Hold up the Big Question sign for all the children to see, and say:

The Big Question we are investigating today is Big Question Number 5:

Can You Tell Me What God Made? and the Answer is: God Made All Things Good!

Meaning:

Did you ever wonder where everything in this world came from? All of the plants, animals and insects...the fish and birds...the sun, moon, stars and planets...the tall mountains and the beautiful oceans...the people here around us and the angels up in heaven? Did they just get here on their own? No, they did not! God made them. And when God made them, He made them good—perfect and without sin. He made them just right for His good plan for the world.

What was God's good plan for the world? He planned for everything He made to show us what He's like, so we could know how wonderful He is.





2. All around was darkness, then God said, "Come, light!" And POP! Out came shiny, bright light. "This is good," God said. "It's just what I had planned."


