldn't stop. Some of them were about to die. They all came to Jesus, and what do you think Jesus did?

Can you guess?

(SB2) Jesus healed them with God's power! No doctor or medicine needed! "Who has ever healed sick people the way Jesus does?" they exclaimed.

(SB3) People who wanted to hear about God came to Jesus, too. They crowded around Jesus, listening to everything He had to say. Jesus told them about God and His Kingdom. He told them how God wanted them to live. (SB4) They listened to Jesus and were amazed at what He had to say. "Who has ever told us about God the way Jesus does?" they exclaimed.

(SB5) Even people who had done very sinful things came to Jesus. Men and women who had disobeyed God's Ten Commandments in so many ways: people who had stolen money; people who had not loved their husbands or wives; people who had hurt other people; people who had worshipped other gods, and so many more. They all came to Jesus, and what do you think happened?

What do you think?

(SB6) Jesus gave them God's forgiveness, when they turned away from their sins and trusted in Him. "Who has ever forgiven sins the way Jesus does?" they exclaimed.

Sick people, sinful people, people eager to learn about God, all came to Jesus, and He satisfied them. How wonderful, how amazing was Jesus!

(SB7) But there was another kind of people who came to Jesus, too. These people were different from all the rest. They weren't sick. They weren't eager to learn about God from Jesus. And most of all, they didn't even think they were sinners who needed God's forgiveness. They were the important Bible teachers back in Jesus' day. They had a special name for themselves. Do you know what it was?

Can you remember?

They were called the Pharisees.

The Pharisees were smart students, and they studied hard. (SB8) Not only did they learn and try to obey God's Ten Commandments, but they learned and tried to obey the hundreds of God's other laws, too. They spent day after day, week after week, year after year, learning them all by heart! Wow!

But obeying God's laws wasn't enough for the Pharisees. They wanted to be extra careful to please God, so (SB9) they added a lot of extra, little rules for everyone to obey. Rules that God didn't give His people. They added extra rules about washing your hands just right. (Not to get rid of dirt or germs that might make you sick, as we do, but because they thought these specially cleaned hands were how you pleased God.) Those hand-washing rules were just the beginning of what they added to God's laws. There were rules about food to eat or not eat, about giving extra gifts to God, and about what work you could NOT do on the Sabbath Day of Rest (such as not looking in a mirror because you might be tempted to pluck out a gray hair from your head), and lots of other rules. The Pharisees tried very hard to obey all their extra, little rules. (SB10) They wanted the people to obey them, too. They thought those extra, little rules helped everyone keep God's big laws better. They thought those extra rules pleased God and made them good people.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

And most of all, the Pharisees thought God might send the Messiah, the Savior, sooner if everyone was very good, and kept all the little, bitty rules as well as God's big laws. Oh, how they wanted the Messiah to come!

But those Pharisees were wrong about so many things! They didn't realize that the Messiah, the Savior, HAD come already. He was right there, living among them, teaching them about God, and doing amazing things by God's power. Can you tell me who God's Savior was?

Can you tell me?

It was Jesus!

And the Pharisees were wrong about something else, too. (SB11) Instead of becoming good, good, good people when they kept all of these extra little, bitty, rules, these Pharisees became (SB12) proud, proud, proud people! "We are better than everyone else because we do such a good job obeying all these extra, little, bitty rules," many of them thought. "We're so good that we don't need God's forgiveness, as other people do. God is pleased with us just the way we are!" they believed.

Do you think these Pharisees were right? Did keeping all of these extra, little, bitty rules mean they didn't need God's forgiveness?

How very wrong those Pharisees were! All those extra, little, bitty rules they made up didn't please God. Why, even trying very hard to obey all of God's big laws isn't enough to please God! There is only ONE WAY to please God by obeying His laws. Do you know what it is?

It is being PERFECT. That right! It's obeying God's laws ALL THE TIME! Never disobeying ...EVER! Never saying anything wrong or doing anything wrong. Never thinking anything wrong or BEING anything wrong. Do you think that sounds like something those Pharisees could do?

What do you think?

No, the Pharisees could not be this good. (SB13) They had "rotten innards" -- sinful hearts-- just like everyone else. They would never be able to please God by trying to be good.

And guess what? Neither can we. Why? Because every one of us has a sinful heart, too. Every one of us has broken God's laws. We all need God's forgiveness for our sins. That is the only way we can know and please God. That's the only way we can live with God as His people.

But these poor, proud Pharisees would just not see this. They were SURE that they were already good enough to please God, and they were SURE that all those other people who came to Jesus were not. So, what did Jesus do with these proud men who thought they were so good?

What do you think He did?

Jesus loved them, that's what He did. Jesus wanted to help them, just like He wanted to help everyone else who came to Him. So, Jesus told them a story to help them see that they needed God to save them and forgive them, just like everyone else did. Maybe then they would understand that they were sinners and would ask God for forgiveness.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

And this is the story Jesus told them:

"One day, two men went to God's Temple (the worship place) to pray. (SB14) One man was a Pharisee. (SB15) The other man was a tax collector," Jesus said.

"The Pharisee thought of himself as a very good man who pleased God by obeying God's laws and the teachers' extra rules. So, he stretched his arms up high and looked up to heaven and proudly prayed, "God, thank You that I am different from other men, like that tax collector over there. I don't do the bad things they do. (SB16) I am good, good, good. (SB17) I keep all your laws and all the extra rules of my teachers, too," he prayed.

Can you believe that? That Pharisee didn't praise GOD for being good! He only boasted to God about his OWN goodness! That Pharisee wasn't really a good, good, good man at all, was he? No! (SB18) He was really a proud, proud, proud man!

Then, Jesus went on with his story. He told about the other man. "The tax collector came to the Temple knowing he was a bad, bad, bad man. (SB19) He knew he had "rotten innards" -- a sinful heart. He knew the sin in his heart showed in how he lived. (SB20) He had chosen to disobey God's good laws. He had chosen to become rich by taking too much money from people.

And when this tax collector prayed to God, it wasn't boldly and proudly like the Pharisee. No, this man KNEW he had done lots of bad things and he was sad about them. He was sad he had disobeyed God's laws and treated others so badly. He KNEW he wasn't right with God; and oh, how he wanted to be!

The tax collector was too ashamed of his sins to stretch up his arms or look up to heaven to pray. He looked down at his feet, beat his chest, and cried out to God, "God, have mercy on me! I am so bad. I have disobeyed Your laws. I have a sinful heart. Have mercy on me! Please, forgive my sins!"

Then Jesus told the Pharisees listening to Him: "(SB21) The Pharisee went home feeling proud. He was so sure that his life pleased God, but he was wrong. God is not pleased with proud people who don't see that they are sinners who need His forgiveness," Jesus told them.

"But that tax collector, who knew he was a sinner,(SB22) went home forgiven by God," Jesus said. "God loves to forgive sinners --even very bad sinners-- who confess their sins to Him and humbly ask for His forgiveness," Jesus told them.

What did the Pharisees think of Jesus' story? Did they learn from it? Did they see that everyone has broken God's laws, even people, like themselves, who tried really hard to be good? Did they, at last, see that no one can ever do enough good things to be proud before God? Did they see their own sins and ask God to forgive them?

What do you think?

The Bible doesn't tell us what happened with those Pharisees that day. But, we DO know that later, some of these very important teachers --like (SB23) Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus-- DID turn away from their sins and asked God to forgive them. (SB24) They put their trust in Jesus as their Savior. And did you know that these two men were the very ones who put Jesus' body in the cave-grave, after He had suffered and died on the cross?

How amazed and happy they both must have been when (SB25) Jesus rose from the dead on the third day! Jesus really was the Messiah, the Savior, God had sent to save His people and forgive their sins! He had beaten sin and death for all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior.

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

"Innards" is a funny word that means a person's insides. And in this case, it means a person's heart, meant to love and obey God.

I need to know:

- 1. Who had a rotten heart and knew it? Who had a rotten heart and DIDN'T know it? Many of the people who came to see Jesus knew they had disobeyed God's laws and were sinners. They knew they needed God's forgiveness. The Pharisees were also sinners with "rotten hearts," but they didn't know it. They thought they pleased God with all the laws they kept and all the good things they thought they did.
- **2. What did Jesus want them all to do?** Jesus wanted everyone to turn away from their sins, ask God for forgiveness, and trust in Him as their Savior.

For You and Me:

Just like everyone in Jesus' day, we, too, have sinful "rotten" hearts. We all break God's laws and we need His forgiveness. We can have His forgiveness when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God will forgive our sins and make us His people. Ask God to help you! He loves to answer this prayer!

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is Romans 3:20,21,22,23, HCSB

"For no one will be justified in [God's] sight by the works of the law...But now, apart from the law, God's righteousness has been revealed... God's righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ, to all who believe...For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

I need to know:

- 1. Who thought they were justified (good) in God's sight? Why weren't they? The Pharisees thought they were justified in God's sight because they obeyed God's laws and all the extra rules. They weren't justified because no one (except Jesus) keeps God's laws perfectly---and that's the only way to be justified by obeying God's law.
- **2. What did Jesus want these people to do?** He wanted them to understand that they were sinners who needed to turn to God and ask for His forgiveness. He wanted them to trust in Him as their Savior, so they might be saved from their sins.

For You and Me:

Just like the Pharisees, we also cannot be justified (made right with God) by doing good things and trying to obey God's laws. We will never obey them perfectly. We all break God's laws and we need His forgiveness. We can have His forgiveness when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God will forgive our sins and make us His people. Ask God to help you! He loves to answer this prayer!

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but two of them are **NOT** in the story. They are: a drum, a Pharisee, a golden box, a sick man, the Temple, and a bag of money.

Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

I need to know:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don't? The Pharisee, the sick man, the Temple and the bag of money belong. The drum and the golden box do not.
- 2. What did the bad, bad, bad man pray that pleased God? What did God do for this man? He told God that he was a sinner and asked for God to show him mercy. He knew he needed God's forgiveness. God forgave his sins.

For You and Me:

Like the tax collector, we, too, have sinned against God. We need God to forgive our sins. And God will! How? When we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God will forgive our sins and make us His people. Ask God to help you! He loves to answer this prayer!

The Gospel (story wrap-up if NOT using Listening Assignments)

Our Bible Truth is: What Are God's Laws Like? God's Laws Are Perfect... They Show Us that We Need God to Save Us!

How true that is! We learn God's good laws, but we break them! We choose to disobey God. We all deserve God's punishment for our sins! And we know that we can never deserve His forgiveness. How sad! God would have been perfectly fair to give us all the punishment we deserve for breaking His laws. He is holy and good. But God is so rich in mercy. He chose to give us something better than we deserve. He sent His Son Jesus to live a perfect life. Yes! Jesus kept every, single one of God's laws! And on the cross, He suffered and died, giving His perfect life as the full payment for the sins of all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead. He had really beaten sin and death! Because of Jesus, all who trust in Him as their Savior get to enjoy wonderful, special closeness with God as His special people, even now. And one day, they will go to live with Him forever. We can be God's people when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus. Ask Him to help you! He loves to do this!

Close in prayer.

Closing ACTS Prayer

- C God, instead of obeying Your good laws, we have all chosen to break them. Sometimes, we don't obey our parents. Sometimes, we lie. Sometimes, we want things that belong to others. - T Thank You, God, for giving us Your good laws, so we know how to love and obey You. And thank You for sending Jesus to perfectly live out Your laws and to give His life as the perfect payment for the sins of Your people. Thank You that He can be our Savior when we turn away from our sins and trust in Him.
- **S** God, work in our hearts. Help us to turn away from disobeying You and trust in Jesus as our own Savior. Help us to know You and love You with the spirit You put inside us. Help us to learn Your good laws and obey them. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.

God is good and loving, wise and fair. He is perfect! God's laws are just like Him. They are good and loving, wise and fair, too. They are perfect!



This Unit's Bible Truths


"God's laws are perfect is a good beginning, but there's so more to learn. So it's time for us to dig down even deeper for more answers to our Big Question about God. We're going to be learning THREE Bible truths that all tell us more about God's perfect laws.

Who would like to hand me the picture with our three Bible truths on it? It's in the Big Question Box/Briefcase."

Choose a child to get it and hand it to you, then hold it up and show them the pictures of the three truths they will be learning. After everyone has had a good look, say...

"Ok, we've learned one truth about God's laws. It's this one: "They Were Written in the Bible, God's Word." (point to pictures as you identify each Bible Truth). Now let's look at our Bible Truth Clue sign and see if we can figure out which of these three truths we will be learning about today. Who would like to get it out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the Bible Truth Clue sign and hand it to you.



Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"What Are God's Laws Like?
God's Laws Are Perfect!
They Show Us that We Need God to ???? Us!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "What did Jesus do for God's people when He died on the cross? It starts with a "s" and it rhymes with "brave."

Can you guess? It's "save."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:


(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

"What Are God's Laws Like?
God's Laws Are Perfect!
They Show Us that We Need God to <u>SAVE</u> Us!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means: (read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

God made us and He is in charge of us. He expects us to obey His laws all the time. But sadly, we do not. We all are sinners with sinful, selfish hearts. We disobey God's laws. We deserve His punishment for our sins. How we have rebelled against Him and His good ways!

But God is so kind and merciful! He wants to treats us better than we deserve. He sent Jesus to take the punishment for the sins of all who trust in Him as their Savior. God forgives their sins and gives them special closeness with Him in their hearts. And when they die, they will go to live with Him forever in a perfect world where there will never again be any sin. Yes! They will never again sin against Him or break His good laws. They will always love Him and others as He wants them to. How wonderful that will be! Jesus can be our Savior, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior.

Learn a Little: "Apart from the law, God's righteousness has been revealed... righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ, to all who believe."

What does that mean?

"Righteous" is a big word that means that you are right with God. The only way we can be right with God ON OUR OWN is by obeying God's laws perfectly. But, uh oh! This Bible verse tells us that we are all sinners who break God's laws. That means we can't EVER be right with God by obeying God's laws.

But God has made a way for us to be right with Him—through His Son, Jesus. Jesus came and lived a perfect life. He kept all of God's good laws perfectly. He was righteous! And this Bible verse tells us that for all who trust in Jesus as their Savior, Jesus takes away their sins and gives His righteousness to them. That means God treats them as if they had never broken God's laws or sinned—just like Jesus! Wow! Isn't that amazing! Isn't Jesus a wonderful Savior! He can be our wonderful Savior, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Him as our Savior.

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
- 4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

Bible Story for Big Question 7, Bible Truth 3 use with all THREE lessons

The Case of the Do's and Don'ts

Matthew 5,6,22

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1) Rules! Rules! Rules! So many rules for God's people to keep! "Do this! Don't do that!" the teachers in Jesus' day (the Pharisees) taught the people. (SB2) Of course, there were the Ten, Big Laws (the Ten Commandments) that God had given them through Moses. But there were so many more rules than that. Can you guess how many laws the Pharisees counted in God's Word for everyone to obey? Twenty? Fifty? Surely, not a hundred!

What do you think?

It was more than any of those guesses! It was 613! There were 248 DO laws and 365 DON'T laws.

But soon those 613 laws turned into even more, as the teachers made up (SB3) extra ways they wanted God's people to live them out. They made up extra "DO's" like: "DO say a special prayer as you wash your hands when you wake up in the morning, or you won't please God." And extra DON'T's" like: "DON'T use the same spoon to stir milk and cook meat, or you won't please God." What a lot of rules! (SB4) Oh, how they weighed down the people! Who could keep all these rules!

But then, (SB5) Jesus came. He wasn't like any other teacher. (SB6) He healed sick people without using any medicine! (SB7) He brought dead people back to life again! He even forgave people's sins! Jesus simply spoke and God's power did these wonderful things through Him.

Jesus did other amazing things, too, like when (SB8) He made the strong winds and the big waves of a huge storm at sea suddenly STOP and be calm at His command. And, when (SB9) He fed a huge, hungry crowd of people with just two fish and five loaves of bread. Wow!

The news about Jesus spread quickly. Soon, (SB10) many people were coming to Jesus. They came to have Him heal their sick family and friends. They came to see Him do amazing things. And, they came to hear what He had to say about God and His laws. (SB11) Would Jesus be just like all the other teachers? Would He tell them to keep all those Do's and Don'ts? Would He give them lots of extra rules like the Pharisees did?

What do you think?

Soon, Jesus answered all of their questions.

One day, (SB12, SB13) Jesus and a huge crowd of people climbed up, up, up a grassy mountain above the Sea of Galilee. When they reached the top, Jesus sat down and began to teach them about God's laws.

"(SB14) God's laws are very important. They will last until the end of time. I have not come to get rid of even one of God's good laws," Jesus told the people. "Your teachers, the Pharisees, try to please God by adding lots of extra, little rules to God's good laws. (SB15) They think all this rule-keeping will make them right with God, but it's not enough. You need something more than all their extra, little rules to please God. You will need a better righteousness than theirs, if youwant to be God's people," Jesus told them.

Oh, no! This didn't sound good at all! The Pharisees worked so hard to keep all 613 laws in the Bible! And, they made up all those hundreds of extra, little rules, to try to please God, too. How could ANYONE be better than the Pharisees? Was Jesus going to give them even MORE rules to live by? It sure sounded that way.

No, Jesus was not. "(SB16) Your teachers are wrong about their extra, little rules. They just weigh down people. They don't help anyone live as God wants them to live," Jesus said. "I have come to fulfill God's law. I will teach you how to really live out God's laws to please Him," He told the crowds.

"The Do's and Don'ts in God's Word are about how we show love to God and others. These laws start in the heart with love, and they tell us how God wants us to live out that love with our whole lives," Jesus explained.

(SB17) "Some people LOOK like they obey God's laws, but really, they are still breaking them," Jesus told the people. "They do the right thing on the outside, but in their hearts, they are angry or jealous or hateful. God doesn't just look on the outside. He sees inside every heart. He knows the sin that is hiding there. He knows when you are angry or jealous or hateful. What goes on inside your heart breaks God's laws, too," Jesus explained.

The people listened to Jesus and were amazed! Jesus wasn't at all like the other teachers they had heard before. He didn't just give them lots of extra, little rules. He helped them see that God's laws show them how to truly love God and others. (SB18) As Jesus later said: "Love the LORD with all your heart, your mind, and yourstrength. Love others --even your enemies-- as much as you love yourself. Do to them only what you want them to do to you. If you do love the LORD and love others like this, you will be obeying all of God's laws, because that's what God's laws are really all about."

How about that! All of those 10 Commandments, and even all of those 613 laws, really added up to only two: love the LORD and love others. Amazing!

(SB19) I wonder what people were thinking as they climbed down the mountain at the end of the day. Jesus had given them less rules to follow, but they were much harder than all those 613 Do's and Don'ts in God's Word, and all those extra, little rules of the Pharisees. Anyone could remember to wash their hands when they woke up in the morning or to use a different spoon when they stirred the milk and cooked the meat. (SB20) But loving God and others from the heart... that was so hard! How could they ever keep their hearts from being angry or jealous or hateful towards others? How could they really love God most of all? Could they ever really keep God's laws? Could they ever please God and really love God's people, if this was how they must live? There seemed to be no hope.

What do you think?

Well, there WAS no hope, if they had to obey God's good laws of love on their own. But praise God, they did NOT! That's why God sent Jesus! Not just to TELL the people what it really means to live out God's laws. But to DO it, HIMSELF! (SB21) Yes, Jesus lived out God's laws perfectly every day He lived here on earth. He always loved God most of all. He always loved people. In everything He thought, and said, and did, Jesus fulfilled God's law completely. He pleased God with His whole life. Jesus could do this because He was the perfect Son of God. He truly loved God, His Father, and He had come to be our Savior. (SB22)

And what did the Pharisees think about what Jesus taught? They did NOT like it!

They did not like that Jesus said He was God's Son. They did not like what Jesus said about them and all of their extra, little rules. And so, the Pharisees and other enemies worked together to get rid of Jesus. (SB23) They nailed Him to a cross to suffer and die, and to get rid of Him, once and for all.

But God was up to good, even in the bad plans of Jesus' enemies. For on that cross, Jesus offered up His perfect life as the full payment for the sins of all who would ever turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. He took their punishment and gave them His perfect life. Now, they could please God. Not with their own lives, but with His!

(SB24) Jesus died and was buried in a cave-grave that sad day, but did He stay there?

What do you think?

(SB25) No, He did not! On the third day, He rose from the dead. Jesus had really beaten sin and death for God's people!

(SB26) After Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared to His followers and taught them more about God's good plans. Best of all, He told them about God's special gift to help them live out God's law from their hearts. Do you know what that special gift was?

Can you guess?

It was the Holy Spirit!

(SB27) "I am going back home to heaven, but I will send you the Holy Spirit to live in your hearts," Jesus told His followers. "He will fill your hearts with love. He will help you love God most of all. He will help you love others, too. And He will stay with you your whole lives until the day you come home to live with Me forever," Jesus promised them.

And sure enough, not long after (SB28) Jesus went up to heaven, (SB29) He did send the Holy Spirit to live in the hearts of God's people! How they praised God! How happy they were!

God had been so good to them through Jesus! Jesus had lived a perfect life of love and given it to them, so they could be God's people. He had sent the Holy Spirit to live inside their hearts for the rest of their lives. He would change their hearts and help them to obey God's laws and love God and others.

(SB30) And, how they looked forward to the day when they would go to live with Him forever! Then, God will make all things new, even their hearts. (SB31) Then, they will love God and each other perfectly. And at last, God's laws will be perfectly fulfilled, even in them! We can become God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Ask Him to help you!

And on the cross, He suffered and died, giving His perfect life as the full payment for the sins of all who turn away from their sins and trust in Him as their Savior. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead. He had really beaten sin and death! Because of Jesus, all who trust in Him as their Savior get to enjoy wonderful, special closeness with God as His special people, even now. And one day, they will go to live with Him forever. We can be God's people when we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus. Ask Him to help you! He loves to do this!

God is good and loving, wise and fair. He is perfect! God's laws are just like Him. They are good and loving, wise and fair, too. They are perfect!




Who would like to hand me the picture with our three Bible truths on it? It's in the Big Question Box/Briefcase."

Choose a child to get it and hand it to you, then hold it up and show them the pictures of the three truths they will be learning.

After everyone has had a good look, say...

"Ok, we've learned two truths about God's laws. They are: "They Were Written in the Bible, God's Word" and, "They Show Us that We Need God to Save Us" (point to pictures as you identify each Bible Truth). Now let's look at our Bible Truth Clue sign and see if we can figure out which of these three truths we will be learning about today. Who would like to get it out of the Big Question Briefcase for me?"

Choose a child to open the briefcase, take out the Bible Truth Clue sign and hand it to you.



Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"What Are God's Laws Like?
God's Laws Are Perfect!
They Tell Us How to ???? God and Others!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "How does God want us to feel and act towards Him and others? It starts with a "I" and it rhymes with "dove."

Can you guess? It's "love."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)

"What Are God's Laws Like? God's Laws Are Perfect! They Tell Us How to <u>LOVE</u> God and Others!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

The LORD is the one, true God. He deserves our love. He made us to love Him more than anything else. Loving God is the most delightful thing we can do. God gave us His laws so we can know how to love Him. When we obey His laws, we are living out our love for Him.

God made us not just to love Him, but also to love each other. He gave His laws so we can know how to love each other. He tells us to treat others in the same loving way we want others to treat us. When we obey God's laws, we are living out God's love for others. And, we are showing them a little bit of what God is like, that they might seek to know and love Him, too.

Obeying God's laws is not just the right way to live. It is also the happiest way to live with God and with other people. God can help us obey His laws and live in love when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. He gives us a new heart filled with His Holy Spirit and helps us to live in love as He wants us to.

Other Visual Aids

Big Question Box/Briefcase

What You Want

The Big Question Briefcase is a briefcase or other container with these characteristics:

- Ideally, this should be around 17" x 12", but needs to be at least big enough to fit a 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper inside it.
- Have various pockets to put these sheets in
- Is attractive or curious looking to preschoolers
- · Not necessary, but extremely fun, if is has a combination lock

Finding a Briefcase:

You can certainly buy one new, but you always may find a used one at a thrift shop. Or, someone may have one they want to donate. We use one that stores valuables in it and is the 17" x12" size. Very durable and has the lock feature that the kids love.

You also can move away from the briefcase idea and use a little trunk or other box for your substitute briefcase. Just change the name to the Big Question Box, if you use a box instead. A boot box or the cardboard box that 10 reams of copy paper comes in is a great size, if you are using a box.

If you use a box, but want a lock-like feature, that's easy to do. Simply cut "straps" out of felt or vinyl and glue in place to the top and bottom sides of the box on one side, with the top strap overlapping the bottom straps. Add velcro to the top and bottom pieces so that they meet and fasten. Make back "hinges" for the box with the felt/ vinyl straps, too. Or, you can simply add a belt around the box that has to be unfastened before the box can be opened.

Here are some suggestions for decorating a box or even the outside of your briefcase to make it appealing.

Supplies

Your box/briefcase
Plain white contact paper or white cardstock
Colorful wrapping paper
Glitter glue
Markers
Sequins, fake jewels, buttons, rick rack, etc.
Other decorating supplies
Stickers
Glue
Clear packing tape

Directions

- 1. If you are using a box that has wording on it, you will first need to make plain surfaces for decorating and a hinge for the lid. Stick the white contact paper or white cardstock to each side of the box. On the other hand, you can also use colorful wrapping paper. Then, make a lid by sticking the clear packing tape along one long side of the box, attaching the lid to the box.
- 2. Use the craft decorating supplies to decorate the box. If desired, you can put a big question mark on top of the box, but remember that you are working with two and three year olds: the question mark symbol is not very meaningful to them yet.

Making a Flannelgraph Storyboard

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

While you may decide to use sticky tac and stick your storyboard pictures to a white board, it is very easy to make a flannelgraph board. The advantage to the flannelgraph board is that the pictures stick very easily and there is no messing with the sticky-tac.

Supplies

Large Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $36'' \times 48''$ foamboard or corkboard (We actually use a far bigger canvas and attach it to the wall) A science project board with the two sides that fold out makes a good $36'' \times 48''$ board. Small Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $24'' \times 36''$ (to $36'' \times 48)''$ board

Large piece of neutral-colored felt to cover your board with extra to overlap over to the back, if desired. Glue gun and glue sticks

Directions

1. Center felt on front side of board. Turn over. Secure in place with glue.

Making Durable Storyboard Pictures

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

Whether you purchase the Deep Down Detectives storyboard pictures from Amazon or print them off the website (included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book), you will want to find some way to make them more durable. They are used not only as a part of telling the story, but are integral in the story review games. Here's how we make ours durable enough to be used over and over again. **See note below for other simpler options for using these pictures.**

Supplies

Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book (purchased or downloaded)

White cardstock or printer paper (if downloading pictures)

Sticky-back velcro, circles or cut pieces; or sticky tac putty

Laminator or Self-laminating sheets

Sturdy Sheet Protectors, preferably the "Secure Top" kind, like offered by Avery

Flannelgraph pictures for the Bible stories found at www.praisefactory.org with each unit's resources.

Directions

- 1. Purchase from Amazon or download and print out the storyboard figures.
- 2. Cut out flannelgraph figures.
- 3. Laminate the figures.

Special tip: When laminating the big background pictures that are two (and sometimes even three or four) pieces put together, leave a small gap between the two pieces before laminating together. This small space acts like a hinge and allows you to fold up pictures without hurting them into a manilla envelope that fits 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper along with all of the smaller, regular-sized storyboard pictures.

4. If using a flannelgraph board: Stick a piece of sticky backed velcro (ROUGH SIDE) onto the back of each figure. If using sticky tack and whiteboard: simply stick a small amount of sticky tack on the back of a picture when using it. Remove and store sticky tack in airtight container.

Note: Instead of using all of the pictures as separate flannelgraph pieces, you can choose to use only a few (helpful to have 10 for the story review game); you can clump them onto posterboard and make them into picture scenes; or, you can simply use the Storyboard Picture Guide as a single picture. At praisefactory.org, go to DDD Bits and Pieces for a 22" x 28" poster size jpg of this picture guide if you want to create a large version.

The Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder

This is a homemade folder that looks (kinda) like the cover of a Bible. You will use this to put the Bible verse, the Bible Story and storyboard pictures to help make the point that the truths you are teaching them come from the Bible.

Supplies

1 piece of 22" x 28" posterboard (white is fine. Green or brown is nice)

Glue

Stapler and staples or packing tape

The Bible Cover pictures (see online with resources for this unit or from the back of each Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book.)

NOTE: The Bible Cover pictures included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids books cannot be created larger than 8.5" x 11". That means that they will be under-sized for a Bible Folder of the dimensions you are making. However, you can go online to the Deep Down Detectives curriculum and there is a pdf of a bigger version of these covers that will actually fit the size of this Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder.

Directions

- 1. Lay out poster board with long side along the bottom.
- 2. Fold in 2" on each side.
- 3. Take packing tape and tape the folded in 2" flaps to the main section of the posterboard, all the way down.
- 3. Fold up 8 1/2" on the bottom of the poster board.
- 4. Use packing tape to tape this flap in place, all the way down.
- 5. Take scissors and snip through the tape where the flap is attached to the folder. This will give you a bit more room in the folder.
- 6. Fold the poster board in the middle to make the center fold.
- 7. Cut out the Bible Cover Pictures. If possible, laminate these. They will last longer.
- 8.. Glue the two cover pieces to the outside of the folder.
