I'm all for kids understanding the call and pray that they will. But, not to muddy the waters with kids' desiring to please parents and giving a verbal response that is not really coming from a heart change. So.... Be careful with how you use this last sentence.

Many of these now available in a wonderful, new Spanish translation. Many are also available as board books, but sometimes lose key concepts in the process.

# **<u>DEVOTIONS</u>**: (Personal/Family)

Often presume conversion Add gospel/change language. Devotional books are some of the most "presumptive" of conversion in their language. Perhaps, this is because they are speaking to a whole family, some of whom we do presume to be Christians. Be careful, especially looking at the prayers and the life applications. Modify wording as needed and add in questions about how these promises can be for us, by becoming God's people (turning away from our sins and trusting in Jesus as our Savior).

Sometimes wording like this can lead to what seems like conversion, when it really is just giving the right answer. Be careful with questions like this. Yes, our hearts beat for our kids to become Christians.... But not create false conversion by leading questions.

  the child she is speaking to in her book. Make sure to add the gospel.

This does presume conversion in a few places. There is some very helpful language for teens to read themselves, or for parents to read and use with their kids.

Rewriting Gender? You, Your Family, Transgenderism, and the Gospel David Martin A few of the prayers presume conversion but this is one of the best books I've found for giving language to talk to kids about this issue. Especially younger kids have a tendency to "parrot" what we say and that can lead to some unintentional confusion and pain as they talk with other kids in a way that lacks the nuance needed in helping those with gender struggles, the children of parents of the same sex, etc. This book focuses on building compassion in our children, while speaking of the brokenness of sin. It may not be all the conversation that needs to take place, but it is a good, relation-building start

that may lead to closer friendships and more opportunity with this growing, needy population in our culture.

These are classic New Growth Press publications, in the CCEF Scripture to comfort and counsel kids category. They do a good job describing common, difficult struggles of kids and apply Scripture to them. However, like the other CCEF books for kids, they tend to presume the child is converted by their choice of Scriptures (which are for believers). I've been told that the questions in the back have been a great springboard for conversations with kids. Use with care and add in the gospel.
