"Hi! Welcome to Deep Down Detectives! We're so glad you've joined us. Detective Dan is going to help us dig deep down into God's Word, the Bible. Come on. Let's go!"



"Wow, look at this! It's Detective Dan's briefcase with a new case for us. His Big Question is 'What Is the Gospel?' Come on, everybody. Let's unlock it and see what clue he gives us."



"Deep Down Detectives! This is your second of four missions in this Big Question. Look for your clue in my bowtie. See if you can find the answer in God's Word. See you soon, Detective Dan!"



The Deep Down Detectives found the clue and read: "What Is the Gospel? It's Salvation through Faith in Jesus... We Have All Disobeyed God and Deserve His <u>????</u>. Ecclesiastes 7:20." Hint: "What we deserve when we do something wrong on purpose. A sad word that starts with 'P'."



The kids knew what to do next! They opened their Bible to Ecclesiastes 7:20, and read: "There is not a righteous man on earth who does good and never sins."



Just then, Detective Dan walked in. "Kids! Have you figured out this second truth about the gospel?" he asked. "We think so! 'Righteous' is a Bible word for someone who pleases God by only doing good. Our verse tells us that we all disobey God, and that means we all deserve His punishment."



"Our Big Question is: What Is the Gospel? And the answer is: It's Salvation through Faith in Jesus... We Have All Disobeyed God and Deserve His <u>PUNISHMENT</u>." "Great job, kids! You did it!"



We have all chosen to disobey God, our good Creator. This is called 'sin'. God is good. He hates sin, and will punish it. God's punishment for sin is living apart from Him and everything good forever. But God is so merciful. He sent His Son, Jesus, to live a perfect life and give it up as the full payment for the sins of God's people. Then, He rose from the dead in victory. We can be God's people, too, when we turn away from our sins and trust in Jesus as our Savior.



"Tell us a Bible story, Detective Dan. We want to dig deeper into God's Word." "Sure, kids! I know just the story. It's called 'The Case of the Squabbling Brothers and Sisters.' Listen for what Paul told the believers in Rome to help them stop fighting with one another."

Something to Grow Into



I. Squibble, squabble, squibble squabble. The believers in the big city of Rome were fighting with each other. They were all part of God's family. And they should have been loving each other like sisters and brothers; but, they weren't! They were fighting with each other, instead.



2. They weren't fighting each other with fists, like you might be thinking. This was a fight with words. They were fighting over families --whether you came from a family of Jews or a family of Gentiles. Jew and Gentile. Have you ever heard of those Bible family names? Let's find out what they are.



3. Some of the believers grew up as Jews. They came from families who worshipped the LORD. They grew up learning the Bible and trying to obey its laws... ALL of them... and there were A LOT! (Laws is another word for rules.)



4. There were the Ten, Big Laws God gave them, the 10 Commandments. They were the LOVE laws. These laws told how to love God and love one another. That was the FIRST kind of laws that God gave the Jews to obey, and these are the way God wants us all to live.



5. But the Jews had more laws. These laws were the LIVE TOGETHER laws. These told the Jews how to live their everyday lives--what clothes they should wear; what food they should eat; and, other things like that. And some of these were just extra rules, not even in the Bible.



6. After the Jews believed in Jesus as their Savior, they knew they should live by the LOVE laws, but they also thought even Christians should keep all those other laws, too. And that's where all the squibbling and squabbling came in with that other kind of family-the Gentiles.



7. You see, the other believers grew up Gentiles, from families who worshipped fake gods.



8. They DIDN'T grow up with the Jews' laws. But when they became Christians, they knew they should obey God's LOVE Laws-all people should live by them.



9. But they refused to keep the Jews' LIVE TOGETHER laws. They were Christians, not Jews!



10. "We're right. You're wrong. Live our way. We're better than you. No, you aren't," the Gentile and Jew believers fought back and forth.



II. Faraway in Corinth, Paul heard about their squabbles and wrote them a letter, "Dear believers in Rome, no one's better. You ALL have sinned against God and deserve His punishment. Only through faith in Jesus are you saved," he reminded them.



12. "You are ALL part of God's family. The Holy Spirit lives in ALL of you. Stop your squibblesquabbling! Love each other like sisters and brothers should. Loving each other fulfills God's law. He gives us everything we need to do this through Jesus, our Savior," signed Paul.

13. Phoebe took Paul's letter to the believers in Rome. What happened when the believers read Paul's letter? The Bible doesn't tell us. I hope it helped them remember that they ALL needed Jesus to be their Savior! And, to love God and love one another through Him.

I. What two kinds of families did the believers in Rome come from? From Jew and Gentile families.

That none of them had been righteous. None of them had pleased God by their own, good works. They were saved only through the Savior, Jesus. That's what mattered. Not the Live-Together Laws.

For You and Me:

None of us can ever be good enough to please God. None of us would ever be able to know God or be His people on our own. But the good news is that Jesus did live a perfect life. He offered up His righteous to pay for the sins of God's people, all who turn away from their sins and trust in Jesus as their Savior. God loves to help us do this. Ask Him!

What Is the Gospel? It Is Salvation through Faith in Jesus Christ... we have all disobeyed God and deserve His punishment!

Did you know that Paul's letter to those believers in Rome became part of God's Word, the Bible? Many people have read his letter to those people in Rome and learned from it. Why, even you are learning from it today!

One of the most important things we can learn from Paul's letter is that we are lawbreakers who have chosen to disobey God. We all deserve God's punishment. But God is so merciful that He sent a Savior --His Son, Jesus! Jesus suffered and died on the cross, offering up His perfect life to God as full payment for the sins of God's people. He rose from the dead in victory on the third day.
