How Are They Used?



The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids are a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts, telling the Bible stories, and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?



There are six, different resources included in this book:

- **1. Key Concept Visual Aids-** colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truths taught in each unit, the Bible verses, and the Listening Assignments used with the curriculum for each Bible Truth taught in the unit.
- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size.
- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--how you can place your pictures up on your storyboard that works well with the story.
- **4. The Storyboard Pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified on the back for easy reference.
- **5. Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures.
- **6. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.)

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aid. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by unit. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.





Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.
- 2. Put up storyboard figures/add story action cues as you tell the story. Allow the children to help you put them on the board, if desired.
- 3. Include the children in your story with a few questions about what they think will happen or words/concepts that might be new to them.
- 4. Watch the kids for signs that their attention span has been reached. Shorten, if necessary.

INTRODUCTION/ LISTENING ASSIGNMENTS

"Our story is called: The Case of the Costly Children. Here is your listening assignment... " Read from Detective Dan's Listening Assignment signs, but questions are summarized below:

Detective Dan's Lesson #1 Listening Assignment:

I need to find out:

- 1. Whom did God adopt as His dearly-loved children?
- 2. What made adopting them so costly to God?

Detective Dan's Lesson #2 Listening Assignment:

Our Bible Verse is 1 John 4:10

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

I need to find out:

- 1. Whom did God love before they loved Him?
- 2. Whose sins were forgiven by Jesus' sacrifice?

Detective Dan's Lesson #3 Listening Assignment:

I found six clues, but only 4 of them are in the story.

They are: a big promise, the sun, a boat, a man named Jeremiah, soldiers, a cross.

Hold each of them up for the children to see as you identify them.

I need to figure out:

- 1. Which four belong in the story and which two don't?
- 2. Who needed to confess their sins to God? Who needed to ask Him to be their Savior?

Read the assignment questions, THEN SAY,

"Ok, Deep Down Detectives! Put on your best listening ears and see if you can hear the answers to Detective Dan's questions. When I finish telling the story, we will see if we can answer all the questions."

Read the Bible Truth story, answer questions, present the gospel and lead in prayer.

Answers to questions; the gospel; and, ACTS prayer are included with the story text.

Bible Story for Big Question 8, Bible Truth 1 use with all THREE lessons

The Case of the Costly Children Exodus 24, Jeremiah 25, Isaiah 9,42,43,49, Ezekiel 37, Daniel 9, Zechariah 8-14 **Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold,** optional interaction cues in italics) Numbers correspond to storyboard pictures and placement upon the storyboard. Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

(SB1, SB2) The LORD gathered the people of Israel near big, Mt. Sinai and spoke to them: "I have loved you and rescued you from your enemies. I want to be your God. I want you to be my dearly loved people," He told them. "(SB3) I want us to make a covenant together. I want to make big, big promises with you, sealed with blood. Promises that must be kept. "Do or die" promises," the LORD explained.

"(SB4) I want to give you My big promise to always take care of you and give you many good things,"," the LORD told the people through Moses. "I want to give you homes in your own, very special land. A place where you can worship Me and live happily. I will get rid of all your enemies, so you don't have to worry about them again," the LORD told the people.

"But, I want you to make Me a big promise, too," the LORD told them. "(SB5) A promise to love Me and keep all of My good laws," He said.

What would the people of Israel say? What would the people of Israel do? Did they want the LORD to be their God? Did they want Him to take care of them and give them all these good things? Did they want to be His dearly-loved people?

What do you think?

(SB6) Yes, they did! They wanted the LORD to make His covenant with them. And they wanted these promises to be "Do or die" promises, sealed in blood. They wanted to make sure the LORD really kept His word and gave them all these good things He promised. What a wonderful life He was offering them!

Ahh, but there was also the OTHER question they had to ask themselves: did THEY want to make a covenant with the LORD? Did THEY want to promise to love Him and keep His good laws? Remember: their promises were covenant promises, too. They were also "Do or Die," sealed-with-blood promises which MUST be kept. Did they want to make that kind of promise to the LORD?

What do you think?

Yes, they did! The LORD loved them. His laws were good. Why would they NOT want to make this covenant promise with Him?! So they said to the LORD, "(SB7) Yes, yes, yes! We will be Your dearly loved people! We will keep all of Your good laws. We will make a covenant with You—our "Do or Die" promise. We want You to be our God!" they told the LORD.

So, the LORD and the people made a covenant together. (SB8) Moses built an altar at the base of the mountain and (SB9) set up twelve, stone towers— one for each of the twelve, family groups among the people. (SB10) Twelve, young men brought twelve large, worship gifts to offer to the LORD. Everyone listened as (SB11) Moses read the LORD's promises and laws to the people. Blood was sprinkled on the altar and on the people. "We will do everything the LORD has said. We will obey Him and keep the covenant... we will do or die," the people promised. The covenant was made. The LORD was their God, and they were His people.

(SB12) The LORD kept all of His covenant with His people--every one of HIs big, "Do or Die" promises. He (SB13) gave them a special land to live in. He gave them their own homes. He gave them fields full of good food and lots of children. He told them how to build a special worship place so they could meet with Him. And, He protected them from their enemies.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

But what about the people of Israel? Did they keep the covenant promises they made to the LORD?

What do you think?

(SB14) They did NOT! They did NOT love the LORD or keep His good laws as they promised. You see, it is one thing to MAKE a big promise to the LORD and another thing to KEEP it. The people WANTED to be God's dearly-loved people. They WANTED to love Him and obey Him. They WANTED Him to bless them with all the good things He promised to give them. But there was something that the people of Israel had in their hearts--that we have in our hearts, too—that was causing a big problem. Do you know what it was?

Can you guess?

(SB15) It was sin. Yes, ever since Adam and Eve first disobeyed God in the Garden, there has been sin in everyone's heart. Sin that kept those people of Israel from obeying all of the LORD's good laws. Sin that kept them from worshipping and loving Him as they should. Sin that kept them from loving each other the way they should, too. And so, the people broke their covenant to the LORD –yes, that big "Do or Die" promise, over and over and over. And that meant the people no longer deserved to be the LORD's dearly-loved people and He should no longer be their God. What would the LORD do, now that the people had disobeyed?

What do you think He would do?

What would the LORD do? He did plenty! First, He warned them over and over to turn away from their sin. (SB16) He sent godly men like Jeremiah to them, saying, "Remember your big promise to the LORD! He wants to be your God. He wants you to be His dearly-loved people. Turn away from disobeying His good laws. Turn back to worshipping and loving Him! If you do, He will forgive you. If you do not, then He will send punishments to help you turn back to Him," Jeremiah warned them.

Did the people of Israel listen to the LORD's warnings? Did they turn back to worship and love Him? Not really. (SB17 covers up SB13) So at last, the LORD sent punishments. He let their enemies come into their land and destroy their homes and worship place. (SB18) He let them take the people of Israel far away and made them work very, very hard for them.

(SB19) Boo, hoo! Boo, hoo! How sad the people of Israel were! They missed the good things that God had given them. They missed their homes. They missed the place where they worshipped the LORD. They did not like working for their enemies.

But most of all, they were sad that they had not kept their big promise to the LORD. They knew that they had not worshipped or loved Him as they promised they would. They knew that they had not loved others as they promised they would, either. They knew that they should not be His dearly-loved people anymore and He should not be their God. This is what they deserved for breaking their "Do or Die" promises with the LORD. They knew they had sin in their hearts; and at last, they began to turn away from their sins. But was it too late? Was this really the end of the LORD's love for His people?

What do you think?

No, it was not! Even though they should not be God's dearly loved people anymore, God kept on loving His sinful people.

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

The LORD sent godly men like Daniel, Ezekiel and Zechariah to encourage the people with wonderful news: "(SB20) You have broken your promises to the LORD, but He still loves you," they told the people. "Listen to the good plans He has for you: 'I have punished you so you would turn back to Me, but I won't keep on punishing you,' the LORD told them. 'On just the right day, your punishment will be over. I will free you from your enemies. You won't have to work for them anymore. (SB21) You will get to go back to your homes in the special land. You can build a new place to worship Me. I will take care of you and give you good things," the LORD promised them.

"But I have even better plans for you than freeing you from your enemies and bringing you back home," the LORD told them. "(SB22) I'm going to make a NEW covenant with you. A new "Do or Die" promise sealed with new blood. I'm going to beat your even bigger enemy: the sin in your hearts that keeps you from loving and obeying Me!" He promised.

"Yes, I'm going to send you a Messiah, a Savior. He will be My Son. He is going to come to earth. He is going to take the punishment that all My people deserve for disobeying Me. It will be gone for good. His blood will take away their sins. His blood will seal this new "Do or Die" covenant. (SB23) Then I will give My people new hearts filled with My Holy Spirit. Then all My people, from every place in the whole world, will be saved to know Me and love Me and obey Me. And one day, they will even live with Me, forever happy," the LORD promised. "This covenant will last forever."

What wonderful news this was! (SB24)The people of Israel were so happy! They believed God's big promise to free them from their enemies. They believed His promise to send them back home to their special land.

And, they believed that one day God would send a Messiah, a Savior, to beat their biggest enemy of all: the sin in their hearts that kept them from loving and obeying Him.

The people waited and waited. They looked for the day God promised. And, at last, it came! They left working for their enemies and (remove SB17 and uncover SB13 again) went back home to their special land. They built new homes, and they built a new place to worship God. Then they waited and waited some more. They waited for the day the Savior would come. And while they had to wait a very long time, at last, that day came, too.

Who was the Messiah, the Savior, God's Son? I bet you know His name?

Can you tell me?

It's Jesus! That's right. (SB25) Jesus was born a baby in Bethlehem. He grew up, up, up until He was a man. And what a man Jesus was! He kept all of God's laws His whole life. (SB26) He was perfect! And what did Jesus do with that perfect life? He did just exactly what God promised He would do. (SB27) He saved all God's people when He took the punishment for their sins on the cross. (SB28) With His own blood He sealed the new covenant that God was making with His people. A covenant that couldn't be broken EVER, because it was the blood of God's perfect Son, Himself, that was keeping the promises for God's people.

Yes, Jesus suffered and died on the cross that day. (SB29) He was buried in a cave grave and watched over by guards. But that was not the end of the story, was it? What would happen on the third day?

Can you tell me?

On the third day, (SB30) Jesus rose from the dead, never to die again. He had really done it! He had beaten sin and death for God's people, once and for all! How great is God's love for His people! Even though they do not love Him or obey Him as they should, He loved them more than they deserved. He loved them so much that He chose to send His Son, Jesus, to save them from their sins, so they (SB30) could know Him in their hearts now, and one day, (SB31)go to live with Him forever. We can be God's people, too, if we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Ask Him to help you. He loves to answer this prayer!

Bible Story for Big Question 8, Bible Truth 1

Cracking the Case: (story wrap-up for Listening Assignments)

It's time to see how we did with our Listening Assignment.

Detective Dan's Lesson 1 Listening Assignment:

1. Whom did God adopt as His dearly-loved children?

All who would turn from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. His promises began with the people of Israel, but have spread out to include people from the whole world.

2. What made adopting them so costly to God? God adopted them by paying for their sins, Himself, when Jesus suffered and died on the cross.

For You and Me:

We, too, can become God's dearly-loved, adopted children when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

Detective Dan's Lesson 2 Listening Assignment: Our Bible Verse is: 1 John 4:10

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

- **1. Whom did God love before they loved Him?** God loved all His people before they loved Him—the people of Israel, and all others who would turn to Him and trust in Jesus as their Savior.
- **2. Whose sins were forgiven by Jesus' sacrifice?** All of God's people--all who would turn from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior.

For You and Me:

We, too, are sinners who have broken God's laws. We, too, deserve His punishment for our sins. But the good news is that we, too, can be forgiven our sins when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

Detective Dan's Lesson 3 Listening Assignment:

Our six clues were: a big promise, the sun, a boat, a man named Jeremiah, soldiers, and a cross.

1. Which four belong in our story?

The big promise, the man named Jeremiah, the soldiers and the cross belong. The sun and the boat do not.

2. Who needed to confess their sins to God? Who needed to ask Him to be their Savior? The people of Israel.

For You and Me:

Like the people of Israel, we, too, are sinners who have broken God's laws. We, too, deserve His punishment for our sins. But the good news is that we, too, can be forgiven our sins when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

The Gospel (story wrap-up if NOT using Listening Assignments)

Our Bible Truth is:

What Is God's Love for His People Like? It's More than They Could Ever Deserve... God Gave His Son, Jesus, to Save Them!

Just like God's people from long ago, we do not love God or obey Him as we should. We deserve God's punishment, too, don't we? But the good news is that when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior, He will save us, too! We will be His dearly-loved people—His adopted children. He will give us new hearts that want to love and obey Him. And one day, at just the right time, we will go to live with Him in heaven, forever happy!

- **C** God, we should be filled with love for You and Your good ways, but so many times we are not. We need a Savior!



Revealing the Bible Truth We Are Learning

Hold up the front side for the children to see. Cover up the answer, written along the bottom, and say:

"What Is God's Love for His People Like?
It's More than They Could Ever Deserve!
God Gave His Son, ????, to Save Them!"

We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "What's the name of God's Son? It starts with the letter "J."

Can you guess? It's "Jesus."

So the Bible Truth we are learning today is:

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)


"What Is God's Love for His People Like?
It's More than They Could Ever Deserve!
God Gave His Son, JESUS, to Save Them!"

And here is what this Bible Truth means:

(read the meaning off of the back of the sign, say:)

All people have rebelled against God and have broken His laws. All have chosen to do things their own way, instead of God's way. Their hearts should be full of love for God; but instead, their hearts are dead and empty of love for God and His good ways. That's why all people deserve God's punishment for their sins. They deserve to be separated from Him forever. How sad!

But God is so kind and merciful! He chose to save sinners, like you and me, even though we did not deserve it. Yes, God chose to love sinners, even though their hearts were so dead and empty of love for Him. And He didn't just love them a little bit. He loved them a lot! He loved them so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to live and perfect life and give it up as the full payment for their sins when He suffered and died on the cross. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, proving He had really done it! He had redeemed sinners, so that they could become God's special people—His, dearly-loved, adopted children forever! We can be God's special people, too, if we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. Hasn't God loved us so much through Jesus!



Bible Truth I Bible Verse

Remove the Bible Verse Picture from the "Bible" folder and hold it up for all the children to see, then say:

1 John 4:10 tells us:

1 John 4:10

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

Learn a Little: "[God] sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

What does that mean?

We are all sinners who have rebelled against God, yet God chose to love us, and to love us in the deepest way possible! He sent Jesus to save us. Yes, God sent His dearly-loved Son to earth to be the propitiation for our sins. He was the atoning sacrifice that would pay for our sins and satisfy God's judgment against us. Jesus would live a perfect life, then offer it up as the full payment that would bring the forgiveness we needed. And He chose to do this while we still were rebelling against Him! How wonderful is this free gift of God! How deep is His love! This atoning sacrifice is for us, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.


How Are They Used?




The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?







- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Ahead of time:

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

"(SB1) Boo hoo! Boo hoo!" Naomi cried. (SB2) Her husband had died. Her two sons had died. Naomi (SB3) was so sad. She missed them so much!

But Naomi wasn't just sad. (SB4) She was scared, too. Only (SB5) Orpah and Ruth, the wives of her sons, were left. Surely, they would go back home to live with their mother and father. That's what wives did back then when their husbands died. They knew that their mother and father would take care of them.

But poor Naomi, she didn't have a mother or father to go home to. And she was far, far away from her home in Bethlehem. Who would take care of her? Who would see that she had food to eat and clothes to wear? How would she get back home all by herself? What was Naomi to do? This is why Naomi was so scared.

Who do you think could take care of her?

Naomi was right to be sad. It is a sad thing when your husband and sons die. But, (SB6) Naomi did NOT have to be scared. She did NOT need to worry about who would take care of her. Why? Because (SB7) Naomi was one of God's people. She knew God's Word, the Bible. She knew God's promises to always take care of His people. She could trust Him to take care of her, even though she didn't know how.

But right then, all Naomi could think about were the sad things that had happened to her. She thought about all these sad things and decided that God had stopped taking care of her.

Do you think God had really stopped taking care of her?

How wrong Naomi was! God had NOT stopped taking care of her. He is so kind to His people. He treats them better than they deserve. He would treat Naomi better than she deserved, too. So, even though Naomi was scared and did not think God would take care of her, He most certainly would. Let's find out how.

At last, it was time for (SB8) Naomi to say goodbye to Orpah and Ruth, the wives of her sons. It was time for them to go live with their mother and father. It was time for her to make the long walk all the way back home to Bethlehem by herself.

"Goodbye, Orpah! Goodbye, Ruth!" Naomi told them. She kissed them goodbye and they all wept aloud. They were sad to leave each other.

"Wait," said Orpah and Ruth. "We won't go back home to our parents. We will go with you instead. We will walk with you all the way back to Bethlehem. (SB9)We will take care of you," they offered.

"(SB10)No," Naomi said. "You must go home to your father and mother," she insisted. "Where I am going there is no one to take care of me and there will be no one to take care of you either. Not even God will take care of me," she said.

Oh, Naomi! You shouldn't say that! You know God's Word, the Bible. You know that (SB11) God promises to always take care of His people. He will take care of you! Keep trusting in God!

And so, God did, even though Naomi did not trust Him to take care of her. God loves His people so much that He treats them better than they deserve. He would treat Naomi better than she deserved, too. For, though (SB12) Orpah said goodbye to Naomi and went home to her father and mother, God had given Ruth a special love for Naomi and for Himself. (SB13) Ruth clung to Naomi and said, "Please don't make me go back home! (SB14) I want to worship your God. He's the one, true God. I want to take care of you the rest of my life! (SB15) Please let me go back home with you to Bethlehem!" she begged. What would Naomi do now?

What do you think she did? Would she let Ruth come with her?

Naomi looked at Ruth. She could see that nothing would change Ruth's mind. Ruth refused to go home to her father and mother, so Naomi agreed. Ruth could walk the long walk to Bethlehem with Naomi. Ruth could take care of Naomi her whole life. God was showing Naomi that He WOULD take care of her --and He would take care of her through Ruth-- if Naomi would only see!

Together, Naomi and Ruth walked to Bethlehem. (SB16) Up mountains and down mountains. (SB17) Through green valleys, along dusty roads, and beside grassy fields they walked. On and on and on. At last, (SB18) they came to Naomi's home in Bethlehem.

(SB19) Many people came out to greet Naomi. It had been so long since they had seen her! But when they looked at her, they were surprised at what they saw. "Is this really Naomi?" the women asked. "She seems so different! Where is her husband? Where are her sons? Where is her smile?" they wondered.

Naomi told them her sad news. "(SB20) My husband and sons have died. I am all alone. I am so sad that (SB21) I want you to stop calling me 'Naomi'. That name means 'happy things.' I want you to call me 'Marah' now," she told them. "'Marah' means 'bitter (sad) things.' This is a better name for me since God has filled my life with so many sad things. I don't even think He cares about me anymore," she told them.

Oh, Naomi! You shouldn't say that! You know God's Word, the Bible. (SB22) You know that God promises to always take care of His people. He will take care of you! Keep trusting in God! Yes, there are sad things in your life, but there are good things in your life, too. God helped you get safely back home to Bethlehem. He gave you Ruth to take care of you your whole life. No, Naomi would not. Naomi certainly didn't deserve for God to keep on taking care of her, but He kept on taking care of her anyway. God loves His people so much that He treats them better than they deserve. He would treat Naomi better than she deserved, too. And so God did, and in bigger ways than Naomi could have ever dreamed!

God (SB23) provided Naomi and Ruth with food to eat from the barley fields of (SB24) a rich man named Boaz. (SB25) Boaz loved God; and before long, (SB26) he loved Ruth, too. (SB27) He married Ruth, and brought her and Naomi to his home to live with him. Boaz (SB28) shared all he had with them. How richly the LORD took care of Ruth and Naomi through Boaz!



And here is what this Bible Truth means:

Everyone who turns away from their sins and trusts in Jesus as their Savior becomes one of God's people. And they don't just become one of His people! He makes them His adopted children! God becomes their Father in heaven. They are part of His family forever!

God is kind to give us a mother and father, and even sisters and brothers, in the families we are a part of, here on earth. What good gifts they are! They love us and care for us, the best they can. God helps them love us.

But no matter how good and loving our parents might be here on earth, they will never love us or take care of us as well as God can. God is the best Father we can ever imagine. He is perfect! He is all-wise: He always knows what is best for His children. He is always faithful: He always gives them what He promises them. He's all-powerful: He can always give His children everything they need and so much more. He is all-loving: He only does what is good for them.

God's adopted children never need to worry. They know that God, their Father in heaven, is always with them, always taking care of them. We can become one of God's children, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. God loves to help us become His children!

About the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids

How Are They Used?



The Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book is a companion resource to be used alongside the Deep Down Detectives Core Curriculum book for each unit. These colorful pictures are used in presenting the key concepts; telling the Bible stories; and, in playing the Bible Story Review games.

What Do They Include?





1. Key Concept Visual Aids-- colorful signs of the Big Question and Answer, the Bible Truth, the Bible verse, and the Listening Assignments to use with the 3 lessons for each Bible Truth.



- **2. The Storyboard Picture Key**-a who's who of the pictures in thumbnail size. Some pictures are labeled "BG." These are your background pictures that you put on the storyboard before telling the story. The rest of the pictures are labeled "SB." These are pictures you put up on the storyboard as you tell the story.
- **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Story-telling Tips

Ahead of time:

- 1. Read the Bible verses and story. Pray!
- 2. Choose story action cues and/or prepare storyboard figures, if using. (Included in Visual Aids book)
- 3. Practice telling story with the storyboard pictures, timing your presentation. Shorten, if necessary.

During your presentation:

- 1. Maintain as much eye contact as possible as you tell the story.

Alway feel free to use less pictures, if it's best for your kids. Simply black out the numbers next to pictures you do not plan to use. All pictures are found in the Visual Aids book. Put BG (background) pictures on storyboard ahead of time. SB pictures (listed below in story text) are added to board as you tell the story. These numbers are also found on the back of each picture.

Tip: Stack pictures in numerical before telling story for easy use. Use sticky-back velcro to attach pictures to storyboard felt. Use sticky-tac putty to stick a picture on top of another picture.

This story takes place in Jerusalem. Jerusalem was a beautiful city with thousands of people living in it. It had (SB1) big, tall, stone walls all around it and big, wide gates where important men would talk about important things. It had (SB2) lots of houses, big and small, along its twisty-turny, narrow, cobblestone streets. It had (SB3) fountains of sparkling water to drink from and pools of water to wash in. It had (SB4) a big marketplace where farmers would sell their delicious fruits and vegetables, and shepherds would sell their baa-ing sheep and maa-ing goats. Bakers would sell their warm, tasty bread there; and merchants, their fine-feeling fabrics, and glittering necklaces from other parts of the world.

But Jerusalem was most famous for (SB5) its big, beautiful building made of glittering, white stones. It was the LORD's special worship place. Do you know what this building was called?

Do you know?

It was called the Temple. (SB6)People would come from far and wide to worship the LORD at the Temple with their prayers and their songs and their worship gifts. They would gather in the courts around the Temple and listen to teachers tell them about the LORD and His good laws.

Not too far from the Temple lived (SB7) a man and his wife. How happy this man and his wife were! Why do you think they were so happy?

Can you guess?

They were so happy because the wife had just had a baby. It was a baby boy. Oh, what good news this was!

"Yay! Yay!" the man and his wife thought. "We have a boy! We will love him and care for him. What a joy that will be! He will be a great help to our family, too. He will grow up strong and will help us make money to take care of our family, as sons always do." What a lot this man and his wife had to celebrate!

But soon the man and his wife weren't happy anymore. (SB8) They were sad! There was something wrong with their baby boy's eyes. He couldn't see. Perhaps his eyes would get better, they must have hoped. But soon it was clear: their little boy's eyes would NOT get better. He would always be blind.

How sad this man and woman were for their little boy! He would never see their faces. He would never see Jerusalem's big, tall walls or gates. He would never see its houses along the narrow, cobblestone streets. He would never see its fountains or pools of sparkling water. He would never see its markets filled with good food and supplies. He would never see the beautiful Temple where people came to worship the LORD.

And to make things worse, this little boy would never be able to help his father make money to take care of the family. All he would ever be able to do is sit on the side of the street and ask people for money. Yes, this boy's blindness was very sad, indeed!

But there was something else that made the man and his wife sad. It was what other people said about their family. Some people saw the little, blind baby, and kindly said, "(SB9) It is sad, sad, sad, that this little baby can't see. How hard that must be for him and his mother and father!" And, of course, the man and his wife had to agree. This blindness was sad, sad, sad! What good could come out of this blindness? It brought sadness! Only sadness!

Was this true? What terrible thing had they done? Oh, how hard it was for the man and his wife to hear people say this! Oh, what badness came from this blindness! It brought sadness! Only sadness!

So I guess you can see why the man and his wife, who had been so very happy, weren't very happy at all anymore. Their hearts were full of sadness for their son and about all the terrible, wrong things the teachers were saying about their family.

Year after year went by. The (SB11) little boy grew up and up and up, until at last he was a full grown man. He still was blind, but over the years, he had learned his way around the Jerusalem.

What do you think he could feel and hear and taste?

(SB12) He knew the feel of Jerusalem's big, tall walls and its huge gates. He knew the feel of the cobblestones under his feet, the touch of the stone sides of the houses on his hands, and the fresh coolness of the shade in the narrow streets. He could splash the water on his face and sip it in his cup. He could taste the delicious fruit and hear the animals "baa-ing." He could smell the freshly baked bread and feel the silky fabric of the merchants. And (SB13) as he sat beside the road to the big, beautiful Temple, he could feel the swish of people's clothes and the slap of their sandals as they went by. He heard the clink of the coins they tossed in his begging cup, on their way to worship the LORD.

But sometimes, he also heard (SB14) people say those terrible, wrong words again: "There's that man who has been blind from birth. What terribly bad thing his family must have done for God to punish him like this!" they would exclaim.

This blindness was sad, sad! What good could come out of this blindness? It brought sadness! Only sadness!

But then one Sabbath day, everything changed. The people who said those things were WRONG! That baby wasn't born blind because he or his parents had done something terribly bad No! God had always had a beautiful, big plan to use their sadness for good --great good! And this was to be the day that God's good plan would be made know to the blind man, his parents and oh, so many other people in Jerusalem. And God would use Jesus to do this!

The happy man went home to share the news with his father and mother. What did he see as he went home? He saw the pool of sparkling water! He saw the big, tall walls and the huge gates. - **3. Storyboard Suggested Picture Placement** page--where to place the pictures on your storyboard.
- **4. The pictures, themselves.** Notice that each picture is identified and numbered on the back for easy reference. The numbers correspond to the numbers in the Picture Placement Key and in the actually story script (found in the Core Curriculum book.)
- **5. Directions** for making the Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder and the **back/front images** to paste in place when making it. (Larger back/front images are found online with the curriculum.) **Directions** for how to make a homemade flannelgraph storyboard and sturdy storyboard pictures are found in **Appendix E in the Core Curriculum book.**

Ready, Set, Rip It Out!



This book is meant to be ripped up and made into your visual aids. The key concept signs can be cut out and laminated or slipped into sheet protectors. Cut out around the storyboard images and ideally, laminate these. Some of the biggest pictures actually need to be stuck together, before laminating.

Store It!



Deep Down Detectives is a curriculum that can be used over and over. Store your visual aids and storyboard pictures after using them and they will serve you for many years. We store ours in manilla envelopes and then put them (along with all the rest of the curriculum) in magazine files, labeled by Bible Truth. If you have multiple classes using the curriculum, store each set of resources in separate manilla envelopes. This will make prep much simpler, second time around.

Replacement Storyboard Pictures



You can always purchase this book again or simply go online and print out any pictures that go missing.

Two Sizes of Storyboard Pictures



There are two sizes of storyboard pictures to choose from: the standard, large format pictures; or, the smaller format pictures. The larger pictures are best for a big classroom and a storyboard that is at least 36" x 48." (We actually make a whole section of a wall into a felt storyboard!) The small format pictures are created to fit smaller storyboards--in the 24" x 36" to 36" by 48" range. They are most useful in the smaller class or for use at home.

Ahead of time:

Our story today is about one of the most famous people in the whole Bible. Let me tell you some of the good things he is famous for. Maybe you can guess his name.

When this man was just a boy, (SB1) he took care of his father's sheep. He made up many beautiful songs about God. He sang them and played them on his harp as he watched the sheep. This boy was a very good and very brave shepherd. (SB2) He even fought off lions and bears with his sling and sometimes with his bare hands!

A few years later, (SB3) this young man faced a giant soldier named Goliath. Goliath was threatening the armies of Israel and shouting out terrible things about the LORD. All the soldiers of Israel were too scared to fight Goliath, but not this young man. With his sling and one, smooth stone, the LORD helped him fight Goliath and (SB4) win. (SB5) King Saul saw how brave he was and made him one of his greatest soldiers!

This young man grew up to be (SB6, SB7) a great king, himself. He took good care of the people of Israel for many years. He captured the beautiful city of Jerusalem and built a fine palace there. How God blessed the people of Israel through this man!

But even though life was so good, this man never forgot the LORD. He (SB8) kept writing songs to the LORD. He sang them and he shared them with other people to sing, too. Sometimes thousands of people would sing his songs as they gathered together to worship the LORD. Many of his songs are written down in the Bible, God's Word, and we still enjoy reading them and singing them today.

Can you guess the name of this very famous Bible man? I bet you can!

Can you guess?

His name was David! And yes, he was a man who did many good things, even great things.

But did you know that David was also a man who suffered some very sad things, too? David had many enemies who tried to kill him, (SB9) including King Saul, the very king David had once served so faithfully. Saul was jealous of David and wanted him dead. (Move BG3 to reveal SB10) He and his soldiers chased David for years, trying to kill him, even though David never did anything wrong to him.

And, don't think David never did anything bad, because he did. He was a sinner just like the rest of us! When David became king, he (SB11) saw a beautiful woman named Bathsheba and he took her to be his. But (SB12) Bathsheba was already the wife of Uriah, one of his bravest, most faithful soldiers. David (SB13) made a tricky plan to get rid of Uriah, so he could hide what he had done. He (SB14) had Uriah killed in a fierce battle, so it would look like it was an accident! Then, (SB15) David took Bathsheba to be his own wife.

One of David's greatest sadnesses came from his son, Absalom. Absalom turned against David. (SB16) Absalom made a tricky plan to get rid of David, so he could be king in David's place. Absalom turned many of the people against David, too. (SB17) David had to run away from his palace in Jerusalem and hide in the wilderness. (SB18) Many people wept as David left Jerusalem; but others, like Shimei, called David bad names, and even threw rocks at him.

(SB19) David and his friends camped out in the dry, lonely wilderness, so Absalom's men wouldn't find him. David did go back to be king in Jerusalem again, but only after (SB20) Absalom had been killed. How sad David was! How David loved Absalom and missed him, even though he had treated David so terribly!

Story with lines separating paragraphs (text in bold, optional interaction cues in italics)

So, yes, David WAS a man who did many good, even great things. But David was also a man who suffered some very sad things, and even did some very bad things.

But there is something else you need to know about David. Something that was more important than all these other things. It was the WHY behind all those great, good things that David did. And, it was HOW David made it through all those bad and sad things.

The WHY and HOW behind them all was Someone who loved David. WHO do you think it was?

Can you guess?

It was the LORD! The LORD loved David so much! And it was His great love for David that (SB21) gave David the courage to fight off lions and bears. It was God's great love for David that gave him the courage to face the fierce giant, Goliath. And, it was God's great love that helped David to care for the people of Israel as their king, and made David want to sing all those beautiful songs about God. Yes, the LORD's great love for David was behind all the great and good things that David did.

But, what happened to God's great love for David when David did those bad things and went through all those sad things? Did it go away? No, it did not. God's love for David never stopped. He kept on loving David and kept on helping him, even then.

In His great love for David, (SB22) the LORD sent the prophet Nathan to help David see his sins, turn away from them, and ask for forgiveness. Do you think the LORD forgave David?

What do you think?

Yes, He did!

And, it was God's great love that (SB23) comforted David when King Saul tried to kill him. God provided David with everything he needed, all those years when he had to hide from Saul and his soldiers. And, it was (SB24) God's love for David that later protected him from Absalom and the others who wanted to kill him.

Yes, God's love for David was WHY David did ALL the great, good things he did. And, it was HOW David made it through ALL the bad and sad things.

But God's great love for David did something else, too. His love filled David's heart with great love for... Can you guess who?

Can you guess?

For God! No wonder (SB25) he sang to the LORD so many songs!

When LORD protected David from Saul and his soldiers, (SB26) David sang: "I love you, O LORD. You are my strength. You will deliver me and save me from my enemies. I praise Your name!" (from Psalm 18:1-3)

And, when the LORD used Nathan to show David his sin, (SB27) David sang: "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love, take away my sins... Deliver me, my God, my Savior, and I will sing aloud of your perfect goodness. I will praise you!" (from Psalm 51:1-2,14)

And even when Absalom tried to kill him, David sang to God, out in the wilderness: (SB28) "O LORD, how many are my enemies! Many are saying You will not save me. But you, O LORD, are a shield about me. You hear my prayers and You will take care of me. I will not be afraid of many thousands of people who have set themselves against me all around me. You will rescue me from my enemies. You will save me!" (from Psalm 3)

Yes, the LORD filled David's heart with songs of love for Him.

So, every day of David's life—in the great and good times, and even the bad and sad times—David praised the LORD for His great love for him. It was a love that never stopped.

But most of all, David looked forward to the day when God's greatest promise to him and all of God's people will come true. David sang about it, too. Do you know what that greatest promise is?

Do you know what it is?

God's greatest promise (SB29) is to bring His people home to live with Him forever. Then, at last, they will enjoy God's love for them in the closest, most wonderful ways. That's why David sang: "Surely the LORD will show me goodness and mercy all the days of my life, and I will go to live with Him forever." (from Psalm 23:6)

For David knew the same thing that we are learning today: God's love for His people is more than they could ever deserve. It goes on and on. God will never stop loving His people. This was the most wonderful thing that David could think of. And, it's what he, along with all of God's people who have already died, is enjoying right now, and will keep on enjoying forever.

We can enjoy God's amazing, unending love, too, if we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior. This is how we become God's people. Ask Him to help you!





We're missing one word. Here's the hint to what the missing word is. It says: "What is the opposite of "go"? It starts with the letter "S" and it rhymes with "hop."

(uncover answer from bottom of sign, show it to them and say:)


"What Is God's Love for His People Like? It's More than They Could Ever Deserve... God Will Never STOP Loving His People!

What does that mean?

To be betrothed to someone is to make a special promise to love them always. Men and women in Bible times used to make special betrothal promises to each other before they got married.

In the Bible, God tells us that He betroths Himself to His people. That means He promises to always love them. He will always be faithful to them. He will always love and care for them. He will always be righteous and just in how He treats them--that means He will always love His people by doing the right thing. He will never do anything evil or treat them badly. He will always show them mercy and treat them with tenderness and kindness.

The Bible also tells us that at the end of time, all of God's people will live with God forever. Jesus will be like the bridegroom who greets his bride on his wedding day with great joy and begins his life with the one he loves. There will never be anything better than this life with God!

Other Visual Aids

Big Question Box/Briefcase

What You Want

The Big Question Briefcase is a briefcase or other container with these characteristics:

- Ideally, this should be around 17" x 12", but needs to be at least big enough to fit a 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper inside it.
- Have various pockets to put these sheets in
- Is attractive or curious looking to preschoolers
- Not necessary, but extremely fun, if is has a combination lock

Finding a Briefcase:

You can certainly buy one new, but you always may find a used one at a thrift shop. Or, someone may have one they want to donate. We use one that stores valuables in it and is the 17" x12" size. Very durable and has the lock feature that the kids love.

You also can move away from the briefcase idea and use a little trunk or other box for your substitute briefcase. Just change the name to the Big Question Box, if you use a box instead. A boot box or the cardboard box that 10 reams of copy paper comes in is a great size, if you are using a box.

If you use a box, but want a lock-like feature, that's easy to do. Simply cut "straps" out of felt or vinyl and glue in place to the top and bottom sides of the box on one side, with the top strap overlapping the bottom straps. Add velcro to the top and bottom pieces so that they meet and fasten. Make back "hinges" for the box with the felt/ vinyl straps, too. Or, you can simply add a belt around the box that has to be unfastened before the box can be opened.

Here are some suggestions for decorating a box or even the outside of your briefcase to make it appealing.

Supplies

Your box/briefcase
Plain white contact paper or white cardstock
Colorful wrapping paper
Glitter glue
Markers
Sequins, fake jewels, buttons, rick rack, etc.
Other decorating supplies
Stickers
Glue
Clear packing tape

Directions

- 1. If you are using a box that has wording on it, you will first need to make plain surfaces for decorating and a hinge for the lid. Stick the white contact paper or white cardstock to each side of the box. On the other hand, you can also use colorful wrapping paper. Then, make a lid by sticking the clear packing tape along one long side of the box, attaching the lid to the box.
- 2. Use the craft decorating supplies to decorate the box. If desired, you can put a big question mark on top of the box, but remember that you are working with two and three year olds: the question mark symbol is not very meaningful to them yet.

Making a Flannelgraph Storyboard

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

While you may decide to use sticky tac and stick your storyboard pictures to a white board, it is very easy to make a flannelgraph board. The advantage to the flannelgraph board is that the pictures stick very easily and there is no messing with the sticky-tac.

Supplies

Large Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $36'' \times 48''$ foamboard or corkboard (We actually use a far bigger canvas and attach it to the wall) A science project board with the two sides that fold out makes a good $36'' \times 48''$ board. Small Format Pictures Board: AT LEAST a $24'' \times 36''$ (to $36'' \times 48)''$ board

Large piece of neutral-colored felt to cover your board with extra to overlap over to the back, if desired. Glue gun and glue sticks

Directions

1. Center felt on front side of board. Turn over. Secure in place with glue.

Making Durable Storyboard Pictures

for use in story-telling and in playing the story review games

Whether you purchase the Deep Down Detectives storyboard pictures from Amazon or print them off the website (included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book), you will want to find some way to make them more durable. They are used not only as a part of telling the story, but are integral in the story review games. Here's how we make ours durable enough to be used over and over again. **See note below for other simpler options for using these pictures.**

Supplies

Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book (purchased or downloaded)

White cardstock or printer paper (if downloading pictures)

Sticky-back velcro, circles or cut pieces; or sticky tac putty

Laminator or Self-laminating sheets

Sturdy Sheet Protectors, preferably the "Secure Top" kind, like offered by Avery

Flannelgraph pictures for the Bible stories found at www.praisefactory.org with each unit's resources.

Directions

- 1. Purchase from Amazon or download and print out the storyboard figures.
- 2. Cut out flannelgraph figures.
- 3. Laminate the figures.

Special tip: When laminating the big background pictures that are two (and sometimes even three or four) pieces put together, leave a small gap between the two pieces before laminating together. This small space acts like a hinge and allows you to fold up pictures without hurting them into a manilla envelope that fits 8.5" x 11" sheets of paper along with all of the smaller, regular-sized storyboard pictures.

4. If using a flannelgraph board: Stick a piece of sticky backed velcro (ROUGH SIDE) onto the back of each figure. If using sticky tack and whiteboard: simply stick a small amount of sticky tack on the back of a picture when using it. Remove and store sticky tack in airtight container.

Note: Instead of using all of the pictures as separate flannelgraph pieces, you can choose to use only a few (helpful to have 10 for the story review game); you can clump them onto posterboard and make them into picture scenes; or, you can simply use the Storyboard Picture Guide as a single picture. At praisefactory.org, go to DDD Bits and Pieces for a 22" x 28" poster size jpg of this picture guide if you want to create a large version.

The Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder

This is a homemade folder that looks (kinda) like the cover of a Bible. You will use this to put the Bible verse, the Bible Story and storyboard pictures to help make the point that the truths you are teaching them come from the Bible.

Supplies

1 piece of 22" x 28" posterboard (white is fine. Green or brown is nice)

Glue

Stapler and staples or packing tape

The Bible Cover pictures (see online with resources for this unit or from the back of each Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids book.)

NOTE: The Bible Cover pictures included in the Deep Down Detectives Visual Aids books cannot be created larger than 8.5" x 11". That means that they will be under-sized for a Bible Folder of the dimensions you are making. However, you can go online to the Deep Down Detectives curriculum and there is a pdf of a bigger version of these covers that will actually fit the size of this Deep Down Detectives "Bible" Folder.

Directions

- 1. Lay out poster board with long side along the bottom.
- 2. Fold in 2" on each side.
- 3. Take packing tape and tape the folded in 2" flaps to the main section of the posterboard, all the way down.
- 3. Fold up 8 1/2" on the bottom of the poster board.
- 4. Use packing tape to tape this flap in place, all the way down.
- 5. Take scissors and snip through the tape where the flap is attached to the folder. This will give you a bit more room in the folder.
- 6. Fold the poster board in the middle to make the center fold.
- 7. Cut out the Bible Cover Pictures. If possible, laminate these. They will last longer.
- 8.. Glue the two cover pieces to the outside of the folder.
