Detective Dan's (Shorter/Simpler) Version of Bible Story for Big Question 15, Bible Truth 3

The Case of the Copycats John 13-15, 18-20; Acts

- 1. Jesus gathered his disciples for their last meal together. Soon, enemies would take Jesus away to die on the cross. With only a little time left, what did Jesus want His disciples to remember? How would He tell them? Jesus would use FEET and FOOD, there at the table, to teach them.
- 2. Jesus got up and began to wash His disciples' feet. They were horrified! Jesus was God's Son. He shouldn't use His holy, perfect life to clean their dirty, yucky feet! But Jesus just kept washing. This was a picture of what He would do on the cross to take away the sin from their hearts.
- 3. Then, Jesus took the Passover bread and wine and used them as two more pictures of what He was about to do on the cross. "This is My body, broken for you. This is My blood, poured out for you," He said, as He gave the bread and the wine to them.
