


The Deep Down Detectives found the clue, and read: "What Did Jesus Come to Do? Jesus Came to Bring Us to God... He Died on the Cross for the ???? of God's People. Hosea 13:14." Hint: The Bible word for bad things we do that break God's good laws. Starts with an "S" and rhymes with "hens."



The kids knew what to do next! They opened their Bible to Hosea 13:14, and read: "I will redeem them from death."



Just then, Detective Dan walked in. "Kids! Have you figured out this fourth truth about what Jesus came to do?" he asked. "We think so! Redeem means rescuing someone who has disobeyed God by paying for their sins. Jesus did this for God's people when He died on the cross."



"Our Big Question is: What Did Jesus Come to Do? And the answer is: Jesus Came to Bring Us to God... He Died on the Cross for the <u>SINS</u> of God's People. "Great job, kids! You did it!"



"We have all disobeyed God and deserve His punishment. But from before the beginning, God planned to send His Son, Jesus, to live a perfect life and give it as full payment for God's people's sins. That's what Jesus did as He died on the cross. He made the way for them to be forgiven, so they could be God's people forever. On Day Three, Jesus rose from the dead, proving He'd done it. We can become God's people, if we turn from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior."

Something to Grow Into




I. The Roman king did NOT put up with lawbreakers! He punished them in different ways. He wanted to make sure everyone obeyed his laws.



2. But the Roman king had ONE punishment he saved for only the very worst kinds of lawbreakers: death on a cross. It was a terrible way to die. So terrible, that to even say the word "cross" was a bad word that good people didn't say.



3. Who died on crosses? Traitors did --men who tried to get rid of the king. Murderers did --men who killed other people. And robbers did --men who took other people's things. These worst kinds of lawbreakers were given this worst kind of punishment.



4. One Friday, long ago, the king sent three men to die on crosses at Golgotha, the cross hill outside of Jerusalem. Two of the men were robbers, but the third one was a man no one expected to see there. It was Jesus!



5. Now, everyone could understand why the two robbers had been put on their crosses. These men had snatched other people's things, and now they were being punished for the bad things they had done. That was the Roman king's law.



6. But Jesus had lived a perfect life. He had never disobeyed God. He had never done anything wrong. He didn't do anything to deserve to die on a cross. Why was HE on that cross? Was it just a big mistake?




7. No, it wasn't. The Roman king was wrong to put Jesus to death, but God had all along made Jesus' death on the cross part of His good plan. This is how He would save His people. Jesus would give His perfect life to take all of God's punishment for their sins.



8. From God? Why would God need to punish His people? Because they were sinners, and God hates sin. Like everyone else in the world, they deserved His punishment, not His love.



9. But God loves His people better than they deserve. Jesus took the punishment for the sins of God's people upon Himself, so they wouldn't have to. He made the way for them to be loved by God forever, instead of punished!




10. And how do we KNOW that Jesus took all of the punishment for God's people that day? Because on Day Three, Jesus rose up from the dead, showing that He had really done it! He had beaten sin and death for God's people.



II. Now, God's people were forgiven forever! They would get to know and love Him in their hearts their whole lives. And one day, when they die, they would get to go live with God forever!



12. "Thank You, Jesus, for taking all of God's punishment for God's people. Thank You that You offer us to become God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in You as our Savior. Help us do this, even today."






Classroom Rules Song
