The Case of the Amazing Answer Acts 12:1-18

- 1. Life was exciting for Christians in the big city of Jerusalem. They shared the good news of Jesus with all who would listen. THOUSANDS of people not only listened but believed! These new believers joined the other Christians as they gathered together as a church. This was so happy!
